PAC FOOTBALL 2010 - Week 5 Conference Notes

BIG PAC WINS: The race for the PAC football I title was clarified a bit following four games on Sept. 25 ... In the game which has decided the PAC title the past two seasons, Thomas More overcame a 21-17 halftime deficit to edge visiting W&J 29-21 ... Saint Vincent posted its first-ever PAC win at home over Thiel, 17-3 ... Waynesburg improved to 2-0 in PAC play after blowing past Grove City 42-16 ... Finally, Geneva used a goal-line stand at the 1-yard line as time expired to hold on for a 37-33 road win under the lights at Bethany.

Geneva threw for 372 yards and three TDs to lead the GTs past Bethany ... In his first career start, Waynesburg junior QB Josh Graham completed 16-of-23 passes for 200 yards and three TDs in the win over Grove City ... Junior RB Kendall Owens caught five passes for 90 yards and a touchdown for Thomas More in the victory over Washington & Jefferson ... WR Tom Quirin set a new Saint Vincent modern-day record with seven catches for 66 yards in the Bearcat victory over Thiel.

Walker scored twice in the first quarter (3, 1), which not only put BC ahead 20-3 but also gave Walker the school's career TD record (32) ... QB Matt Grimard, who accounted for 250 total yards of offense, rushed for a team-high 140 yards, his third straight 100+ rushing effort, and one TD and also threw scoring passes of 29 yards to Chris Collins and 11 yards to C.J. Thomas ... Defensively, LB Kyle Arrington made a career-high 16 tackles and FS Jeff Joyce was in on 10 stops, including a sack.

Saint Vincent Bearcats (1-2, 1-0 PAC)

The Bearcats made their first official PAC game in team history count, defeating Thiel 17-3 on Homecoming Day at Saint Vincent ... The defense was the story of the day, as the Bearcats limited Thiel to just 267 yards, and held the Tomcats to just three first downs through the first three quarters ... Armando Fortunato led the way, setting a new team record with 15 tackles, including 2.0 sacks and 3.0 TFLs ... Trevor Wezkiewicz added eight tackles, including a sack and 2.0 TFLs ... Offensively, senior WR Tom Quirin caught a modern-day record seven passes for 66 yards, while Sheldon Loughner made four receptions, including a third quarter TD ... Aaron Smetanka completed 15-of-19 passes for 150 yards and a score ... Mike Kale led the ground game, gain-

W&J dropped a key PAC game at Thomas More 29-21 Saturday ... Junior WR Jordan

Roycroft set a single-game school record with 14 catches that went for 145 yards and three scores ... Senior QB Gino Rometo threw for 270 yards and three touchdowns ... Sophomore RB Brian Baldrige rushed for 65 yards ... The W&J defense was led by junior DT Frank Gigler who had a career-high eight tackles, including four for a loss ... W&J tackled TMC ball carriers behind the line of scrimmage 11 times ... The Presidents outgained Thomas More by a 334-291 margin and limited the Saints to only 12 first downs, while racking up 19 of their own ... W&J also had a five-minute time of possession advantage (32:32-27:28) ... Washington & Jefferson also limited the Saints to 2-of-14 third-down conversions

Geneva Golden Tornadoes (2-2)

Saturday, Geneva didn't have much go right in the GOLDEN TORNADOES first half ... In fact, the

Golden Tornadoes found themselves down 20-3 before a frantic comeback and a goal line stand proved to be the difference in a 37-33 win ... David Girardi connected on a pair of 40 vard TD passes to go along with an 88-vard strike to get Geneva the lead ... For the game, the senior QB threw for 372 yards while Gerard Muschette scored again and rushed for 151 yards on 28 carries ... Corey O'Patchen (146 yards) and AJ Delmonico (106 yards) combined for 11 receptions and all three receiving scores ... For as much offense as was on display, it was one defensive play that sealed the victory ... Senior LB Chase Kelosky made the game-saving tackle just six inches from the goal line on the final play of the game.

Grove City Wolverines (2-2, 1-1 PAC)

Grove City fell to 1-1 in the PAC Saturday with a 42-16 setback

at Waynesburg ... The Wolverines had won three straight road games prior to their visit to Waynesburg ... QB Zach Gross made his first collegiate start and threw touchdown passes to Blaine Miller and Will McCoy ... The 73yard TD pass to Miller is the second-longest in program history ... Gross completed 15-of-33 passes for 188 yards ... Gross, Mike McDonald and Brian Pell combined to throw for a season-high 274 yards Miller had six catches for 106 yards ... Nine different players caught a pass ... Defensively, S Shawn Mercer recorded his first career interception ... The Wolverines limited Waynesburg to 3for-13 efficiency on third down ... TE Joseph Gulaskey made his first career start ... Grove City is off this week.

Thiel Tomcats (0-4, 0-2 PAC)

The visiting Tomcats fell to host Saint Vincent 17-3 Saturday afternoon ... Freshman K Berend Grube finished off a 13play, 61-yard drive by kicking a 26-yard field goal with 13:30 remaining in the second to give Thiel its first lead of the 2010 season ... Saint Vincent answered late in the second with a 13play, 70-yard drive of their own to put the Bearcats up 7-3 going into the break ... A 25yard field goal with 8:41 to go in the third extended the Bearcat lead to 10-3 before a TD pass with 2:18 in the guarter closed out the scoring at 17-3 ... Sophomore WR Tyler DeJong finished with five catches for 92 yards while freshman QB Andrew Smith completed 8-of-14 passes for 147 yards ... Senior FS Brvan Villegas snagged an interception to go along with eight tackles while sophomore LB Ethan Ludwig lead the team with nine stops.

