4-5 IN WEEK ONE: The 2009 PAC football season got underway on Sept. 5, with league teams posting a 4-5 mark in non-conference action. Both of the league's national playoff teams from 2008 got off to a solid start, as defending PAC champion Thomas More won at John Carroll 14-7, while Washington & Jefferson rolled at home past Oberlin 35-9. Other winners for the PAC included Waynesburg, which outgunned Wooster 42-39 in a game featuring 10 lead changes; and Geneva, a 41-28 victor over Frostburg State.

set a new Westminster single-game receptions record with 13 catches for 122 yards against Heidelberg ... Senior DE Brian Wilson was dominating for Geneva against Frostburg State, posting a fumble return for a TD to go along with two tackles for losses, a QB sack and a forced fumble ... Senior QB Willie Bova was 25-of-43 passing for 206 yards and two TDs for Thiel against Marietta ... Sophomore RB Jairus Marlow had 139 yards of total offense and three TDs for Saint Vincent against McDaniel.

NEWS & NOTES: Senior WR Chad Rosatelli | AROUND THE LEAGUE: Senior WR Josh Fisher posted three TD receptions for 51 yards in Waynesburg's thrilling win at Wooster ... W&J junior RB Derek Taylor rushed for 93 yards and two TDs in the President win over Oberlin ... Senior QB Trevor Stellman posted TD runs of three and 17 yards in Thomas More's 14-7 win at John Carroll ... Saturday's 52-47 loss to Dickinson marked the first time in school history Grove City lost a game when scoring 40+ points ... Bethany senior WR Matt Cruse needs 148 receiving vards to become the school's all-time yardage leader.

The Bison opened the season with a 14-play, 91-yard drive capped off by freshman RB **Solomon Griffin**'s 6-yard TD run for a 7-0 lead ... Bethany had chances for more throughout the game, but had a field goal blocked and converted just 1-of-4 chances in the red zone ... The offense had 268 total yards, with 167 coming on the ground ... **Eric Walker** ran for 77 yards on 12 carries and **Marcus Santini** gained 57 on 11 attempts ... Defensively, senior DB **Matt Dahle** made 10 tackles, including one for loss, and freshman LB **Kyle Arrington** made six stops and picked off a pass.

Saint Vincent Bearcats (0-1)



The Bearcats found themselves on the wrong end of

an offensive shootout on opening day, falling 52-37 at McDaniel ... Jairus Marlow was the offensive star for Saint Vincent, gaining 139 yards of total offense (79 rec/38 rush/22 KR) and scoring three touchdowns, including runs of 18 and one yard and a 61-yard TD reception ... QB Kevin Corona completed 13-of-23 passes for 265 yards and two TDs, with a 53yard strike to Phil Masciantonio joining the Marlow score ... Marvin Daney made five receptions for 72 yards, including a fourth-quarter TD from QB Jake Smith ... Defensively, Jeff Graham led SVC with 10 tackles, while David Ribero, Sean Hufgard, and Jim Muraco totaled eight apiece ... The 37 points were the most scored by the Bearcats in modern history, and the highest since 1961.

Washington & Jefferson Presidents (1-0, 0-0 PAC)



Washington & Jefferson bumped up four spots to No. 10 in the <u>D3football.com</u> poll

after its 26-point victory over Oberlin ... The Presidents received a pair of touchdown runs from junior **Derek Taylor** and freshman **Brian Baldrige** ... Junior **Steven Shumaker** tossed his first touchdown pass as a starter early in the fourth quarter after hitting senior **Jacob McBride** on a 4-yard toss ... The W&J defense spearheaded the victory after limiting the Yeomen to 188 total yards and 12 first downs ... OC averaged on 1.9 yards per rush and scored its only touchdown on the final play of the game. Geneva Golden Tornadoes (1-0)



Geneva opened the 2009 season in impressive fashion in front of a

capacity crowd of over 6,000 at the new Reeves Field ... The Golden Tornadoes picked up a pair of touchdowns on offense and a pair on defense in opening up a 27-14 halftime lead against Frostburg State ... Rich Kolesar turned in the play of the game when he stepped in front of an FSU pass at the three-yard line and scampered 97 yards for a touchdown, which was the 2nd longest interception return in school history ... Brian Wilson also scored on defense with a 23-yard fumble return ... QB David Girardi completed 19-of-32 passes for 200 vards and found AJ Delmonico in the end zone for a second half touchdown before scoring himself on a two-yard run in the final minute of the 41-28 GT victory.





