The Bearcats went 1-3 on the week ... On Tuesday vs. Penn State-Fayette, the Bearcats collected 17 hits ... **Anthony Mattei** went 4-for-5 with five RBIs and four runs scored,

Saturday, Thiel swept the Bearcats ... In the opener, Mark Shouey hit his second homer of the year, while Kenny Primeaux went 4-6 in the doubleheader ... Sunday, SVC lost to cross-town rival Pitt-Greensburg 9-7 ... Shouey and Weimer both went 2-for-5 in the defeat.

The Golden Tornadoes had started the week by dropping a pair of games to Grove City that had stretched Geneva's losing streak to five games ... After dropping game one on Saturday, the Golden Tornadoes responded with an 8-6 victory over the Yellow Jackets ... Justin Montgomery fired three innings of scoreless relief to pick up his first victory of the season ... Tadd Eyster provided the majority of offense with a four-hit game, while Joel Gatti provided the power with a solo homer in the first ... Geneva's baseball team enters the new week with an overall record of 14-14.

Thiel Tomcats



The Tomcats finished the week 5-1 ... Their eight-game win streak was snapped with an 11-8 loss at Hiram on Wednesday ... As a team, the Tomcats

hit .391 with 25 doubles and 13 home runs and averaged 14.0 runs per game last week ... Entering the week, they were ranked second in D-III in team batting average (.380, currently .382), second in doubles per game (3.23, currently 3.39), third in runs per game (11.0, currently 11.5) and fourth in team slugging percentage (.583, currently .598) ... Four players are maintaining an average over .400, with junior RF **David Nypaver** ranking 16th nationally with a .483 average (currently .448).

Waynesburg Yellow Jackets



Waynesburg finished the regular season with a 17-21 overall record and 4-8 mark in league play after being swept in a doubleheader by

Thiel and splitting a twin bill with Geneva last week ... In Game 2 against the Tomcats, sophomore **Ryan Lavrusky** suffered the loss despite allowing just two runs on three hits ... In the win over the Golden Tornadoes, freshman OF **Bill Hanning** belted his first career home run, while sophomore 2B **Wes White, Jr.**, collected three hits to extend his hit streak to 15 games ... In the nightcap, Geneva prevented the sweep by scoring a run in both the seventh and eighth to break a 6-6 tie.

Grove City Wolverines



Grove City is 5-5 in the PAC after dropping both ends of a doubleheader with Westminster Saturday ... In the nightcap, GCC rallied from a 9-0

hole in the first inning, but could not fully complete the comeback and fell 14-13 ... Freshman DH Marcus Magister helped key the Wolverine comeback with a three-run homer, his second of the week ... Magister also hit a game-tying grand slam against Fredonia State Thursday ... Freshman P Steve Stombaugh earned his first collegiate save Thursday in a 14-7 win over Fredonia State by firing 2 1/3 innings ... Stombaugh saved freshman Chip Hasek's first win ... Tuesday, the Wolverines swept Geneva, 3-0 and 12-8 ... Zach Hillegas took a no-hitter into the fifth against Geneva.

Thomas More Saints



Thomas More enters the final week of PAC action with a twogame lead in the PAC standings, and will host Grove City Satur-

day ... The Saints went 3-1 in conference action, including a come-from-behind sweep of Bethany ... Junior Jake Brown led the Saints with a .381 batting average on three doubles, a home run and eight RBIs ... Sophomore Chris Fishburn hit a team-high .387 with three RBI ... Senior Marc Price was a perfect 3-for-3 in stolen bases, while hitting .344 ... Seniors Adam Sargent, Matt Koopman and Pat Berndsen went a combined 4-1 on the mound.

Westminster Titans



Westminster won five out of six games last week, including a split with firstplace Thomas More (4-1, 4-14) at home Tuesday,

a sweep at Grove City (13-7, 14-13) Saturday and a non-conference sweep at Lake Erie (8-5, 8-7) Sunday ... The Titans enter the week two games behind Thomas More for first place ... Senior **Brandon Drespling** batted .346 with a team-high nine hits during the week, while senior **Chris Norris** batted a team-best .667 (8-for-12) as one of three players with eight hits, including senior **Mike Busin** (.381, 8-for-21) and junior **Nick Maiorano** (.320, 8-for-25), who posted a team-high seven RBI for the week ... Maiorano also extended his hit streak to 26 games.