Thomas More Saints (3-0, 1-0 PAC)

The 12th-ranked Saints topped W&J 29-21 in

their home-opener at The Bank of Kentucky Field ... Offensively, the Saints were led by sophomore QB Rob Kues, who was 11-of-19 passing for 160 yards and two TDs and had eight carries for 87 yards ... Junior RB Kendall Owens had five carries for one yard and had five catches for 90 yards and one TD, while freshman RB Domonique Havden finished the day with 21 carries for 49 yards and one score and had one catch for 24 yards ... Defensively, sophomore LB Nick Gramke led the Saints with 11 tackles, including one sack for 10 yards ... Senior DB Marcus Lancaster had eight tackles with one sack for nine yards and senior DT Tyler Owens had eight tackles, including one and a half sacks for 13 yards ... Senior PK Dustin Zink was 3-for-3 in kicks.

Waynesburg Yellow Jackets (2-1, 2-0 PAC)

Waynesburg put together



perhaps its most complete game of the season during a 42-16 win over PAC rival Grove City ... The victory snapped a two-game losing streak to the Wolverines, and the Yellow Jackets accomplished the feat without the services of record-setting QB Brad Dawson, who sat out the game with an injury ... Junior Josh Graham stepped in under center and skillfully guided the Jacket offense to its most productive effort of the season ... He threw for 200 yards and three touchdowns ... All three scores were pulled in by junior WR Jeff Young ... Junior RB Justin Falcon added balance to the offense with a team season-high 110 yards rushing on 19 carries ... Not to be out-done, the Jacket defense forced four turnovers, yielded just 296 total yards and scored a TD

on Jordan Helmick's interception return.

Series Record: Geneva leads 9-7-1

Game Notes: The Bearcats will wrap up a two-game homestand, hosting Geneva College... It will be the 17th all-time meeting between the two teams, with Geneva holding a 9-7-1 advantage all-time in the series, with the teams first meeting in 1926... Last season, the Bearcats and Golden Tornadoes met twice, with Geneva winning both meetings, 32-17 in Latrobe and 38-20 in Beaver Falls. ... Geneva has not lost to the Bearcats since a 14-7 loss in 1961 ... **Gerard Muschette** rushed for 153 yards in Geneva's win at Latrobe last year, while the Golden Tornadoes racked up 246 yards on the ground and held Saint Vincent to only 40 rushing yards on 33 carries.

Game Notes: The Tomcats travel to Crestview Hills, Ken. Saturday to take on the undefeated Saints of Thomas More College ... The Tomcats have dropped three straight to the Saints since posting a 17-14 overtime road win during the 2006 season ... In last season's 28-14 loss to then 15th-ranked Thomas More, the Tomcats managed just 21 rushing yards compared to the Saints 337 on the ground ... Sophomore WR **Tyler DeJong** had his best receiving performance of his freshman campaign in the loss as he caught four passes for 110 yards ... Thomas More leads the all-time series, 4-3 ... Thomas More leads the series, 2-1, when the game is played in Kentucky.

Series Record: Waynesburg leads 27-15-7

Game Notes: Bethany and Waynesburg will meet Saturday at Bison Stadium, as the Bison look for their first PAC win and the Yellow Jackets try to stay unbeaten in conference action ... Waynesburg is 27-15-7 all-time against Bethany, with the teams' first meeting coming in 1899 ... The Yellow Jackets have definitely had the advantage in the series over recent years, winning seven of the last eight contests ... The Jackets won those seven games by an average score of 45-13, including a 52-13 home victory last year ... BC won the last meeting between the schools at Bison Stadium in 2008 (31-24), their only win in the last eight match-ups ... Eric Walker broke the Bethany career touchdown record last week and with his 74 rushing yards against Geneva, became just the 6th player in school history to go over 2,000 career yards (2,002) ... He needs 35 yards to pass Brandon Isbell (2,036) for 5th place and 82 yards to pass Demrey Brandon (2,083) for 4th place on the BC career rushing charts ...

Series Record: Washington & Jefferson leads 29-2

Game Notes: Washington & Jefferson has dominated the series with Westminster throughout history, winning 29 of the 31 games ... The Presidents have defeated the Titans nine consecutive times ... W&J rolled out to a 35-0 halftime lead last year behind interception returns for touchdowns by Josh Buckley (36 yds) and Craig Sedunov (56 yds) ... The Presidents' defense amassed six sacks and forced three interceptions ... The Presidents have outscored the Titans by an average of 48.3-12.2 (290-73) in six games since 2004 ... This will be the first time since the teams began playing in 2000 that W&J has at least two losses or a losing record entering a game vs. Westminster ... Westminster last won 19-17 in 2000 at W&J ... Westminster is 3-3 in night games since 1997, including a 34-7 loss in its last visit to W&J in 2008 and a 27-14 loss at Allegheny last year ... The last night-game win for Westminster was 12-7 at Geneva in 2001 ... Westminster is 5-5 after bye weeks in its last 10 games with two week's rest.
