Also nominated was junior **Mike Kochman** of Bethany, senior **Mike Herringshaw** of Grove City, freshman **Grant Lewis** of Thomas More, senior **Andrew Bales** of Washington & Jefferson, and freshman **Ty Miller** of Westminster.

W&J IN COMMAND: Washington & Jefferson is in the drivers seat in the race for the top seed and hosting rights for the 2010 PAC Baseball Tournament on May 13-15. The #21-ranked Presidents (13-2), ranked #1 in the Mideast region, need just one win or one loss by Thomas More (11-4) to clinch the top spot.

NEWS & NOTES: Three teams - Westminster, Waynesburg, and Bethany - all remain in contention for the fourth and final spot in the PAC Tournament. Of the three, the Titans (6-9 PAC) control their own destiny entering the final weekend, courtesy of holding a tiebreaker advantage over both the Yellow Jackets (6-9) and Bison (5-10).

AROUND THE PAC: Chris Leasure broke the Bethany single season home run record when he launched his 10th homer of the year against Westminster ... Saint Vincent P Paul Kubeja took a perfect game into the bottom of the eighth at Westminster Saturday before suffering a 1-0 hard-luck extra-inning loss.

Senior Joel Dille also came up with an RBI in helping Geneva to a 4-1 win in game one of the twinbill ... Geneva's 14 hit attack in the night cap was paced by three hits from Adam Scheiderer.

Grove City Wolverines (16-16, 9-6 PAC)

Grove City clinched a berth in the PAC Championship Tourna-

ment by rallying past W&J Saturday, 11-8 ... Junior SS Andrew Patterson broke a 6-6 tie with a two-run double in the sixth ... P Mike Herringshaw pitched three innings of relief to earn his ninth win of the season ... That ties Erik Arnesen's single-season win record set in 2006 ... GCC opened the week with a 6-3 victory at Thiel ... Herringshaw worked eight innings for the win and junior Cory Metcalf pitched the ninth for his first collegiate save ... Butch Kriger's run-scoring single in the fourth put the Wolverines ahead to stay ... Grove City will host Bethany this weekend in the final series of PAC play ... C Marcus Magister has 22 career home runs and is one away from tying the career mark of Nate Kauffman, who hit 23 from 1998-2001.

Saint Vincent Bearcats (18-18

Offensively, Zack Galasso went 5-for-8 and belted a pair of homers in the twinbill, his sixth and seventh of the season ... Saturday, SVC lost a pair of heartbreakers at Westminster, falling 9-8 and 1-0 in nine innings.

Senior 2B Chris Fishburn led the team at the plate last week with a .650 batting average (13-for-20) with two home runs, a double, eight RBIs and nine runs scored. ... On the mound, freshman Grant Lewis went 1-0 as he pitched six innings giving up eight runs (one earned) on nine hits and striking out one ... For the season, the Saints are led offensively by junior LF Max Robbins, who is batting .481 (63-for-131) with 17 doubles, 41 RBIs and 38 runs scored ... Sophomore P Paul Uhl leads the Saints' pitching staff as he has a 2.15 ERA with an 8-1 record as he has pitched 58.2 innings giving up 21 runs (14 earned) on 43 hits and striking out 51.

W&J enters the final week of the regular season in the driver's seat for the PAC's top seed ... One more W&J victory or a Thomas More loss will clinch home field advantage for the Presidents in the 2010 PAC Baseball Tournament (May 13-15) ... The Presidents opened the week with a dramatic 8-6 come-from-behind victory at second-place Thomas More ... Junior CF Andy Trettel broke a 6-6 tie in the top of the ninth inning with a two-run homer over the center field fence.

Waynesburg Yellow Jackets (15-19, 6-9 PAC)



Waynesburg went 3-2 this

past week with a sweep of Geneva and a nine-inning triumph over Thomas More to stay in the race for a spot in the PAC playoffs ... The Yellow Jackets were driven by their bats over their five most recent games ... As a team, they hit .395, with five regular starters hitting .462 or higher ...
