## PAC FOOTBALL 2011 - Week 2 Conference Notes

**PAC-MAC CHALLENGE:** The second and final year of the PAC-MAC Football Challenge Series take place this Saturday (Sept. 10), with seven of the eight games taking place on PAC campuses ... The MAC captured the series a year ago, winning six of the eight contests ... Grove City and Bethany were the lone PAC winners, as the Wolverines defeated Lebanon Valley and the Bison edged King's ... The series will not continue in 2012, as the MAC begins a similar series with the New Jersey Athletic Conference (NJAC).

**NEWS & NOTES:** PAC teams went 3-5 in non-league action on September 3, with four of the five losses coming by eight points or less ... Sophomore QB **Matt Bliss** of W&J completed 19-of-28 passes for 286 yards and two TDs in his first collegiate game at Juniata ... Junior TB **John Proano** rushed for 43 yards and scored both TDs (6, 6) for Westminster against Hiram ... Junior MLB **Mario Postero** recorded a career-best 17 tackles for Grove City vs. Carnegie Mellon in his first collegiate start, the highest tackle total by a PAC defender in week one.

**AROUND THE LEAGUE:** Junior CB **Jeff Joyce** posted two interceptions for Bethany at Allegheny, leading a defense which held AC to seven points and 189 yards ... Thiel sophomore QB **Jared Soell** threw for 149 yards and three TDs and rushed for a career-high 128 at Marietta ... Senior WR **AJ Delmonico** caught eight passes for 109 yards and a TD for Geneva vs. Frostburg State ... Saint Vincent senior RB **Mike Kale** rushed for 119 yards and a TD at Bridgewater ... Senior S **Ryan Williams** had 12 tackles and an interception for Waynesburg at CNU.

Holmes was the top receiver with four catches for 72 yards and RB **Eric Walker** totaled 80 yards on 17 carries ... LB **Kyle Arrington** paced the defense with 10 tackles and LB **Tyrell Scott** made nine stops ... CB **Jeff Joyce** picked off two passes and DEs **Kasib Taalib-Din** and **Prince Aguzie** both had a sack.

The GTs had two scores called back on holding penalties and Frostburg took advantage with a pair of second half TDs ... **Corey O'Patchen's** 30-yard TD reception in the fourth quarter proved to be too little, too late ... Sophomore QB **Zack Hayward** made his starting debut by throwing for 299 yards on 23-of-42 passing ... Defensively, Geneva got seven tackles each **Dillon Goodell**, **Marcus Costanza** and **Scott Erb** to lead the way.

Junior LB **Mario Posteraro** made his first start and recorded a career-high 17 tackles ... Grove City committed just one penalty in the game and held a 19-18 edge in first downs ... The Wolverines attempted two two-point conversions Saturday after going the entire 2010 season with going for two ... Grove City begins a three-game homestand Saturday against Lebanon Valley.

Saint Vincent led 10-0 at the half and 17-3 early in the fourth quarter, before the Eagles came back to tie the game in the closing minutes of the final stanza, sealing the win with a 21-yard field goal on their first possession of OT ... **Mike Kale** posted a game-high 119 rushing yards with a TD, the fourth straight game dating to last season in which he eclipsed 100 yards ... **Aaron Smetanka** completed 18-of-28 passes for 191 yards, with **Ricky Douglas** his favorite target, making four grabs for 61 yards in his first collegiate start ... The Bearcats outgained the Eagles 367-277 and had a time of possession advantage of 33:27-26:33 ... Defensively, **Anthony Johnson** had 12 tackles and a sack.

After a field goal extended Marietta's lead to eight (32-24), the Tomcats were able to drive to the Pioneer three for an attempt to tie, but a Soell pass to Houpt was broken up in the end zone with no time remaining ... Houpt caught five passes for 46 yards and two touchdowns ... Junior CB **Marshaun Hainesworth** registered a career-high 13 tackles and a forced fumble.

Junior DB **Zach Autenrieb** has been named a preseason All-Americans *The Sporting News*.
