Waynesburg Picked to Repeat as PAC Football Champions in 2004 Preseason Poll

The Waynesburg College football team has been selected to repeat as champions in the Presidents' Athletic Conference (PAC), according to the preseason poll released at the 2004 PAC Football Media Day at PNC Park in Pittsburgh on August 10. Voters in the polls included conference head coaches, sports information

The defending PAC champion Yellow Jackets of head coach **Jeff Hand** earned 22 of 36 first-place votes to lead the preseason poll, followed by Washington & Jefferson, Westminster, Grove City, Thiel, and Bethany. Waynesburg captured its first-ever PAC crown with a perfect 5-0 mark in 2003, then advanced to the NCAA Tournament where the Jackets dropped a 28-24 first-round decision to eventual national semifinalist Bridgewater. W&J also reached the playoffs in 2003 after placing second in the PAC, as the Presidents won the ECAC Division III Southwest Bowl with a convincing 41-19 win at Wilkes.

Game Notes: Bethany opens the 2004 season with a new coaching staff, schemes and personnel, led by first-year head coach Steven Lee ... F&M has won three consecutive season-openers, while the Bison have lost their last two ... The last time Bethany won its opener was a 17-0 shutout of Shenendoah in 2001 ... F&M enters the game riding a two game win streak after defeating Ursinus (37-17) and Gettysburg (14-13) to end the 2003 season ... Bethany returns nine starters, including WR Zack Merz, LBs Tim Goetz and Mike Skrinjar, DL Mark Brown and OL Chris Betts ... All five were All-PAC Honorable Mention picks in 2003.

Junior Bradford Clark is penciled in as the Wolverines' starting quarterback although sophomore Scott Fichter is expected to see time under center ... Manchester begins a new era as former Ball State assistant Shannon Griffith makes his debut as the Spartans' head coach ... Manchester is coming off a 2-8 season, including a 1-5 mark in Heartland Collegiate Athletic Conference (HCAC) play.

Game Notes: The Titans open their 111th season of football at Ohio Northern, a member of the Ohio Athletic Conference (OAC) which was 4-6 a year ago ... The two teams have not met since a 7-7 tie in 1975 ... Westminster will debut a new starting QB in sophomore J.R. Barley, a transfer from Division I-AA Liberty ... The Titans are 35-17 in season openers since 1952, but have dropped four of their last five season-opening games, including three straight ... ONU is led by first-year head coach Dean Paul, formerly at Thomas More ... The two teams will open Dial-Roberson Stadium, the Polar Bears' new on-campus home field.

Game Notes: The Tomcats open the 2004 season by hosting the Pioneers from the Wisconsin Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (WAIC) ... Both teams are coming off 3-7 seasons but with high hopes ... The Pioneers played almost everyone evenly the last two years, but dropped 11 games on either the final possession or overtime, while Thiel returns 17 starters and 32 lettermen overall for their 100th season of football ... The Tomcats will be directed by senior QB Darrell Satterfield in his first season as a starter ... Thiel played an exhibition game at the University on Toronto in April.

Since 1989, W&J has opened up its season at home 10 times and has won nine of those contests with the only loss coming at the hands of Emory & Henry, 12-10, in 1998 ... The Presidents opened last year with a 28-23 come-from-behind win over Allegheny under the lights ... TSU was 0-10 as an NAIA Independent last season, but is now a member of the NCAA Division III Michigan Intercollegiate Athletic Association (MIAA) ... Last season's 9-2 overall record marked the 20th consecutive year Washington & Jefferson has finished above .500.
