PAC Offensive Player of the Week

BRANDON MCGLOTHLIN
Grove City College
Senior fullback - 5-9, 195
Freedom, Pa./Freedom H.S.

McGlothlin led the Wolverines to a 54-14 win over Manchester by rushing 20 times for 121 yards and three touchdowns (8,3,27). His rushing efforts helped Grove City to its first three-game winning streak (dating back to last season) since winning three straight games to close the 2000 season.

Also nominated was junior RB **John Dziurzynski (Scottdale, Pa./Southmoreland H.S.)** of Thiel, junior RB **R.J. Zitzelsberger (Yorkville, Ohio/Linsly H.S.)** of Washington & Jefferson, senior QB **Jeff Dumm (Charleroi, Pa./Charleroi H.S.)** of Waynesburg, and senior RB **Scott Froelich (Cuyahoga Falls, Ohio/Cuyahoga Falls H.S.)** of Westminster.

PAC Defensive Player of the Week

FRANK PILATO
Washington & Jefferson College
Senior strong safety - 6-1, 185
Macedonia, Ohio/Nordonia H.S.

Pilato recorded 15 total tackles (seven solo, eight assisted), an interception and a pass breakup while leading W&J to a 31-0 shutout of Tri-State, the team's first at home since 1997. He now has 12 career interceptions, ranking third all-time at Washington & Jefferson

PAC FOOTBALL NOTES

Bethany Bison

Bethany opened the 2004 season with a 35-7 loss at Franklin and Marshall ... The Bison hung close for most of the game, and trailed 7-0 at halftime, with the lone score coming on a one-yard run by F&M RB **Scott Stephen** ... The Diplomats led 21-0 when BC responded as QB **Brian Wineberg** connected with senior WR **Eric Givens** for an 18-yard TD ... However, F&M added two scores late... Wineberg and starting QB **Nazih Banna** each went 7-for-14 with one interception ... Wineberg passed for 73 yards and Banna had 63 ... FB **Mike Doyle** led with 45 rushing yards on nine carries, while freshman **Milton Joyner** caught four passes for 40 yards ... LB **Eric Crawford** had an interception for BC.

Wash. & Jeff. Presidents

The Presidents opened the season under the lights for the second season in a row Saturday and rolled to an easy 31-0 victory over Tri-State ... The shutout was the first for the Presidents at home since blanking Defiance in the 1997 season finale (a span of 32 games) ... Seniors SS **Frank Pilato** and LB **Eric Field** each had 15 tackles ... Pilato also added an interception, giving him 12 for his career ... Senior **Matt Bettinazzi** and junior **R.J. Zitzelberger** combined to rush for 193 yards on 25 carries ... Zitzelberger also scored on TD runs of one and four yards ... Junior QB **Chris Edwards** completed a 61-yard bomb to junior WR **Jon Miller** ... Junior WR **Aaron Krepps** totaled 133 all-purpose yards (64 receiving, 69 return.

Grove City Wolverines

Grove City extended its win streak to three, dating back to 2003, by rolling past Manchester ... The Wolverine defense had five sacks, forced seven turnovers and held Manchester to 25 yards of total offense ... Junior QB **Bradford Clark** completed 8-of-13 pass attempts in his first collegiate start ... **Brandon McGlothlin** ran for 121 yards and three TDs on 20 attempts ... Sophomore DT **Jordan Johnston** tallied two sacks, forced a fumble and recovered a fumble in his first college start ... Junior **Aaron Margo** returned an interception 94 yards for a touchdown, the longest interception return in school history ... It was also the second-longest play of any kind in the program's history.

Waynesburg Yellow Jackets

The Yellow Jackets opened defense of their PAC championship with a home contest with a 64-0 shutout of Denison ... The Jacket scores came from all angles, including four on the ground and two on returns ... Senior QB **Jeff Dumm** threw for 219 yards on 19-of-24 attempts, including two touchdowns (9, 30) and now ranks third in career total offense in the Waynesburg record books with 5,221 yards ... Freshman RB **Calvin Lee** sparked the ground game in his debut, as he gained 102 yards on 20 carries, including three TDs ... Junior **Dominick Hunter** had a special game, as he returned both a punt return and blocked punt for scores ... The Jacket defense held the Big Red to only 97 yards of total offense.

