PAC FOOTBALL 2008 - Week 4 Conference Notes

PAC PLAY UNDERWAY: Conference action in the PAC got underway this weekend with four games, as W&J, Grove City, Thomas More and Westminster came away with victories in tightly contested matchups ... Senior MLB Adam Eichler of Grove City had 14 tackles and a sack on the final drive to help secure the Wolverines 41-35 win over Bethany in the second night home game in Grove City football history ... W&J senior WR David Ravida caught eight passes for 64 vards and a touchdown in a 34-24 President win at Thiel.

McKolosky rushed 30 times for 146 yards and two touchdowns, including a 59-yard burst, in the Titans' 31-24 PAC win over Saint Vincent ... Bethany WR Matt Cruse caught five passes for 107 yards, including a 78-yard TD reception, against Grove City ... Thomas More junior RB Cordario Collier posted 130 yards of offense (55 rushing, 75 receiving) for the Saints in a 34-26 PAC road win at Waynesburg ... Freshman RB Billy Becker rushed for 105 vards on 27 carries for the Yellow Jackets in the loss to Thomas More.

WHO'S HOT: Westminster junior RB Nick | AROUND THE LEAGUE: Waynesburg head coach Rick Shepas announced that preseason All-American sophomore RB Robert Heller has left the Yellow Jacket program ... Mike Speal of Saint Vincent had a 76-yard interception return for a touchdown against Westminster ... Thiel DT William Haase had six tackles (including 2.5 for losses) and a sack against Washington & Jefferson ... Geneva will try to avoid going 0-3 for the first time in Geno DeMarco's 16-year head coaching career when the Golden Tornadoes face Thiel Saturday.



Thomas More

Bethany Bison (1-2, 0-1 PAC)

A Grove City touchdown with 1:59 to play provided the winning points

in a disappointing 41-35 loss for the Bison in their PAC opener Saturday night ... Bethany took a 35-33 lead on a 1-yard TD pass from Chad Smith to Marcus Santini with just three seconds left in the first half ... Santini finished with 87 rushing yards and a TD (30), as well as six catches for 46 yards and a score ... Eric Walker (14) and Jeff Joyce (3) had rushing TDs as well, while Matt Cruse caught a 78-yard scoring pass from Smith for his 18th career TD reception to tie the Bethany record (T.J. Parker) ... Cruse finished with 107 yards on five receptions, giving him 100 catches for his career ... Defensively, SS John George had 10 tackles and DL John Gyure totaled seven stops, including three sacks.

Saint Vincent Bearcats (1-2)



Saint Vincent was defeated 31-24 at PAC foe Westminster ...

The Bearcats jumped out to a 10-0 lead in the first guarter before the Titans scored 31 unanswered points over the second and third quarters ... SVC scored a pair of fourth quarter touchdowns to cut the deficit to seven, but could not complete the comeback ... Freshmen QBs Kevin Corona and Jake Smith shared signal-calling duties, combining to complete 15 passes for 170 yards while each throwing a touchdown ... TE Jake Gabelt and WR Rob James each made touchdown grabs, with the latter finishing with four catches for 72 vards ... Defensively, Josh Diamond led both sides with 10.5 stops, while Mike Nadeau picked up a pair of sacks and Mike Speal returned an interception 76 yards for a fourth quarter score.

Washington & Jefferson Presidents (3-0, 1-0 PAC)



The Presidents ran their regular-season road win streak to 21 games with a 34-24 victory

over Thiel at Alumni Stadium ... Washington & Jefferson also increased its PAC win streak to 18 games ... The Presidents have not lost a conference game since falling to the Tomcats on Oct. 1, 2005 ... Senior QB **Bobby Swallow** completed 21-of-35 passes for 258 yards and two touchdowns and surpassed 6,000 yards for his career ... Junior PK **Chuck Grabner** booted two field goals (33,31) and made all four of his extra-point attempts ... Head coach **Mike Sirianni** moved into sole possession of second place on the W&J victories list with the 53rd of his career ... The Presidents played without starting running back **Curt Jones**, who sat out with an ankle injury.

Geneva Golden Tornadoes (0-2)



The Golden Tornadoes enjoyed their only bye **GOLDEN TORNADOES** week of the season to

lick their wounds after suffering a 48-6 loss to Salisbury University, which was the worst loss in six years ... Geneva has started the season at 0-2 for just the third time in **Geno DeMarco**'s 16-year career as head coach ... A DeMarcocoached Geneva team has never started 0-3 ... The Golden Tornadoes will try to turn their fortunes around as they enter PAC play this Saturday against Thiel College in Greenville.

Grove City Wolverines (2-1, 1-0 PAC)



Grove City recorded its firstever night victory at Thorn Field Saturday, 41-35, against Bethany ... Brian

Mercer's fourth touchdown run of the night put Grove City ahead with 1:59 left ... Mercer finished with 126 yards rushing ... QB Andrew DiDonato ran for two scores and 57 yards ... He also completed 14-of-24 passes for 186 yards ... Stephen Mercer pulled in five passes for 70 yards, including a 33-yard catch on the game-winning drive ... After surrendering 329 vards and 35 points in the first half, the Grove City defense blanked Bethany, limiting the Bison to 61 yards of offense in the second half ... lan Minster set up two Grove City scores by recovering a fumble and intercepting a pass ... Kevin Twarek posted 1.5 sacks ... Randy Santina intercepted a pass for the second straight week.

