The lone winner was W&J, which outlasted Saint Vincent 31-20 ... PAC leader Thomas More overcame an early 9-7 deficit with 24 straight points to defeat Grove City 31-9 ... Bethany built a big lead then held off a late rally to defeat Westminster 47-39, while Waynesburg outgunned Geneva 55-42, setting a new GC school record for combined points.

NEWS & NOTES: Saint Vincent junior MLB Anthony Johnson set a new school single-game record with 17 total tackles (8 solo/9 assisted) against W&J, which is also the highest single-game total in the PAC this season ... Freshman DB Jordan Joyce had nine tackles and his first career interception for Bethany, as the Bison defeated Westminster in New Wilmington for the first time in 70 years ... Sophomore WR Geno Pasquinelli caught a career-high six passes for 129 yards and a TD for Westminster against





Grove City fell to 1-2 in the conference with a 31-9 Homecom-

ing setback against Thomas More Saturday ... GCC held Thomas More to 111 rushing yards, less than half of the Saints' seasonal average ... In the second quarter, the defense recorded a safety to give Grove City a 9-7 lead ... The Wolverines also held Thomas More to a 3-for-13 effort on third down ... Grove City had nearly a six-minute edge in possession time ... TB Blaine Miller ran for 91 yards on 22 carries ... WB Ed Reith caught five passes ... He also averaged 44 yards on eight punts ... The Wolverines committed four turnovers and also had 11 penalties for a season-high 98 yards ... CB Chris Gibbs made his first start and had a career-high nine tackles ... Grove City has now recorded a safety in two consecutive games.

Thomas More Saints (5-0, 3-0 PAC)

The Saints remained undefeated as they de-

feated Grove City, 31-9, Saturday ... Thomas More earned its highest ranking in program history as it received 615 points in the AFCA Top-25 to be ranked No. 9 ... In the Saints' win at Grove City, the offense was led by sophomore QB Rob Kues led the Saints offense as he was 13-fo-21 passing for 179 yards and two touchdowns and the defense was led by sophomore DB Zach Autenrieb, who had three tackles and two interceptions, including one returned for a touchdown ... For the season, Thomas More is outscoring its opponents by a 194-65 margin ... The Saints are led in rushing by freshman Domonique Hayden with 92 carries for 491 yards (98.2 ypg), while Kues is 55-for-88 passing for 696 yards (139.2 yards per game) and five touchdowns.

Waynesburg Yellow Jackets (3-2, 2-1 PAC)

put together his finest performance of the season on Saturday as he led the Yellow Jackets to season highs in points (55), passing yards (341) and total yards (539) ... He threw for 336 yards and three touchdowns on 19-of-30 passing ... He also rushed for 50 yards on nine carries and caught a touchdown pass on a trick play ... Freshman RB Betrand Ngampa rushed for a team-high 83 yards and two touchdowns on just seven carries ... Junior WR Jeff Young pulled in five catches for a seasonhigh 125 yards and a touchdown ... Junior CB Sean Hunt picked off his PAC-best fifth interception of the season ... Junior DT Darryl Moore, Jr. recorded two more tackles for losses, giving him 10 on the season.

Westminster **Titans** (1-4, 0-3 PAC)



Westminster could not

maintain an early 10-0 lead before losing a shootout to Bethany, 47-39, at home Saturday in PAC action ... Bethany snapped a 17-game losing streak at Westminster, as it won in New Wilmington for the first time since 1940 ... Westminster losrt its fourth straight game of the season, marking the team's longest losing streak since it lost seven straight in 1999 ... The Titans set a new season high with 380 vards of total offense, but it also surrendered a season-high 501 yards ... Junior QB Shawn Lehocky completed 12-of-24 passes for 209 yards and three TDs, while also throwing two interceptions ... Freshman RB Tyler Banks, led his team with eight carries for 62 yards and a touchdown ... Senior LB Tom Geraghty, the PAC's leading tackler, once again led the Titans with 16 stops.

