Thomas More College Picked to Repeat as 2009 PAC Football Champions

LATROBE, Pa. - Thomas More College was picked to capture the 2009 football championship in the Presidents' Athletic Conference (PAC), according to the preseason poll released at the 2009 PAC Football Media Day at Saint Vincent College in Latrobe today. Voters in the polls included conference head coaches, sports information directors (SIDs), and members of the media present at the conference media day.

The defending PAC champion Saints of third-year head coach Jim Hilvert return 18 starters and 35 lettermen from last year's team which finished 8-3 overall, including a perfect 6-0 mark against conference competition.

Thomas More earned 17 of 28 total first-place votes and 200 points in the conference poll to edge second place Washington & Jefferson (191) by just nine points, followed by Grove City (115), Waynesburg (86), Westminster (82), Bethany (67) and Thiel (43).

"It's a great honor to be picked first, but we still have to go out and prove ourselves," said Hilvert. "The PAC is very strong this year, so we'll have to be ready to play every game."

NCAA Division III provisional members Geneva and Saint Vincent were predicted to post 4-4 and 1-7 records, respectively, in 2009 against PAC teams, according to poll voters. Geneva and Saint Vincent are not eligible for the PAC football title until the schools are granted active membership in Division III by the NCAA at the conclusion of their provisional membership period, tentatively scheduled for 2010 for Saint Vincent and 2011 for Geneva.

PAC FOOTBALL 2009 - Week 1 Conference Notes

SEASON #55: The 2009 season marks the I 55th season of football in the Presidents' Athletic Conference ... Washington & Jefferson College has won a conference-best 22 PAC football titles, including 20 in the past 25 years ... However, four different teams have won the PAC crown in the past six years, including Waynesburg (2003), Thiel (2005) and defending 2008 champion Thomas More ... The conference placed two teams in the NCAA Division III playoffs in 2008, with W&J advancing to the national quarterfinals.

PRESEASON NOTES: Grove City, which opens | AROUND THE LEAGUE: The lone new head against Dickinson Saturday, is the least penalized team in the PAC each of the past four seasons ... Waynesburg will be led by junior QB Brad Dawson on offense and 2009 preseason All-American returner Scott Cree on defense against Wooster ... Washington & Jefferson is looking to extend its streak of 25 consecutive winning seasons, beginning Saturday against Oberlin ... Saint Vincent is 17-17-3 all-time on opening day ... Westminster was 5-0 at home. 0-5 on the road in 2008.

coach in the PAC in 2009 is Thiel first-year mentor Kurt Reiser, who takes over for Jack Leipheimer after serving as a Tomcat assistant for several years ... After starting the 2008 season at 1-5, Geneva managed to pull back to a .500 record with four victories to close the season, including a win against eventual PAC champion Thomas More ... This Saturday's game against Otterbein marks Bethany's first season opener at home since 2005, when the Bison beat Franklin & Marshall 35-21.

Bethany Bison (0-0, 0-0 PAC)

The largest Bison roster in school history will look to carry BC to their first

winning season since 2001 this year ... Eight starters return on offense after the unit set school records for points scored (280) and passing yards (2,548) ... Bethany is strong at the skill positions, with TE Jorge Laboy (First Team All-PAC), WR Matt Cruse (Second Team) and RB Eric Walker (Honorable Mention) back, as well as QB Chad Smith, who threw for 2,302 yards and 16 TDs ... On defense, a pair of All-PAC performers return in LB John Gyure, who switches from DL, and FS Nelson Mitzen, who led the team with 91 tackles and three interceptions last year ... But with an incoming class of more than 100 bodies, expect lots of new faces on the field for BC.

Saint Vincent Bearcats (0-0)



The Bearcats return 78 players, and 21 of 22 regular start-

ers, for the 2009 season, including six players that received PAC Coaches Honors in sophomore LB Anthony Johnson, sophomore CB Roscoe Barber, sophomore RB Jairus Marlow, junior CB Quillian Reid, junior C Kelly Knepshield, and junior DT John Jackson... Marlow led the PAC in yards per carry (7.8) in 2008, while scoring six touchdowns ... He also owned the longest play from scrimmage in the PAC on the year, with a 93-yard touchdown run in week four vs. Waynesburg ... Johnson finished in the top five in the conference with 78 tackles and 11.5 TFLs ... Reid and Knepshield have both started all 20 games over the first two years of their careers ... Saint Vincent's last opening day win came in 1961 vs. Carnegie Tech by a 20-12 score.

Washington & Jefferson Presidents (0-0, 0-0 PAC)



The Presidents open the 2009 season Saturday by hosting Oberlin at 7 p.m. in Cameron

Stadium ... W&J has recorded 25 consecutive winning seasons and current head coach Mike Sirianni has been a part of the last 10, including six as the head coach ... The Presidents defense returns eight starters, including D3football.com All-Region junior S Craig Sedunov and ECAC All-Star senior DE Jacob **Bloomhuff** ... The Presidents' offense returns only three starters and will have its fourth season-opening starting quarterback in Sirianni's 11th year ... One player who will help the new quarterback is senior WR Craig Besong ... Besong, a D3football.com All-South Region choice, compiled one of the top receiving seasons in school history last year with 75 receptions for 1,186 yards and 16 touchdowns.

Geneva Golden Tornadoes (0-0)



The Golden Tornadoes open their 120th season **GOLDEN TORNADOES** Saturday against Frost-

burg State ... It is the first meeting between the two schools since a 22-7 Geneva victory in 1992 ... The GTs hope to build upon the momentum gained by a four-game winning streak to end to 2008 campaign ... After starting the season at 1-5, Geneva managed to pull back to a .500 record with those four victories, including a win against eventual PAC champion Thomas More ... GC returns 18 starters on offensive and defense and will focus on getting off to a better start ... It is the second straight season that Geneva is opening at home ... Last year, the Golden Tornadoes dropped a 27-18 decision to NCAA D-II national qualifier Seton Hill to open the season ... The GTs are just 4-6 in their last ten season openers.

DiDonato and senior DT Tony Clark are the Wolverines' co-captains this year ... Grove City has been the least-penalized team in the PAC each of the last four seasons ... The Wolverines scrimmaged at Denison August 26 ... Grove City is selected third in the conference's annual preseason poll.

This year's team, under the guidance of fifth-year head coach **Rick Shepas**, will be led on offense by junior QB **Brad Dawson** and senior CB **Scott Cree** on defense ... Along with being the team's number one cornerback, Cree electrified fans and opponents last year with five total special teams touchdowns en route to being named both a 2008 postseason All-American, and a first-team 2009 preseason All-American as a returner. Westminster Titans (0-0, 0-0 PAC)



The Westminster foot-

ball enters the 2009 season with a PAC-best seven-game home win streak after the Titans went 5-5 last year, winning all five home games for the first time since 1996 and losing all five road games ... The Titans posted a third-place 3-3 record in the PAC for their highest finish in the league standings since 2003 ... Westminster returns 28 lettermen and 16 starters ... Nine of the returning offensive starters include the school's all-time leading passer in senior QB Kevin Franz with 6,204 yards, a wide receiver that broke the school's single season reception record in senior WR Jon Gubish with 64, and a tight end that will go down as the school's most productive player at his position in second-team all-PAC senior Gary Hutsler. Despite all that, the team MVP last year was senior RB Nick McKolosky.
