PAC Offensive Player of the Week

Tom McCafferty Wash. & Jeff. Senior WR 6-0, 195 Large, Pa. Thomas Jefferson H.S.



McCafferty hauled in

eight passes for 146 yards and a school single-game record four touchdowns (8, 10, 4, 8) as nationally-ranked W&J remained unbeaten with a 58-18 PAC win at Westminster. All four of his TD receptions came in the first half.

Also nominated was junior TB Brian Mercer of Grove City, senior QB Marc LaScola of Thiel, freshman QB Joey Zerhusen of Thomas More, freshman QB Kyle Kyper of Waynesburg, and sophomore TB/WR Chad Rosatelli of Westminster.

PAC Defensive Player of the Week

Mike Czerwien Waynesburg Senior DE 5-8, 225 Pittsburgh, Pa. North Hills H.S.



Czerwien recorded six tackles (five solo), including 3.5 tackles for losses for -24 yards and two sacks for -17 yards, along with two pass breakups in a 45-7 Yellow Jacket win over PAC foe Bethany. He broke the WU season record with 12 sacks through six games, which also leads the nation.

Also nominated was senior WLB **Bill Waugh** of Grove City, senior DE **Chris Lorber** of Thiel, senior CB **Terence Toone** of Thomas More, and junior LB **John Fahey** of Washington & Jefferson.

PAC Special Teams Player of the Week

Ryan Rylands Grove City Junior DE 6-3, 225 Pittsburgh, Pa. North Allegheny H.S.



Rylands deflected a potential gametying extra point kick with just 3:05 to play on Saturday, helping the Wolverines preserve a 14-13 Mercer County Cup victory over PAC rival Thiel.

Also nominated was jsophomore K **Kyle McBride** of Waynesburg, and senior P **Dusty Rhodes** of Westminster.



Bethany Bison



BC dropped its fourth straight game Saturday with a 45-7 loss to undefeated Wavnesburg ... The Bison offense was limited to 113 total

yards and five first downs ... Bethany's lone score came in the third quarter when QB Milton Joyner lofted a 31-yard scoring pass to WR Matt Cruse ... It was Joyner's eighth TD strike of the season, six going to Cruse ... It was also the 13th career TD reception for Cruse, tying him with J.D. Basile for fifth place all-time at Bethany ... Defensively. FS Nelson Mitzen made 10 tackles (his second straight game with 10+ stops), while SS Dante Fuscardo had nine stops ... Both safeties forced fumbles in the setback, which was BC's sixth consecutive to Waynesburg.

Saint Vincent Bearcats



The Bearcats lost their sixth straight, as Thomas More scored 27 fourth quarter points to win 44-17 ... SVC RB Logan Small tied the game 7-7 when he took his first

handoff of the day and ran 69 yards for the touchdown ... After a successful onside kick, QB Mike Speal found WR Mike Wampler for a 24-yard TD strike ... Matt Houston's 41vard field goal in the second guarter gave SVC a 17-10 lead ... Thomas More tied it late in the first half, and scored four touchdowns in the final quarter, all on the ground, to secure the win ... Small finished with a careerhigh 83 yards on 10 carries, while Speal added 53 yards on the ground ... LB Justin Blatnik had 10 tackles, including 2.5 TFL.

Washington & Jefferson Presidents



W&J racked up more than 50 points on Westminster for the third time in the past four seasons ... Junior QB Bobby Swallow tied his own school record with six TD passes (all in the first

half), while senior WR Tom McCafferty set a new school mark with four first-half TD receptions ... Swallow finished 29-of-37 for 357 yards against the nation's 10th-ranked defense ... McCafferty had eight catches for 146 yards ... The Titans cut the lead to 28-12 in the second guarter, but W&J sophomore Mike Sedunov changed the momentum by intercepting a two-point conversion pass and running it back 98 yards for two W&J points ... Junior LB David Gitlitz had a team-high 10 tackles.

Thiel Tomcats

Thiel dropped to 1-3 in the PAC with its 14-13 loss to Mercer County rival Grove City Saturday at Alumni Stadium ... GCC finished with a 212-204 edge in

total yards and a 30:53-29:07 edge in time of possession ... The Wolverines converted 7-of-18 third down opportunities while limiting the Tomcats to just 5-of-14 on thirddown conversions ... The GCC win was their first against the Tomcats since posting a 16-15 win at Alumni Stadium on Oct. 4, 2003 ... Senior QB Marc LaScola completed 9-of-14 passes for 85 yards and an interception and ran nine times for 30 yards ... The Tomcat defense registered five sacks on the day ... Senior DE Chris Lorber finished with five tackles and 2.0 sacks.