Thiel Tomcats (0-3, 0-1 PAC)

Big plays by the explosive Washington & Jefferson of-

fense and two inopportune turnovers doomed the Tomcats Saturday, as Thiel fell short in its upset bid of the No. 16 Presidents, 34-24, at Alumni Stadium... Offensively, the Tomcats rebounded from a dismal outing a week ago at Albion by putting together a 346-yard day, with 253 of those yards coming on the arm of junior QB Willie Bova, who completed 13-of-26 passes for two touchdowns and no interceptions ... Defensively, junior William Haase continued his development into one of the PAC's premiere defensive linemen by making two and a half tackles for losses including a nine-yard sack in the first quarter... Haase has registered a sack in each of the first three games of the season.

Waynesburg Yellow Jackets (1-2, 0-1 PAC)



Waynesburg fell behind

20-0 in the first guarter to the Saints of Thomas More before dropping a 34-26 decision in the PAC opener for both teams on Saturday, ... Sophomore RB Billy Becker, making his second straight college start, led the offense with a combined 133 yards (105 rushing, 28 receiving) and a touchdown on the day ... Freshman K Bryan Arbes was the Yellow Jackets' biggest weapon, however, as he tied a school record with four field goals made ... One of those four field goals was drilled from 49 yards, another school record ... On defense, junior OLB Ryan Krull led the team in tackles for a third straight week with 11, six of which were solo stops ... Krull also recorded a sack, defended a pass and returned a fumble 17 yards. Thomas More Saints (1-1, 1-0 PAC)



Thomas More went on the road for the first time

this season and defeated Waynesburg, 34-26. in the PAC opener for both teams ... The Saints led from start to finish as they led, 20-0 after one quarter, 20-6 at halftime and 34-19 after three quarters ... Junior QB Trevor Stellman led the TMC offense as he was 9-of-25 passing for 178 yard and three touchdowns and also rushed 10 times for 68 vards ... Junior RB Cordario Collier carried the ball 11 times for 55 yards and also caught five passes for 75 yards and one TD ... Freshman WR Nick Olthaus had two catches for 77 yards and a score ... On defense. Thomas More was led by junior LB Brad Steinmetz, who recorded 16 tackles including two for losses ... Junior DB Martez Williams had 10 tackles and two breakups.

Westminster Titans (2-1, 0-0 PAC)



After a 10-10 tie at half-

time, Westminster scored 21 unanswered points on its way to a 31-24 victory over Saint Vincent Saturday ... Junior QB Kevin Franz threw for over 200 yards for the third straight game as he compiled 243 yards on 22-of-38 passing, including a 6-yard TD pass to senior WR Jordan Belosh in the third guarter to break the tie ... Junior TB Nick McKolosky rushed for over 100 yards for the first time this season ... McKolosky finished the day with 146 yards on 30 carries and two touchdowns ... Junior WR Jon Gubish achieved a career-high 91 receiving yards by tying a personal best with six catches ... The Titan defense was led by senior LB Jordan Blinn with nine tackles ... The defense forced three turnovers, including a sack and forced fumble by senior DE Andrew Robison in the third quarter.

Series Record: Geneva leads 21-10-3

Game Notes: Thiel, 0-3 for just the second time under head coach **Jack Leipheimer**, welcomes Geneva to Alumni Stadium for its annual homecoming game... Geneva opens PAC play against the Tomcats ... Both teams will be looking for their first victory of the season as Geneva has opened 0-2 and Thiel has dropped its first three ... Geneva leads the all-time series with Thiel 21-9-3, including a 20-3 victory at Greenville to open the 2007 campaign ... Geneva's defense held Thiel to -25 yards rushing in last year's game ... The football series between Thiel and Geneva began in 1899 ... Geneva and Thiel played regularly in the early part of the last century before discontinuing the series in 1934 ... The series resumed for one game in 1955, then again for eight meetings between 1970 and 1981 ... Saturday's will be the fourth meeting between the two teams since 2002 ... In 2001, Leipheimer's first season at Thiel, the Tomcats started the season 0-3 before beating Grove City in week four ... Thiel hasn't started a season 0-4 since 1995.

Game Notes: Saint Vincent has faced Waynesburg more than any other foe, with this week's game being the 27th meeting between the two squads ... Waynesburg owns a 12-10-4 advantage in the series, and the Yellow Jackets have won their last four against the Bearcats, with SVC's last win in the series coming in 1959 by a 6-0 score ... Last season, Waynesburg defeated Saint Vincent 42-20 in week five ... The Yellow Jackets racked up 202 yards rushing in the win.

Series Record: Thomas More leads 5-1 Game Notes: The Saints will open The Bank of Kentucky Field on Saturday when they host Westminster College during Homecoming at Thomas More ... Thomas More enters the game with a 1-1 overall record and a 1-0 PAC record after defeating Waynesburg, 34-26, on Sept. 20 ... Westminster enters the game with a 2-1 record after defeating Saint Vincent, 31-24, on Sept. 20 ... Westminster is looking to snap Thomas More's three-game win streak against the Titans Westminster has led the PAC in time of possession per game for the last 13 weeks and enter the game averaging 34:28 of possession per game so far this season ... Westminster TB Nick McKolosky is coming off his second-best rushing game of his career with 146 yards last week vs. Saint Vincent ... He is currently the PAC's leading rusher with 98.3 yards per game. ... The Saints are sixth in the PAC against the run (163.5 yards per game) ... Westminster's only win was a 23-13 win at Thomas More in 2004 ... Last year, the Titans lost 34-7 after entering the game ranked seventh in the country in total defense at 201 yards per game, but wound up yielding 324 yards ... The offense also failed as the Titans couldn't convert on their first four third downs and QB Kevin Franz threw an interception on the Titans' fifth drive.

Washington & Jefferson earned a 49-14 win at Grove City last year ... The Presidents racked up 30 first downs and limited Grove City to a 1-for-14 effort on third down ... W&J has won the last nine games in the series by an average of 27.2 points ... W&J hasn't been held to less than 30 points versus Grove City since 1998 ...
