## PAC Co-Offensive Players of the Week

**RYAN ABELS** Waynesburg College Sophomore running back - 5-9, 185 Elizabeth. Pa./Elizabeth Forward H.S.

#### DARRELL SATTERFIELD Thiel College

Senior quarterback - 5-11, 184 Orwell, Ohio/Grand Valley H.S.

Abels rushed 42 times for 246 yards and two touchdowns (4, 10) to lead the Jackets over Randolph-Macon 31-7. It was the third-best single-game rushing total in school history (record: 264 yards) and was just shy of the school single-game record for rushing attempts (44).

Satterfield completed 21-of-34 passes for 304 yards and three TDs, including the game-winner to Brandon Chambers from 25 yards out with 3:14 to play in a 22-19 win at Ohio Wesleyan. His 304 yards passing was the third-best single-game total in Thiel history, while his 21 completions were tied for fourth-best all-time in a single game at Thiel.

## PAC Defensive Player of the Week

**AARON MARGO Grove City College** Junior strong safety - 6-3, 205 Dover, Ohio/Dover H.S.

Margo recorded a career-high 15 total tackles (10 solo, five assisted), including four tackles for losses of seven yards, while adding a pass breakup for the Wolverines in their 16-14 win at Carnegie Mellon. He led a GCC defense which forced six CMU turnovers.

Also nominated was junior OLB Tom Wozniak (Windber, Pa./Windber H.S.) of Thiel, sophomore FS Nick Cherish (Venetia, Pa./Thomas Jefferson H.S.) of Washington & Jefferson; junior DB Andy Tenney (Pittsburgh, Pa./Taylor Allderdice H.S.) of Waynesburg, and senior DT Tony Ventresco (Boardman, Ohio/Boardman H.S.) of Westminster.

#### **Bethany Bison**

Bethany fell in its 2004 home opener to Alma 52-14 ... The Scots amassed 562 vards of offense en route to victory ... Bison senior QB Nazih Banna threw for 252 vards on 20-of-35 passing, along with two touchdowns in the losing effort ... He also threw four interceptions ... T.J. Parker caught his first touchdown of the season and had five grabs for 73 yards ... Zack Merz had five catches for 64 yards, and Milton Joyner, who had two acrobatic catches during the game, finished with five receptions for 46 yards ... Mike Cowan pulled down his first career touchdown and finished with two catches for 47 yards, including a 36-yarder ... Sophomore Rodney Heard and junior T.J. Chambers led the Bison with nine tackles each.

#### Wash. & Jeff. Presidents

W&J's 27-15 victory at Hanover Saturday gave the Presidents their fifth 2-0 start in the past six years ... W&J was led by WRs senior Jacob Shields and junior Aaron Krepps who both had career days ... Shields caught a career-high eight passes for a career-high 156 yards and one 47yard TD, while Krepps set a new career high with three TDs ... Krepps scored on passes for five and 17 yards and also rushed for a 43-yard score ... Sophomore FS Nick Cherish picked off two passes and junior CB Mike Wilmus led the team with nine tackles ... Junior QB Chris Edwards completed 14-of-23 passes for 201 yards and three scores ... W&J outgained the Panthers, 496-235, including 257 yards on the ground.

# PAC FOOTBALL NOTES

#### Grove City Wolverines

Grove City extended its win streak to four, the Wolverines' longest win streak since closing 1999 with four consecutive victories ... The Wolverines won for the first time ever at Gesling Stadium, forcing Carnegie Mellon into six turnovers ... DBs Gene lannuzzi and Ross Trimmer each intercepted passes while SS Aaron Margo had a career-high 15 tackles, including four for loss ... SE Dave DiDonato caught his 11th career touchdown pass, moving him into sole possession of third place on Grove City's all-time list ... Grove City converted 8 of 21 third-down opportunities and owned an 8-minute edge in time of possession ... Grove City is looking for its first five-game win streak since 1997.

#### Waynesburg Yellow Jackets

After missing the season opener, sophomore RB Ryan Abels led the Jackets to a 31-7 victory over visiting Randolph-Macon ... Abels finished the game against R-MC with 246 yards on 42 carries and two touchdowns (4, 10) ... QB Jeff Dumm tied the school record for most career passing touchdowns (46) against R-MC, as he completed 13-of-25 attempts for 128 yards ... Junior DB Eric Singer forced a fumble on a punt return that helped set-up Abels' second TD of the game ... R-MC held Waynesburg to just 14 points in the first half, before Waynesburg S Andy Tenney intercepted a pass on RMC's first possession of the second half and returned it 35 yards for a score ... Junior LB Nick | against Allegheny. Emley led the team with 9 tackles.

