PAC WOMEN'S TENNIS NOTES

Bethany Bison

Bethany placed second at PAC Championships for the fifth consecutive year ... The Bison had five singles players and three doubles teams make the finals but all came up short against Grove City ... No Bethany player(s) have won a PAC championship since **Barb Rudolph** and **Angela Bohmer** won at #3 doubles in 1997 ... Bethany has never won a PAC team title.

Wash. & Jeff. Presidents

W&J finished its season with a 3rd place finish at the PAC Championships this past weekend ... Head Coach John **DeLaura** was named PAC Coach of the Year after guiding the Presidents into the third-place finish ... W&J was tied with Waynesburg for 3rd place after the first day of competition and W&J edged the Yellow Jackets by taking four of five headto-head matches on Saturday ... The No. 3 doubles team of Terra Naviglia and Katy Petousis was the only team to take a set from Grove City, defeating the team of Barber/Leisure in the first set, 6-1, before falling, 6-4, 6-4, in the final two sets.

Grove City Wolverines

The Lady Wolverines won all six singles finals and each of the three doubles flights to claim their 15th consecutive Presidents' Athletic Conference championship title at Thiel College on Saturday ... They did it the same way they did last year - winning all nine championship matches in straight sets ... Senior Alyssa Bradford became a four-time PAC Player of the Year after winning the first singles championship over **Sonya Gomes** of Bethany 6-0, 6-2 ... Bradford, the only senior on the squad, posted a career first-singles record of 36-3 in dual matches ... This year's title marked the 10th for head coach Cathy Jacobs, who led the Lady Wolverines to a 6-4 record ... Three losses came vs. NCAA D-II schools.

Waynesburg Yellow Jackets

Waynesburg dropped its only match of the week, falling to Westminster 8-1 in the completion of a suspended match from earlier this season ... The Jackets placed fourth at the PAC Championships with 17 points ... Jill Latsha placed second in #3 singles at the PAC Championships.

Thiel Tomcats

Thiel hosted the 2001 PAC Women's Tennis Championships this weekend, with the Lady Cats placing fifth with seven points.

Westminster Titans

The Westminster women's tennis team closed the 2001 season with a 2-1 week, with wins over PAC opponents Thiel (8-1) and Waynesburg (8-1 in the completion of a suspended match) sandwiched around an 8-1 loss to Slippery Rock ... A match scheduled for Sunday against Edinboro was rained out and not rescheduled ... Freshman Amy Caliguiri led the team in singles wins in 2001, posting a 10-2 record at #3-6 singles ... The team's top doubles team was junior Molly Householder and sophomore Carra Dixon, who went 7-2 at #2-3 doubles.
