### PAC Offensive Player of the Week

TOM NAUGHTON Waynesburg College Senior Quarterback - 6-2, 220 Pittsburgh, Pa./Baldwin H.S.

Naughton led the Yellow Jacket offense to a 47-42 victory over visiting Denison University in the opening week, completing 13 of 23 passes for 161 yards and six touchdowns, including three scoring passes to **Don Frazier**. Waynesburg posted the win in **Jeff Hand**'s debut as head coach.

Other nominees included junior fullback **Will Anderson** of Bethany, and junior wide receiver **Todd Fry** of Washington & Jefferson.

### PAC Defensive Player of the Week

### DUANE CYMMERMAN Bethany College

Senior Defensive Tackle - 6-2, 290 Jeannette, Pa./Jeannette H.S.

Cymmerman recorded 10 tackles, including six solo stops, to help lead Bethany to a 17-0 road shutout of Shenandoah (the first seasonopening shutout for the Bison since 1980). One his 10 stops, four were for losses of 16 yards, with one QB sack for -10 yards.

Other nominees included senior linebacker Adam Corbett of Grove City, senior linebacker Matt Dietz of Washington & Jefferson, and senior defensive end Sean Dowdie of Waynesburg.

#### **Bethany Bison**

Bethany used an opportunistic defense to defeat Shenendoah 17-0 and record its first shutout in a season opener since a 13-0 blanking of Grove City in 1980 ... The Bison intercepted a pass at their two, recovered a fumble at their 18 and blocked a field goal ... Senior defensive tackle Duane Cymmerman had 10 tackles, including four for loss, while sophomore cornerback Ryan Nohe also made 10 stops, while breaking up two passes ... Offensively, junior fullback Will Anderson rushed for 89 yards with a 15-yard TD ... While the win was Bethany's second consecutive in a season-opener, it was only the team's third triumph in a lid-lifter in the past 18 years.

#### Wash. & Jeff. Presidents

W&J opened its 2001 schedule with a 16-7 victory at Ursinus in Collegeville, Pa. ... The Presidents' stingy defense held Ursinus to just 232 total yards and 11 first downs ... Sophomore defensive end Mike Williams iced the game in the fourth quarter with a sack of Ursinus quarterback Chris Rahill in the endzone for a safety ... Junior guarterback Brian Dawson completed 20-of-38 passes for 316 yards and one touchdown ... Junior punter Jordan Genis helped the Presidents claim the field position battle all day by averaging 40.3 yards per kick on six punts, including three that were downed inside the 20-yard line ... Junior running back Joey Nichols scored the other W&J touchdown on the day.

### PAC FOOTBALL NOTES

#### Grove City Wolverines

Grove City dropped its fourth consecutive season opener following a 23-14 defeat to visiting Dickinson College on Saturday ... Three Wolverine miscues on special teams led to 16 Dickinson points ... Senior SE **Dan Stoffer** hauled in three passes for 30 yards ... Senior QB **Mike Kashurba** connected on 6 of 8 passes for 48 yards in his debut ... Despite losing their last four season openers, the Wolverines have avoided a losing season each year, going 5-5 in 1998 and 6-4 each of the past two seasons.

#### Waynesburg Yellow Jackets

Jeff Hand won his first game as head coach of Waynesburg College this weekend, leading the Yellow Jackets to a 47-42 home win over Denison University ... Senior quarterback **Tom Naughton** led the way offensively in the win, completing 13-of-23 passes for 161 yardsa and six touchdowns ... On defense, Senior defensive end **Sean Dowdie** led the attack with four tackles, three quarterback sacks (for -9 yards) and one forced fumble.

#### **Thiel Tomcats**

The Tomcats were defeated by Capital 34-13 this week, spoiling the debut game at Thiel's new on-campus home, Alumni Field, as well as the debut of new Tomcat head coach **Jack Leipheimer** ... Senior QB **T.J. Wiley** was 13 of 23 passing for 219 yards and one touchdown in the loss to the Crusaders, with **Donte Harris** catching six balls for 127 yards and a score ... **Rennie Gash** and **Kennard Davis** each made interceptions for the Tomcat defense.

#### Westminster Titans

Westminster is the lone PAC football squad to open the season on September 8 ... Now entering tis 107th season of football, the Titans are 54-49-3 all-time in season-opening games dating back to 1891 ... Since the Harold Burry era began at Westminster in 1952, the Titans are 35-14 in season openers ... Sophomore Matt Robison, a hometown product from Wilmington H.S., is expected to get the start at guarterback for Westminster, replacing graduated threeyear starter James Graham ... WC is ranked in a pair of preseason Division III Top 25 polls despite being ineligible for D-III playoffs: #18 by Don Hansen's National Weekly Football Gazette and #25 by Lindy's College Football Annual.

**Game Notes:** The Titans and Cavaliers meet in a rematch of last year's season opener, won by Westminster 27-14 in New Wilmington ... The Titans held Walsh to -4 yards rushing on 23 carries in last year's game ... Walsh, an NAIA member, posted a 41-7 win at Olivet Nazarene (III.) in week one ... Westminster won the only meeting between the two schools at Fawcett Stadium, 17-14, in 1997.

In last year's win, Bethany scored 17 second half points to break open a 0-0 halftime tie ... Apprentice comes into the game after a 34-27 victory at Greensboro (N.C.) College ... Quarterback **Terrence Patrick** threw for 310 yards and three scores and rushed for another TD in the win ... Bison junior QB **Jeremy Lacaria** completed 11 of 17 aerials for 107 yards vs. Shenandoah last week.