Waynesburg Yellow Jackets



The Yellow Jackets are off to their first 6-0 start since the 1967 campaign after a 45-7 victory over Bethany last week ... The WU defense was dominant in limiting the Bison to

only five first downs and 113 yards of total offense (24 rushing) ... Freshman RB Robert Heller finished with 130 yards and two touchdowns on 29 attempts, while senior RB Jamelle Price added two rushing scores ... Freshman QB Kyle Kyper completed 8of-13 attempts for 132 yards with two TDs and no interceptions ... Both of his TD passes were to freshman WR Rav Hightower II. who finished with three receptions for 51 yards ... Senior DE Mike Czerwien led the defense with six tackles.

Grove City Wolverines



Grove City reclaimed the Mercer County Cup by pulling out a 14-13 victory at Thiel Saturday ... The Wolverines now lead the Cup series 15-9

... Brian Mercer ran for both Grove City scores while churning out a career-high 92 rushing yards ... Defensively, GCC forced three turnovers, the first two leading directly to Wolverine touchdowns ... LB lan Minster intercepted a pass while Mercer forced a fumbled punt ... LB Bill Waugh recorded 11 total tackles, along with a forced fumble ... Rvan Rvlands tipped a potential game-tving extra point with 3:05 left, preserving the 14-13 lead ... Grove Citv's last two victories at Thiel have each been by one point ... GCC is plus-8 in turnovers this year.

Thomas More Saints



Freshman QB Joey Zerhusen accounted for four Thomas More touchdowns in a 44-17 win at Saint Vincent ... He threw for

three and had a career-long 67-yard TD run ... The Saints scored 27 fourth guarter points and 33 unanswered to post the victory ... Sophomore RB Cordario Collier rushed for over 100 yards for the fourth time this season, with 131 vards on 26 carries and a TD ... Freshman Robby Beckman recorded his first career score ... WRs Nick Dew and John Resch combined for 10 catches, 110 yards and three TDs ... Sophomore Andy Poe had a team-high 10 tackles, while seniors Nate Kapsal and Terence Toone and sophomore Eric Barimah had interceptions.


Westminster Titans

Game Notes: The Tomcats travel to Wiley Stadium Saturday to take on 6-0 Waynesburg ... The Yellow Jackets lead the all-time series despite the Tomcats winning three of the last five match ups ... Waynesburg is off to its first 6-0 start since the 1967 campaign ... The Yellow Jackets hold a 14-3 series advantage over Thiel since Waynesburg joined the PAC in 1990 ... The Yellow Jackets feature one of the nation's best defenses, limiting opponents to 199.3 total offense/game and 41.7 rushing yards/game ... Senior DE **Mike Czerwien** currently leads the defense with 45 tackles (31 solo) and ranks among the national leaders with 12 sacks and 18.5 TFL ... Freshman RB **Robert Heller** continues to key the Waynesburg offense with his 1,170 rushing yards and 18 total touchdowns (17 rushing), both totals continue to rank among the best in all NCAA divisions ... Thiel posted a come-from-behind 35-28 double overtime win at Wiley Stadium on Oct. 15, 2005, overcoming a 21-point first half Yellow Jacket advantage.

Game Notes: Washington & Jefferson and Grove City renew their rivalry for the 43rd time in history Saturday ... W&J has claimed eight-straight victories in the series since a 31-7 Wolverine win at Cameron Stadium in 1998 ... During W&J's eight-game win streak in the series, the average margin of victory has been 26.0 points per game ... **Ryan Mendel** rushed for 130 yards and five touchdowns in last year's 52-18 win at Cameron Stadium ... The W&J defense forced three turnovers in the game The Wolverines are in search of their third straight victory ... Grove City committed just three penalties for 11 yards at Thiel last week... GCC QB **Andrew DiDonato** ranks fourth in program history with 2,658 passing yards ... He needs 337 yards to pass **Duke Johncour** (1989-91) for first all-time at GCC ... DiDonato is the only Grove City quarterback to throw for over 1,000 yards in two different seasons ... **Ian Tobin** has 54 receptions this season, tying him for fourth in GCC single-season history.

Series Record: Westminster leads 34-9-2

Game Notes: The Titans travel to West Virginia to face the Bison for the 46th time in a PAC matchup ... Westminster has won the last five meetings against Bethany, including last year's 49-13 win, which marked the largest margin of victory for a Westminster team in nine years ... The Titans racked up a season-high 508 yards of total offense, bettering its previous high of 376 ... The Titans also limited the Bison to just 209 yards, a season-low for Westminster opponents during the season ... Titan QB Kevin Franz threwo for two scores and completed 18-of-28 passes for 212 yards ... FB Josh Kutzner led the team with a career-high 61 rushing yards on six carries including a 6-yard score and a 43-yard run ... WR Chad Rosatelli took a shovel pass from QB Brett Myers 80 yards for a TD, marking the longest pass play in school history ... The last BC triumph in the series came in 2001, when Bethany blanked the Titans 24-0 ... At his current rate, Bethany WR Matt Cruse is on pace for more than 860 receiving yards, which would be the most by a Bison player since Dan Reilly had 905 in 1989.
