2008 PAC BASEBALL CHAMPIONSHIP TOURNAMENT - May 9-11, 2008 Hosted by Thomas More College - Crestview Hills, Ky./Cincinnati, Ohio

Game A - Crestview Hills, KY - May 9, 2008 - 10 a.m. #4 Grove City 7, #1 Thomas More 3

The 2008 PAC Tournament opened with an upset, as the topseeded Saints (11-1 PAC record in the regular season) were upended at home by the fourth-seeded Wolverines (5-7 PAC). Trailing 2-1 after three, GCC plated three runs in the fourth and one in the fifth for a 5-2 advantage. Thomas More narrowed the gap to 5-3 with a run in the sixth, but the Wolverines added two insurance scores in the top of the ninth, including a successful suicide-squeeze bunt for the final tally. Grove City sophomore P Mike Herringshaw (Chardon, OH/Notre Dame Catholic Latin H.S.) earned the complete-game pitching win, allowing three runs on 10 hits with three walks and a strikeout. Offensively, the Wolverines were paced by senior OF Brian Moran (Columbia, MD/Chapelgate Christian H.S.), who was 3-for-4 with a home run, two runs scored and a pair of RBIs. Junior OF Seth Thompson (Canton, OH/Glen Oak H.S.) added three hits as well and scored twice. For TMC, senior P Matt Koopman (Pleasant Hill, OH/Pleasant Hill H.S.) took the loss on the hill, while sophomore C Nick Zeiser (Cincinnati, OH/Elder H.S.) homered in defeat for the Saints.

Game B - Crestview Hills, KY - May 9, 2008 - 1 p.m. #3 Thiel 12, #2 Westminster 10

Trailing 4-3 after six innings, the Tomcats tied the game 4-4 with a run in the seventh, then took control with six in the eight and two more in the ninth for a 12-4 lead. The Titans rallied late, however, as Westminster plated six runners in the bottom of the ninth and brought the potential game-tying run to the plate before Thiel closed out the win. For the Tomcats, junior P Josh Tedesco (Campbell, OH/Ursuline H.S.) earned the victory, allowing five earned runs on eight hits with three strikeouts in eight innings. Junior P Mark Brewer (Beaver Falls, PA/ Blackhawk H.S.) secured the final out for his second save of the season. At the plate, sophomore 1B Justin Scarpitti (Erie, PA/Cathedral Prep H.S.) was 3-for-5 for TC with three extrabase hits (2B, 3B, HR), three runs scored and five RBIs. Sophomore OF Ryan Oldfield (Akron, OH/St. Vincent-St. Mary H.S.) added a three-run homer for the victors. Senior P Jake Zatchok (Berlin Center, OH/Western Reserve H.S.) suffered the pitching loss in relief for the Titans. WC senior 3B Mike Busin (New Castle, PA/Neshannock H.S.) was 2-for-3 with a home run and three runs scored, while junior 1B John Izzo (New Castle, PA/Union H.S.) was 2-for-5 with a homer and three RBIs in defeat.

Game C - Crestview Hills, KY - May 11, 2007 - 4:30 p.m. #1 Thomas More 11, #2 Westminster 3

The top-seeded Saints used a 14-hit offensive attack to eliminate the Titans and advance to the loser's bracket final on Saturday. Thomas More led just 4-3 after four innings, but scored twice for a 6-3 lead after five frames, then put the game away with a five-run seventh. Senior P Pat Berndsen (Cincinnati, OH/Elder H.S.) went the distance on the hill for the win, allowing no earned runs (three unearned) with one walk and five strikeouts. The TMC offense was paced by senior OF Marc Price (Cincinnati, OH/Deer Park H.S.), who went 3-for-6 with two runs and two RBIs, while senior DH Brad Ketterer (Fairfield, OH/Badin H.S.) homered and doubled in the victory. For Westminster, sophomore P Mike McCoy (New Castle, PA/Union H.S.) took the pitching loss, while the WC offense was limited to six singles.