Thiel opened the 2009 campaign and the Kurt Reiser Era Saturday with a disappointing 20-14 loss at Marietta ... Thiel was able to keep the game within reach never trailing by more than a score - despite the lack of any substantive running game ... The Tomcats accounted for only six net yards on the ground, with senior RB Dan Hess leading the way with 34 yards on 20 carries ... Senior QB Willie Bova was credited with minus-33 rushing yards, but managed to put together a solid day through the air, completing 25-of-43 passes for 206 yards and two touchdowns ... Junior Bobby Shew led Thiel defensively with nine tackles ... Junior Will Haase also stood out, racking up six tackles - including one tackle for a loss - and a fumble recovery.

Waynesburg Yellow Jackets (1-0, 0-0 PAC)

Waynesburg is coming off

of one the most exciting wins in program history after beating the College of Wooster 42-39 on Saturday ... The Yellow Jackets and the Fightin' Scots combined for more than 1,000 yards of offense, with 285 of them coming off the right arm of junior QB Brad Dawson ... He piled up those yards on 25-of-45 attempts. Sophomore RB Justin Falcon set a new personal high with 148 yards and a touchdown on 20 carries ... However, the biggest performance of the day came courtesy of senior WR Josh Fisher, who hauled in three passes, all for touchdowns, with the final catch being a gamewinning 25-yard strike from Dawson ... The Jackets defense was led by senior S Dylan August, who racked up 12 tackles, including a game-high eight solo hits and 1.5 tackles for losses.

Grove City Wolverines (0-1, 0-0 PAC)



Grove City opened its 115th season of intercollegiate play Saturday with a 52-47 setback again

urday with a 52-47 setback against Dickinson at Robert E. Thorn Field ... QB Andrew DiDonato accumulated a school-record 400 yards of total offense, including a career-high 291 passing yards ... That is the fourth-highest total in program history ... DiDonato also became Grove City's all-time leader with 34 touchdown passes ... Will McCoy, Luke O'Hara and Zach Summy all caught touchdown passes while Blaine Miller ran for two scores ... Junior Craig Bicehouse kicked a pair of field goals ... Mark Rossol and Randy Santina both intercepted passes ... Grove City had never lost when scoring more than 40 points ... It's the highest-scoring game in modern Grove City history.

Thomas More Saints (1-0, 0-0 PAC)



The Saints opened the 2009 season with a 14-

7 win over John Carroll University on Saturday in University Heights, Ohio ... Senior QB **Trevor Stellman** led the Saints offensively with two touchdown runs of three and 17 yards ... JCU was driving to take tie or take the lead when freshman DB **Zach Autenrieb** intercepted a Blue Streak pass at the Thomas More one-yard line ... Defensively, senior LBs **Brad Steinmetz** and **Brandon Kohrs** led the Saints with eight tackles each and junior defensive back **Aaron Monk** had six tackles, an interception and a pass break-up ... Thomas More is off this week ... The Saints return to action when they open PAC play at home against Waynesburg on Sept. 19.

Westminster Titans (0-1, 0-0 PAC)



Westminster lost its

season opener against Heidelberg, 42-26, snapping the Titans' seven-game home streak, their longest streak since 1994 ... The Titans (0-1) led by 10 points (17-7) in the first half and 17-14 at halftime, before Heidelberg QB Andrew Miller threw a pair of third-quarter TD passes to Mike Preston for 61 and 71 yards, respectively, to give the Student Princes (1-0) a 28-17 lead with 1:09 remaining in the third guarter ... Westminster senior WR Chad Rosatelli tied the school record for receptions in a game as he snared 13 balls for 122 yards ... The Titans outgained the Student Princes, 406-294, and held a 27-11 advantage on first downs ... Westminster piled up 309 passing yards including 268 from senior QB Kevin Franz, who completed 27-of-46 passes and two touchdowns to senior WR Jon Gubish.
