PAC Offensive Player of the Week

RYAN MENDEL Wash. & Jeff. Senior RB 5-11, 190 Pittsburgh, Pa. Brentwood H.S.



Mendel rushed for 132 yards and three touchdowns (4,2,2) for the Presidents in a 50-7 PAC win over Westminster. The leading rusher in the PAC totaled 164 all-purpose yards on the day.

Also nominated was sophomore RB Dan Hess of Thiel, freshman RB Monty Collier of Thomas More, senior RB Ryan Abels of Waynesburg, and freshman RB Nick McKolosky of Westminster.

PAC Defensive Player of the Week

MARK CARLISLE Thomas More Senior LB 6-1, 230 Canal Winchester, Ohio Bloom Carroll H.S.



Carlisle posted a game-high 18 tackles (nine solo), including one tackle for loss, while adding a forced fumble and a fumble recovery for the Saints in a 13-7 non-conference win at Frostburg State. His forced fumble and recovery halted an FSU drive at the TMC 17.

Also nominated was junior WLB **Bill Waugh** of Grove City, junior DE **Robert Hughes** of Thiel, junior CB **Ryan Mullen** of Washington & Jefferson, junior LB **Dan Andreassi** of Waynesburg, and sophomore LB **Jordan Blinn** of Westminster.

PAC Special Teams Player of the Week

CHRIS WILLIS Thomas More Senior CB/PR 6-2, 180 Indianapolis, Ind. Broad Ripple H.S.



Willis returned a Frostburg State punt 59 yards for the game-winning touchdown in a 13-7 Thomas More road win over the Bobcats. He added three tackles and an interception on defense for the Saints.

Also nominated was senior P Henry Johnston of Grove City, senior PK Kyle Sidebotham of Washington & Jefferson, and senior P Dusty Rhodes of Westminster.

Bethany Bison

The Bison fell to 1-2 in the PAC with a 41-15 loss at Waynesburg Saturday ... K **Rob Miele**'s 22-yard field goal was BC's lone points in the first half, as the Yellow Jackets took a 20-3 lead at the half ... Bethany put two touchdowns on

the board in the fourth quarter, one on a 37-yard run by RB **Alex Bota** and the final score on a two-yard TD pass from **Brent Owens** to **T.J. Parker** ... Parker set two Bethany career receiving records and tied another ... His eight catches gives him 150 to pass **Zack Merz** (145) for the most in a career ... Parker (1,969) also had 76 receiving yards to move ahead of **Denny Williams** (1,959) for the most in Bethany history ... In addition, the 4th quarter TD reception was the 17th of Parker's career to match **Brian Dickman**'s career total during his career from 1991-94.



Thiel Tomcats

Sophomore TB **Dan Hess** rushed 32 times for 113 yards and a career-best three touchdowns Saturday as Thiel shut out Grove City 20-0 at Thorn Field...Thiel has won five of the last six against Grove City in the battle for the Mercer County Cup, including the last three straight ...

The Tomcats have outscored the Wolverines 74-9 over the last three contests, including a pair of shutouts in 2005 (30-0) and 2006 ... The Thiel defensive unit, led by junior DE's **Robert Hughes** and **Chris Lorber**, held Grove City to 119 total offensive yards and held the Wolverines to -4 rushing yards while registering four sacks ... Hughes posted four tackles, a pair of sacks and three tackles for loss, while Lorber added three tackles and two sacks.



Washington & Jefferson Presidents

W&J ran its win streak to five games with a 50-7 rout of Westminster on Saturday at Cameron Stadium ... Senior RB **Ryan Mendel** and sophomore QB **Bobby Swallow** combined for 154 rushing yards and five touchdowns ... Mendel gained 131 yards on 28 attempts and scored three times, while Swallow rushed for touchdowns of three

and 20 yards ... Swallow also completed 16-of-19 passes for 212 yards and one touchdown ... Junior WR **Tom McCafferty** led the receivers with four catches for 76 yards, including a 40-yard score ... W&J rushed for 199 yards and threw for 273, while limiting the Titans 246 total yards ... The Presidents averaged 7.4 yards per play.



Westminster Titans

Westminster fell to 1-5 and 0-3 in the PAC with a 50-7 loss at W&J ... The Titans had possession of the ball down 14-7 midway through the second quarter, but the Presidents (5-1, 2-0 PAC) were able to capitalize on a pair of Westminster turnovers, converting both into touchdowns and a 28-7 halftime lead ... W&J then put up 22 points in the second half ... The Presidents racked up 472 yards of total offense com-

pared to the Titans' 246 ... Westminster's lone score came on a nine-play, 80-yard march that culminated with freshman TE **Gary Hutsler** scoring his first career touchdown on a 2-yard pass from freshman QB **Kevin Franz** ... Freshman RB **Nick McKolosky** ran for a career-high 76 yards on eight touches ... Defensively, sophomore LB **Jordan Blinn** posted a career-high 18 tackles.



