Thiel College Picked to Repeat as PAC Football Champions in 2006

PITTSBURGH, Pa. - The Thiel College football team has been selected to repeat as champions in the Presidents' Athletic Conference (PAC), according to the preseason poll released at the 2006 PAC Football Media Day at PNC Park in Pittsburgh on August 2. Voters in the polls included conference head coaches, sports information directors, and members of the media present at the conference media day.

The defending PAC champion Tomcats of head coach **Jack Leipheimer** earned 21 of 35 first-place votes to lead the preseason poll, followed by Washington & Jefferson, Thomas More,

Waynesburg, Westminster, Grove City and Bethany. Thiel posted a perfect 10-0 regular season record in 2005 and advanced to the second round of the NCAA Division III playoffs. W&J also was picked to compete in the 2005 NCAA Division III playoffs after posting a 9-1 regular season mark, giving the PAC two teams in the NCAA playoffs for the first time in the 50+ year history of the conference.

"We are humbled and honored. This is a testament to our players that have gone through the program and the hard work and dedication of our current players and staff," said Leipheimer, now entering his sixth season as head coach at Thiel.

Series Record: Salisbury leads 1-0

Game Notes: W&J and Salisbury meet for the first time since 1975 Saturday ... Salisbury took the only contest in historu between the two teams by a 24-21 margin in Maryland ... The Sea Gulls, who were a Division II power at the time, connected on a game-winning field goal in the final minute ... The Presidents return 16 starters from last year's 9-2 squad ... Either sophomore **Bobby Swallow** or classmate **Ryan Church** will become just the third starting quarterback at W&J since 1999 ... W&J senior RB **Ryan Mendel** needs 178 yards to pass 2,000 for his career ... Like W&J, the Sea Gulls are looking to replace key skill position players who were lost to graduation (12 total starters lost).

Game Notes: Westminster and Allegheny have played to overtime in their last three meetings, including two decided on field goals ... The Titans won last year, 12-9, thanks to four **Chris Castillo** field goals, including a 43-yarder in the first overtime session ... Westminster is 2-1 in the last three games against Allegheny despite not scoring a touchdown in either of the two wins ... The Titans won 3-0 in overtime in 2003 and lost 21-14 in double overtime in 2004 ... Westminster enters its second year under coach **Jeff Hand**, who is 5-2 in season openers and 4-3 in home openers as a head coach ... Westminster hasn't won the first game of the season since beating Walsh, 27-14, in the 2000 home opener.

Game Notes: This will be the first meeting between the schools in 75 years ... The last time these squads met on the gridiron was in 1931, a 19-0 Muskingum victory ... The Bison had dropped three straight season openers prior to last year, when they opened 2005 with a 34-21 victory over Franklin & Marshall

... Three different BC players threw touchdowns in the contest, including current senior QB **Brent Owens** and junior WR **Milton Joyner**, and the Bison also picked off five passes ... The Muskies are coming off a 2-8 season and return 30 letterwinners, including 14 starters ... The Muskingum defense, which led the Ohio Athletic Conference (OAC) in turnover margin a year ago, is led by senior LB **Jack Junker**, who earned Second Team All-OAC honors after making a team-high 90 tackles.

fense, 1 specialist) from last season, including senior RB **Ryan Abels** ... Abels enters the season just 165 yards shy of eclipsing the career school record of 3,297 rushing yards set by **Mike Stout** ... The Yellow Jacket defense will be led by two-time firstteam all-conference DE **Mike Czerwien**, who has totaled 21 sacks and 34 tackles for loss in two seasons ... Wesley returns 41 lettermen and 11 starters from last season, including firstteam All-American DB **Mario Harris** (113 tackles, 5 forced fumbles) and QB **Chris Warrick** (3,710 passing yards/37 touchdowns) ... The teams last met in 1993 and 1994.

Thomas More is 2-2 versus Hanover at home ... The game will mark the first career starts for six Saints, including sophomore QB **Trevor Stellman** ... Other TMC players earning their first starts are **Lawrence Colbert**, **Austin Vogt**, **Nick Kaliin**, **Kyle Duncan** and **Kevin Nare**.

Game Notes: Thiel opens its 2006 season on the road Saturday against the Geneva Golden Tornadoes ... Geneva is entering its final season in the NAIA Mid-States Football Association (MSFA) before joining the PAC in 2007 ... Thiel is coming off a remarkable 2005 campaign in which it went a perfect 10-0 in the regular season, earned its first-ever NCAA Division III playoff berth and won the PAC championship for the first time since 1972 ... Thiel returns 16 starters from last year's team ... Geneva was 8-4 overall in 2005, earning a berth in the NAIA Playoffs ... The teams last met in 2002, with Geneva winning 41-26.