Game D - Cincinnati, OH - May 10, 2008 - 9 a.m. #4 Grove City 4, #3 Thiel 3

The Cinderella Wolverines posted their second upset in as many days to advance to the PAC title game, one step away from he PAC's first-ever automatic bid to the NCAA Division III Tournament. Thiel led 3-1 after three frames, but Grove City posted solo tallies in the sixth and seventh innings to knot the score 3-3. In the bottom of the ninth, junior OF Seth Thompson (Canton, OH/Glen Oak H.S.) singled for GCC, then advanced to third on a Thiel throwing error on a pickoff attempt. After an infield single and intentional walk loaded the bases with one out, senior C Ray Mertz (Glenshaw, PA/Shaler H.S.) singled to left center for the game-winning RBI. Wolverine freshman P Cory Metcalf (Ashland, OH/Ashland H.S.) went the distance on the hill for the win, allowing three runs on seven hits with six strikeouts. Mertz paced the Grove City offense by going 3-for-5 with a pair of RBIs. For Thiel, the loss went to junior RP Mark Brewer (Beaver Falls, PA/Blackhawk H.S.). The Tomcat offense was led by junior C Andrew Howard (Olney, MD/ Sherwood H.S.) and junior DH Chris Dunham (Conneaut Lake, PA/Linesville H.S.), who each went 2-for-4.

Game E - Cincinnati, OH - May 10, 2008 - noon #3 Thiel 10, #1 Thomas More 7

Thiel junior C Andrew Howard (Olney, MD/Sherwood H.S.) belted a three-run walk-off home run in the bottom of the ninth, breaking a 7-7 tie and lifting the Tomcats to the PAC championship game while eliminating the top-seeded Saints from the tournament. Thomas More led the contest 6-3 in the sixth, only to see Thiel take a 7-6 lead with three runs in the seventh and one in the eight. The Saints stayed alive with a two-out RBI single in the ninth to tie the game 7-7, setting up Howard's heroics. Earning the win for TC was sophomore P Dave Diyorio (Youngstown, OH/Austintown Fitch H.S.), who held TMC to one run in 3 1/3 innings of relief. Offensively, junior DH Chris Dunham (Conneaut Lake, PA/Linesville H.S.) paced the victors by going 4-for-5 with a double, a home run and five RBIs. Thomas More senior P Pat Berndsen (Cincinnati, OH/ Elder H.S.) took the loss in relief, while senior OF Michael Browne (Hamilton, OH/Ross H.S.) was 3-for-4 with three RBIs in defeat.

2008 PAC CHAMPIONSHIP GAME

Game F - Cincinnati, OH - May 10, 2008 - 3:50 p.m. #4 Grove City 11, #3 Thiel 10

In a wild, back-and-forth affair which saw five lead changes, 21 runs, 24 hits and nine errors, the fourth-seeded Grove City Wolverines completed their Cinderella run through the PAC Tournament with an 11-10 decision over rival Thiel in the 2008 PAC title game. With the victory, GCC captured its first PAC baseball crown since winning back-to-back league titles in 2001 and 2002, while also securing the PAC's first-ever automatic bid to the NCAA Division III Baseball Tournament. Grove City led 4-0 in the middle of the fourth, only to see Thiel score three in the fourth and four more in the sixth for a 7-4 advantage. The two teams continued to exchange the lead, with the Tomcats taking a 9-8 advantage after eight frames. The Wolverines would not be denied, scoring three times in the top of the ninth for an 11-9 lead, then withstanding a pair of errors in the bottom of the ninth to end the game with th potential game-tying run on third base for the Tomcats. The winning pitcher for Grove City was junior RP Matt Tindall (Copley, OH/Copley H.S.), after pitching the final inning. On offense, senior OF Brian Moran (Columbia, MD/Chapelgate Christian H.S.) was 4-for-5 with a home run an six RBIs for the victors, while freshman DH Butch Kriger (Pittsburgh, PA/Montour H.S.) was also 4-for-5 with a double. The Thiel offense was a balanced attack, as four players posted multi-hit games, led by junior OF David Nypaver (Williamsfield, OH/Howland H.S.), who went 2-for-5 with a home run andfour RBIs in the loss.
