Washington & Jefferson College Picked to Repeat as 2008 PAC Football Champion

LATROBE, Pa. - Washington & Jefferson College was picked to capture the 2008 football championship in the Presidents' Athletic Conference (PAC), according to the preseason poll released at the 2008 PAC Football Media Day at Saint Vincent College in Latrobe on August 6. Voters in the polls included conference head coaches, sports information directors (SIDs), and members of the media present at the conference media day.

The defending PAC champion Presidents of sixth-year head coach Mike Sirianni return 16 starters and 58 lettermen from last year's team which finished 10-1 overall, including a perfect 6-0 mark against conference competition. W&J, which is ranked second in the nation in NCAA Division III by The Sporting News in their 2008 preseason poll, earned 23 of 28 first-place votes and 192points in the conference poll to edge second place Waynesburg (165), followed by Westminster (100), Grove City (97), Thomas More (87), Bethany (78), and Thiel (65).

"It is nice to be the favorite, but as past preseason polls have shown, it doesn't necessarily mean we'll get the trophy at the end of the year," said Sirianni. "Three different teams have won the PAC over the past five years and that shows how much the conference has improved. Our seniors are hoping to win their third in a row."

NCAA Division III provisional members Geneva and Saint Vincent were predicted to post 5-3 and 1-7 records, respectively, in 2008 against PAC teams, according to poll voters. Geneva and Saint Vincent are not eligible for the PAC football title until the schools are granted active membership in Division III by the NCAA at the conclusion of their provisional membership period, tentatively scheduled for 2010 for Saint Vincent and 2011 for Geneva.

PAC FOOTBALL 2008 - Week 1 Conference Notes

54 AND COUNTING: The 2008 season marks the 54th season of football in the Presidents' Athletic Conference ... Washington & Jefferson College has won a conference-best 22 PAC football titles, including 20 in the past 24 years ... However, three different teams have won the PAC crown in the past five years, including Waynesburg (2003) and Thiel (2005) ... The conference placed a record three teams in the postseason in 2007: W&J (NCAA D-III playoffs), Waynesburg (ECAC Southwest Bowl) and Geneva (NCCAA Victory Bowl).

TURF TALK: Three PAC programs - Bethany, | AROUND THE LEAGUE: Geno DeMarco be-Thomas More, and Westminster - will have new artifical turf surfaces this season, while Geneva (which added turf in 2007) will debut new home bleachers and a new press box ... With these new facilities, eight of the nine PAC programs will now play home games on artificial surfaces, with Saint Vincent being the lone natural grass field ... The Saints' new stadium will open on Sept. 27 against Westminster, so Thomas More will play its home opener against John Carroll this weekend at nearby Dixie Heights High School in Erlanger, Ky.



Geneva will meet Seton Hill for just the second time ... In 2006, the Golden Tornadoes defeated Seton Hill 9-7 as a member of the Mid-States Football Association and the NAIA ... Geneva has since moved to NCAA Division III while the Griffins are members of the WVIAC and NCAA Division II.

The 2008 season is Grove City's 25th season of competition in the Presidents' Athletic Conference

Saint Vincent Bearcats (0-0, 0-0 PAC)

The Bearcats will open up the 2008 season on Saturday,

hosting the McDaniel College Green Terror ... Sixteen starters and 32 letterwinners return from last season for Saint Vincent, the first season of football at the school since the program was disbanded following the 1962 season.

Thiel **Tomcats** (0-0, 0-0 PAC)

Thiel College opens its 104th varsity football season with a

non-conference bout vs. the Marietta College Pioneers ... Thiel and Marietta have only met five times since the series began in 1921, with the Pioneers winning the last three meetings ... The last - and only - Thiel win in the series came 85 years ago during the 1923 season. Then known as the "Huskies," Thiel won that meeting 13-7 ... This Saturday's game marks the eighth home opener held at Alumni Stadium ... Over the previous seven home openers, Thiel has a record of 1-6, with the only win coming by way of a 39-36 victory over Ohio Wesleyan to open the 2005 season ... Thiel has opened its season at home nine times since 1990 and four times since 2001.

Thomas More Saints (0-0, 0-0 PAC)

The Saints open their second season under head coach Jim Hilvert this weekend, as Thomas More hosts OAC power John Carroll at Dixie Heights High School.

Washington & Jefferson **Presidents** (0-0, 0-0 PAC)

Washington & Jefferson opens the season on the road for the first time since 2005 on Satur-

day at Oberlin ... The Presidents have won their last three road season openers and have not suffered a loss on the road in a season opener since falling at Emory & Henry by a 38-10 margin in 1997 ... Senior quarterback Bobby Swallow leads 16 returning starters from last year's 10-1 squad which claimed the school's 21st PAC title ... W&J Head Coach Mike Sirianni is three victories shy of moving into second place on the school's all-time coaching win list.

Waynesburg Yellow Jackets (0-0, 0-0 PAC)

The Waynesburg University football team is gearing up for their 2008 season opener against Wooster on Saturday at John F. Wiley Stadium ... When Waynesburg has the ball, all eyes will be on sophomore running back Robert Heller, who returns to the team after rushing for over 2,000 yards and 26 touchdowns last year ... Both numbers were tops in Division III ... On defense, Waynesburg has to find replacements for six departed starters ... It will also be the fourth season-opener for head coach Rick Shepas, who is coming off his best season with the team as Waynesburg went 8-3 last year.

Westminster **Titans** (0-0, 0-0 PAC)

The Titans begin their fourth season under head coach Jeff Hand with 17 returning starters including nine on defense from a team that went 5-5 and 2-4 in the PAC ... Westminster has won all four meetings against Heidelberg dating back to 1968 ... This is the first meeting between Westminster and Heidelberg since 1971, a year after Westminster won its first the NAIA National Championship and a year before Heidelberg won the NCAA Division III National Championship ... After Westminster beat Heidelberg at home, 13-10, the Student Princes went on to win a school-record 18 straight games ... Westminster lost in the NAIA national championship game that year.