Thiel Tomcats

The Tomcats dropped a 40-14 decision against Wisconsin-Platteville to open the school's 100th season of football Saturday at Alumni Stadium ... Senior FB **Justin Kuban** scored to bring the Tomcats even with the Pioneers at 7-7 early in the second quarter, but UWP put up five straight touchdowns before senior QB **Darrell Satterfield** hooked up with junior WR **Dane Haskins** on a two-yard touchdown pass late in the fourth quarter ... UWP outgained the Tomcats 530-252 ... Junior TB **John Dziurzynski** had his best outing as a Tomcat, running for 105 yards on 26 carries ... Haskins and junior WR **Tom McEntire** each finished with four catches ... Satterfield completed 10-of-20 passes for 120 yards.

Westminster Titans

Westminster dropped its fourth consecutive season opener with a 31-0 non-conference loss at Ohio Northern ... It marked the first shutout loss for the Titans in a season opener since a 10-0 defeat at Michigan Tech in 1999 ... Senior TB **Scott Froelich** rushed 19 times for 88 yards ... Sophomore QB **J.R. Barley** completed 13-of-28 passes for 107 yards with an interception in his first start as a Titan ... Senior WR **Brian Ekis** led the receiving corps with four catches for 33 yards ... Defensively, senior DB **Clint DeLuca** and junior DL **Ryan Chmura** posted nine tackles apiece, with Chmura adding a fumble recovery ... Senior DL **Tony Ventresco** and junior DL **Adam Hadvavny** each posted sacks.

Series Record: Westminster leads 25-23-5

Game Notes: Local rivals Allegheny and Westminster will each look for their first win of the season ... The Gators dropped a 27-14 decision to Baldwin-Wallace in the opening weekend ... The Titans have won two straight in the series, including a 3-0 overtime win on a mud-soaked field in Meadville last season ... The last meeting at Burry Stadium came in 2002, with Westminster winning 24-13 ... Allegheny, a member of the North Coast Athletic Conference (NCAC), last defeated Westminster in 1995 (21-14) and last won at Burry Stadium in 1994 (14-9) ... Westminster dropped its 2003 home opener to NCAA Division II Mansfield 50-17.

Game Notes: Bethany and Alma will face each other in the season opener for the Scots and Bethany's 2004 home opener ... Bethany will be looking for its first win since defeating Apprentice 30-6 on Nov. 1 in the next-to-last game of the 2003 season ... Alma was 6-4 last season and 3-3 in the Michigan Intercollegiate Athletic Association ... They return four quarterbacks who have started games in their careers, while the top four wide receivers also return ... Senior Nazih Banna made his first career start at quarterback for Bethany on Saturday and went 7-for-14 for 63 yards and one interception ... LB T.J. Chambers notched a career-high 10 tackles to lead the team.

OWU fell at Franklin College (Ind.) 34-33 on Sept. 4 ... Junior QB **Ryan Sir Louis** led the Bishops with 123 yards in 13 rushes and completed 9-of-17 passes for 103 yards in the defeat ... Sophomore defensive back **Kyle Sherman** picked off two passes and led the Bishops with 9 tackles ... The Battling Bishops, members of the North Coast Athletic Conference (NCAC) will test the Tomcat run defense as they employ the Delaware Wing-T offensive set.

Game Notes: The Wolverines look to earn their first-four game win streak since 1999 with a win at Carnegie Mellon ... Grove City has never won at Gesling Stadium ... Last season, CMU jumped out to a 28-0 lead early in the second quarter and withstood a Grove City comeback to secure a 35-21 triumph ... CMU has won three straight from Grove City, including a 9-6 overtime win two years ago ... The Tartans opened 2004 with a 44-0 win at Hiram last Saturday ... This is the second straight year the teams will play in Pittsburgh ... Grove City unveiled crimson pants Saturday, the first time in recent memory that the Wolverines have showcased a monochrome look.

Game Notes: The battle of the Yellow Jackets will take place for a consecutive season, as Randolph Macon visits Waynesburg ... Waynesburg owns a 3-0 advantage in the all-time series, following last season's 45-7 victory in Ashland, Va. ... R-MC is coming off a 20-10 victory at Chowan, in which R-MC rushed for 173 yards, while holding Chowan to only 14 yards rushing ... The R-MC victory was the first for head coach **Pedro Arruza**, who was making his head coaching debut after spending the past five seasons as an assistant coach at Washington University (Mo.).

The Presidents took last year's contest, 42-28, as they jumped out to a 21-0 first-quarter lead and forced five Panther turnovers ... W&J held the Panthers to -3 yards rushing ... Two years ago in Indiana, Hanover broke open a tie in the fourth quarter with three late touchdowns to defeat W&J, 35-14 ... The Panthers have won two of the three meetings all-time at L.S. Ayres Field ... The Presidents are now 63-12-1 when opening at home in history ... W&J has won 25 of the past 26 games in which it was the first team to score.