Series Record: Thiel leads 37-29-1

Game Notes: Bethany will try to win its third straight game Saturday when the Bison travel to Thiel to face the Tomcats with a 1:30 p.m. kickoff ... The Bison snapped a six-game losing streak (2003-08) to the Tomcats with a 41-21 victory last year at Bison Stadium behind Eric Walker's 126 rushing yards and 4 TDs (3 rushing, 1 receiving) ... Thiel senior FS Bryan Villegas recorded a career-best 13 tackles in the loss to the Bison in 2009 ... Bethany has won more games against Thiel (29) than any other opponent in school history, although the Tomcats own a 37-29-1 advantage in the all-time series ... With nine rushing TDs this year, Walker needs three more to break his own single-season record (11) set last year and also has 2,272 career rushing yards , leaving him 97 away from passing Ernie Whitted (2,368) for 3rd place all-time at Bethany ... If the Bison win Saturday, the three-game win streak would be their longest since taking five straight to open the 2001 campaign and it would also be their third PAC triumph of the year, also the most since 2001 when they went 3-2 in league play.

Game Notes: The Bearcats will look to earn their first ever win against Thomas More, as the Saints own a 3-0 lead in the series, and have outscored Saint Vincent 118-37 in the three previous meetings ... Last season, SVC jumped out to a 7-0 lead over the Saints two minutes into the first quarter, but saw TMC score 40 unanswered points over the second and third quarters, as the Bearcats committed six SVC turnovers, including five interceptions ... With 347 receiving yards over the first five games, senior WR Tom Quirin is just 76 away from establishing a new SVC single-season record ... Thomas More is 12-1, including an 11-0 regular season record at The Bank of Kentucky Field since moving into The Bank in 2008.

Series Record: Westminster leads 36-29-3

Game Notes: Waynesburg will celebrate Homecoming by welcoming one of their most familiar opponents, the Westminster Titans, to John F. Wiley Stadium ... The Titans lead the all-time series 36-29-3, including last year's 49-42 overtime win in New Wilmington ... Prior to that, Waynesburg won six straight over the Titans ... Westminster junior LB Cory Meeker intercepted a Brad Dawson pass on the 1-yard line to clinch the win in overtime after Waynesburg faced a 3rd-and-goal situation on the Titan 8-yard line ... Westminster QB Shawn Lehocky became the first quarterback in team history to rush for over 100 yards as he rushed for 112 yards on 14 attempts and two touchdowns, while also throwing for a career-high 235 yards on 16-25 passing and three TDs after entering the game in the second quarter ... Westminster sixth-year head coach Jeff Hand compiled a four-year record of 24-17 as head coach at Waynesburg from 2001-04, including the school's only outright PAC championship and NCAA playoff appearance in 2003 with a 9-1 regular season record.

Game Notes: Grove City hosts one of its oldest rivals at Robert E. Thorn Field Saturday night for the Wolverines' highly-attended annual night contest ... The Wolverines won the previous meeting at Thorn Field October 11, 2008, 38-13 ... That day, GCC stormed out to a 31-6 halftime lead, including 21 points in the first eight minutes of the game ... Geneva defeated the Wolverines 34-17 a year ago in a game that featured 219 yards on 17 carries from Gerard Muschette. Muschette scored three second half touchdowns to put the game away for the Golden Tornadoes ... The Golden Tornadoes had to vacate their win following the season ... Grove City rolled to a 4-0 win in the first meeting between the teams in 1893 ... The Wolverines are 1-2 in night games at Thorn Field, having alternated wins and setbacks since the first night game in 2007.

Last year, Gino Rometo passed for 174 yards and three touchdowns in a 34-12 W&J victory at Bobcat Stadium ... Frostburg State is 1-4 this season, but three of the losses have come to teams (Wesley, Randolph-Macon, Alfred) currently ranked among the Top 25 teams in the nation.