Grove City Wolverines

Thiel.retained possession of the Mercer County Cup Saturday with a 20-0 win at Grove City ... It was the 23rd meeting for the Mercer County Cup ... Grove City has won 14 of the 23 Cup games ... Thiel limited Grove City to

minus-4 rushing yards ... Junior SE **Jay Yanak** caught a teamhigh five passes for 63 yards ... Senior **Scott Fichter** returned from an injury that kept him out of the Bethany game and caught two passes against Thiel ... Junior WLB **Bill Waugh** posted a season-high 17 tackles, including 12 solo stops and two sacks ... The Wolverines held Thiel to just 2.7 yards per carry. ... Junior **Justin Fowler** tied a school record with his sixth blocked extra point of the season ... Fowler also had seven tackles, including three for losses.



Thomas More Saints

In the span of 1:24, the Thomas More Saints turned a 7-0 deficit in a 13-7 lead and the defense made it stand up as they posted a 13-7 non-confer-

ence road win at Frostburg State ... Freshman RB **Monty Collier** had his second straight 100-yard game as he rushed for 133 yards on 23 carries and one touchdown ... Senior CB **Chris Willis** returned a punt 59 yards for the eventual winning score ... Senior LB **Mark Carlisle** had a game-high 18 tackles, a forced and recovered fumble and tackle for loss ... The all-time series is now tied at one ... The TMC defense turned away two FSU drives that started in Saints' territory in the fourth quarter.



Waynesburg Yellow Jackets

Behind an astounding 354 team rushing yards, the Yellow Jackets cruised to a 41-15 Homecoming victory over Bethany Saturday at Wiley Stadium ... The 354 rushing yards is the sixth-highest single-game to-

tal in school history ... Waynesburg rushed for five touchdowns, including three by senior RB **Ryan Abels** ... Abels finished the game with 157 yards on 25 attempts, including three scores (4, 12, 24) in the first half ... With his three TDs, the senior set school records for career scoring (240) and career touchdowns (40) ... Fellow senior RB **Eric Daniels** led all players with 161 yards on 21 attempts and a touchdown ... Junior LB **Dan Andreassi** led the Yellow Jacket defense with 10 stops, including one of the five sacks by the Waynesburg defense.

Series Record: Westminster leads 32-9-3

Game Notes: Saturday's clash between the Bison and Titans will be the 45th time the programs have met on the gridiron ... Westminster has won four straight from Bethany, including a 34-13 triumph last season ... The last win for Bethany was a 24-0 blanking in 2001, which is the only Bison victory over the Titans since the series resumed in 2000 ... Although BC has dropped the three games in New Wilmington since 2000, all three have been close, with Westminster winning by an average of 6.3 points ... Now the Bethany career leader in receptions and receiving yards, the next record in sight for T.J. Parker is single-season receptions ... He currently leads the PAC with 46 catches (as well as 486 yards) and is on pace for 76 receptions, which would break Denny Williams' mark of 70, set in 1980 ... Westminster freshman QB Kevin Franz leads the PAC with 187.7 passing yards per game and 207.3 total yards per game ... The Titians needs to win the rest of their games this season to avoid become just the sixth losing team at Westminster in the last 55 years ... Their 1-5 start is the team's worst since starting the 1999 season 0-7.

All-Time Series Record: W&J leads 29-12

Game Notes: The Presidents and Wolverines match up for the 42nd time in history on Saturday with W&J leading the series by a 29-12 margin ... W&J owns a seven-game win streak versus the Wolverines and have outscored GCC on average by 25.1 points in those contests ... Grove City hung tough with the Presidents a year ago at Robert E. Thorn Field, but W&J finished the game with 30 unanswered points to earn the 37-14 win ... W&J passed for 335 yards in the victory ... Grove City closes its 2006 PAC schedule at Washington & Jefferson Saturday ... The Wolverines have lost nine straight games on the road ... Grove City is pursuing its first victory at W&J since Oct. 10, 1998 ... That day, Grove City charged through the Presidents for 442 rushing yards in a 31-7 win

All-Time Series Record: Waynesburg leads 20-8-1

Game Notes: Thiel and Waynesburg meet for the 30th time Saturday...The Tomcats are 3-1 in the last four meetings, including last season's 35-28 double-overtime win in Waynesburg ... Thiel is 16-14 all-time at Alumni Stadium ... MLB Jeff Wagner paced the Tomcats defensively with 11.5 tackles in last season's win at Wiley Stadium ... Waynesburg RB Ryan Abels is one of just two individuals who have rushed for at least 100 yards against the Tomcat defensive unit dating back to the start of the 2004 season (28 games) ... Abels rushed for 123 yards in last season's contest ... Also in the contest last year, Thiel QB Darrell Satterfield threw for 336 yards and three scores, while RB Steve Minton rushed for 88 yards and the game-winning touchdown ... Waynesburg RB Eric Daniels added 80 yards and a touchdown in the loss ... It is the first of two consecutive road contests for Waynesburg.

All-Time Series Record: Thomas More leads 1-0

Game Notes: Thomas More battles a non-conference opponent for the second consecutive week ... The home game for the Saints has been moved to nearby Dixie Heights High School in Erlanger, Ky., due to poor field conditions at TMC Stadium ... Thomas More won the only meeting between the two schools as Nate Berkley connected with Nick Partin on a two-point conversion to win the game in overtime ... The Saints are 2-1 on artificial turf this season ... Freshman RB Monty Collier is the 13th player in school history with multiple 100-yard games