#### Thiel Tomcats

Junior WR **Brandon Chambers** scored three touchdowns on passes of 54, 19 and 25 yards as the Tomcats earned a 22-19 non-conference victory at Ohio Wesleyan University ... Chambers, who gained 178 yards on nine receptions, enjoyed the second three-touchdown game of his career ... OWU led 10-0 at the half, while the Tomcats were held to just 71 total yards in the first 30 minutes ... Senior QB **Darrell Satterfield** had a career day for the Tomcats, completing 21-of-34 passes for 304 yards and three scores

... His 304 yards puts him third all-time in passing yards in a game and his 21 completions ties him for fourth place among single-game completion leaders.

#### Westminster Titans

Westminster suffered a heartbreaking 21-14 double-OT loss to Allegheny in the Titans' home opener ... Senior WR Brian Ekis led the Titan offense, catching nine balls for 141 yards, including a 16-yard TD from sophomore QB J.R. Barley ... Barley was 18-of-28 for 205 yards ... Senior RB Scott Froelich carried 27 times for 120 yards in the loss ... Senior DT Tony Ventresco has seven tackles and 1 1/2 sacks against the Gators ... The Titans outgained Allegheny 156-(-2) in the opening half, but led just 6-0 on a pair of 27-yard field goals by freshman K George Malactaris ... Junior DB Tom Froelich and sophomore LB Chris Dulovich each partially blocked punts

# Hiram (0-2) at Westminster (0-2)

Saturday, Sept. 18 - 1 p.m. Harold Burry Stadium (4,500/grass) - New Wilmington, Pa.

**Game Notes:** Despite campuses seperated by just 52 miles, the Titans and Terriers will meet on the gridiron for the first time since 1942, with both teams looking for their first win of the season ... Hiram, from the North Coast Athletic Conference (NCAC), has been outscored 68-6 in a pair of losses this year toi Carnegie Mellon (44-0) and Bluffton (24-6) ... Saturday is Hall of Fame Day at Westminster, as eight individuals will be inducted into the Titan Sports Hall of Fame ... Saturday is also the "Campus Salute" for legendary Titan quarterback **Harold Davis**, a 2004 inductee into the College Football Hall of Fame.

#### Bluffton (2-0) at Thiel (1-1) Saturday, Sept. 18 - 1:30 p.m. Alumni Stadium (1,400/turf) - Greenville, Pa.

Series Record: Bluffton leads 5-3

**Game Notes:** The Beavers of Bluffton College invade Alumni Stadium on Sept. 18 sporting a 2-0 record ... The Tomcats have taken the last two contests against the Beavers, winning at Salzman Stadium 35-7 last season ... Junior WR **Brandon Chambers** had a record-setting performance in last season's Tomcat win, finishing with nine catches for 283 yards and three touchdowns ... Chambers' performance was good enough for him to claim the PAC Offensive Player of the Week award that week ... Bluffton senior **Ben Dodds** led the Beaver rushing attack in their 24-6 win over Hiram Saturday, posting 165 yards on 21 carries and two touchdowns.

Wooster won the most recent meeting in 2001, 6-0, a game that was rescheduled due to the Sept. 11 terrorist attacks ... Grove City's first-ever overtime game came against Wooster in 1996 ... That year, Wooster pulled out a 7-6 double-over-time win at Grove City ... Wooster features consensus All-American halfback **Tony Sutton** ... Grove City has not allowed an opponent to score in the second or third quarter this season ... The teams met every year from 1996-2001 with Wooster winning all five games.

... The last time W&J and Allegheny met in Meadville, the Gators shocked the Presidents with a 28-25 come-frombehind win ... W&J posted a 28-23 victory last year in Washington behind **Aaron Krepps**' 202 all-purpose yards and two touchdowns.

The Jackets lost to Adrian on Saturday by a score of 34-0 and are 0-2 so far this season ... The Bison will be trying to break a three-game losing streak dating back to last season.

Waynesburg (2-0) at Manchester (0-2) Saturday, Sept. 18 - 1:30 p.m. EST (2:30 pm EDT) Carl W. Burt Stadium (4,500/grass) - No. Manchester, Ind.

**Game Notes:** The Yellow Jackets square off with the Spartans of Manchester for the second-ever meeting between the two schools ... Manchester won the lone meeting back in 1999, when it handed the Jackets a 39-37 defeat ... Manchester lost, 54-14, to PAC member Grove City in the season-opener before losing to Earlham, 35-21, last week ... Manchester, like Randolph-Macon, is its first season with a new head coach, **Shannon Griffith** ... Griffith is no stranger to the sidelines, as he was an assistant for 13 years at colleges in Indiana ... The Waynesburg-Manchester game is the first of two consecutive road games to the state of Indiana for the Jackets.
