PAC Offensive Player of the Week

MIKE ORLANDO
Grove City College
Senior Fullback - 5-9, 220
Wickliffe, Ohio/Wickliffe H.S.

Orlando rushed for a career-high 192 yards on 22 carries and scored three touchdowns (63, 35, 1) in the Wolverines' 41-6 road win at Kenyon. His 63- and 35-yard scoring runs put Grove City on top 14-0 early.

Other nominees included junior fullback **Will Anderson** of Bethany, senior quarterback **T.J. Wiley** of Thiel, junior wide receiver **Todd Fry** of Washington & Jefferson, and sophomore running back **Rocky Doman** of Waynesburg.

PAC Defensive Player of the Week

Williams recorded 10 tackles, including four for losses, and one QB sack as the Presidents' topped Allegheny 28-14. He helped W&J hold Gator All-American back **Shane Ream** to his lowest rushing output since Sept. of 2000.

Other nominees included senior cornerback **Marty Bavetz** of Bethany, senior linebacker **Jonathan Forbes** of Grove City, freshman linebacker **Robert Drake** of Thiel, and sophomore safety **Bryce Cree** of Waynesburg.

PAC FOOTBALL NOTES

Bethany Bison

Bethany scored early against Newport News, as backup quarterback **Billy Hunter** threw a 58-yard scoring pass on a halfback option to **Justin Yanssens** on the second play of the game ... Fullback **Will Anderson** had his second straight solid game, rushing for 93 yards and a two-yard scoring plunge in the third quarter ... Defensively, the Bison cornerbacks had outstanding games: **Marty Bavetz** had 12 tackles, two INT's and broke up three passes, while **Ryan Nohe** made 11 stops ... Defensive end **Mike Mills** recorded three sacks for -21 yards ... QB **Jeremy Lacaria** continued his steady play. In two games, he has thrown for 225 yards, two TD's and no interceptions.

Wash. & Jeff. Presidents

W&J QB **Brian Dawson** passed for 310 yards and four touchdowns in a 28-14 win over Allegheny ... Junior **Todd Fry** caught 4 passes for 174 yards and two touchdowns ... Senior **Dave Armitage** had three receptions for 54 yards and two scores ... The W&J defense held AC All-America candidate **Shane Ream** to 133 yards on 25 carries, his lowest total since last Sept. ... Junior **B.J. Swartzlander** led the W&J defense with 12 tackles ... The Presidents' defense is allowing just 113.0 yards passing and 308.5 total yards per game ... W&J has converted on 2-of-3 fourth down conversions this season ... Fry is averaging 156.0 receiving yards and 164.0 all-purpose yards per game.

Grove City Wolverines

Senior FB **Mike Orlando** rushed for a career-high 192 yards on 22 carries and scored three touchdowns (63, 35, 1) as Grove City topped Kenyon 41-6 ... The Wolverines posted 27 unanswered points in the third and fourth quarters after leading 14-6 at half ... Grove City rushed for 367 yards, more than double its total offensive yards gained in week one against Dickinson (183) ... The Wolverines outgained the Lords in total offense, 402-217 ... Kenyon was held to 29 yards rushing on 24 attempts ... Wolverine head coach **Chris Smith** set the school record for football coaching victories (70) with the Kenyon win.

Waynesburg Yellow Jackets

Sophomore running back **Rocky Doman** rushed for 108 yards on 23 carries for his second straight 100-yard game for Waynesburg, in the Yellow Jackets' 41-35 double-overtime loss to Ursinus ... Doman was rivaled by Ursinus running back **Shearrod Duncan**, who rushed for 170 yards and scored five touchdowns, including the game-winner in double overtime ... Waynesburg quarterback **Tom Naughton** continued to lead the Jacket offense with 263 yards on 17 completions, connecting with wide receiver **Nick Breault** six times for 122 yards and hitting freshman wide receiver **Kenyon McAfee** for a 28 yard touchdown reception.

Thiel Tomcats

Thiel and Kean were deadlocked into the fourth quarter, until Kean's **Eric Santo** hit a 35-yard FG to give the Cougars a 3-0 season-opening win, while Thiel dropped to 0-2 ... This was Kean's first victory on the road since a 21-19 win at William Patterson University in October 1997 ... The Tomcats held the advantage in total net yards over Kean 209-149 ... Tomcat senior quarterback **T.J. Wiley** was 9-for-14 passing for 80 yards, while adding 55 yards rushing on 11 carries ... Freshman inside linebacker **Robert Drake** recorded seven tackles, two forced fumbles and an interception to lead the Thiel defense.

Westminster Titans

Westminster opened the season by falling at Walsh 17-10 ... The Titans led 10-3 after three periods, but the Cavaliers scored on a 42-yard TD pass with 5:51 to play to tie the game, then returned a Titan fumble 32 yards for the game-winning score with 3:37 to go ... Senior DE **Chris Roscoe** scored the lone Titan touchdown, returning a third quarter Walsh fumble 11 yards for a score ... Titan sophomore QB **Matt Robison** was 16-of-32 for 180 yards in his first collegiate start ... Freshman WR **Matt Steve** caught six balls for 71 yards ... Senior WR **Brian Lipiello** had three catches for 68 yards (including a 51-yarder) in the first quarter before being forced from the game with a shoulder injury.

Carnegie Mellon (2-0) at Bethany (2-0)

Game Notes: Bethany and Carnegie Mellon both enter the game 2-0 for the second consecutive year ... Last year, Bethany rushed for 296 yards and controlled the ball for over 36 minutes in a 27-16 victory in Pittsburgh ... The triumph snapped Bethany's 12-game losing streak to the Tartans ... CMU enters this year's game off a 42-14 win over Case Western Reserve on Saturday ... The Tartans staked out to a 35-0 halftime lead and rolled up 411 yards of offense for the game ... In their first two games this year, CMU has outscored their opponents 82-14.

Doman, who led the PAC last year with a 23.3 yard kickoff return average, is now the Jackets starting tailback and is averaging 115.5 yards per game ... Ohio Wesleyan is coming off a 34-16 win over Olivet, as senior tailback **Matt Capone** scored three touchdowns.
