### PAC Co-Offensive Players of the Week

## SEAN BUGGEY Westminster College

Senior running back - 5-8, 185 Homer City, Pa./Homer-Center H.S.

Buggey rushed 27 times for a career-high 216 yards (8.0 avg.) and two touchdowns (2, career-long 54) for the Titans in a 34-13 PAC win at Bethany. He also threw a 21-yard halback option TD pass to QB **J.R. Barley**, giving him 237 yards of total offense.

Also nominated was junior WR T.J. Parker (Austintown, Ohio/Austintown Fitch H.S.) of Bethany, sophomore WB Ian Tobin (Titusville, Pa./Titusville H.S.) of Grove City, senior QB Darrell Satterfield (Orwell, Ohio/Grand Valley H.S.) of Thiel, senior QB Chris Edwards (Uniontown, Ohio/Green H.S.) of Washington & Jefferson, and junior RB Ryan Abels (Elizabeth, Pa./Elizabeth Forward H.S.) of Waynesburg.

## DARIOUS THOMPSON Thiel College

Junior free safety - 5-9, 185 Nassau, Bahamas/West Oak (Fla.) Academy

Thompson posted nine tackles (five solo, four assisted), one tackle for a loss, an interception and a forced fumble for the Tomcats, who remained unbeaten with a 35-28 double-overtime PAC win at Waynesburg.

Also nominated was senior LB Tim Goetz (Pittsburgh, Pa./Shaler Area H.S.) of Bethany, junior SS Clay Piper (Mineral Point, Pa./Central Cambria H.S.) of Grove City, senior LB Mark Carlisle (Canal Winchester, Ohio/Bloom Carroll H.S.) of Thomas More, senior CB Mike Wilmus (Carnegie, Pa./Carlynton H.S.) of Washington & Jefferson, senior DB Andy Tenney (Pittsburgh, Pa./Taylor Allderdice H.S.) of Waynesburg, and senior DB Reggie Williams (Suitland, Md./Central H.S.) of Westminster.

### PAC FOOTBALL CAPSULES



#### Bethany Bison

For the second straight week, Bethany scored on its opening possession, but couldn't build off that momentum in a 34-13 loss to Westminster ... An eight-play, 72-yard opening drive resulted in a 7-0 BC lead after **Brett Clough** 

scored on a 27-yard TD run ... The Titans then rolled off 34 straight points before the Bison put the final score of the day on the board late in the fourth quarter ... Junior QB **Brent Owens** tossed a seven-yard TD pass to junior WR **T.J. Parker** for his eighth scoring reception this season ... With the grab, Parker tied the Bethany single-season record for TD receptions, which was set by **Jared McKnight** in 1997 ... Parker had four catches for 59 yards, while junior RB **Joe Ford** ran for a team-high 50 yards ... The BC defense was paced by **Gary Gerba** and **Tim Goetz** with 11 tackles each.



#### Thiel Tomcats

Thiel needed two overtimes but managed to edge Waynesburg 35-28 Saturday ... Thiel snapped Waynesburg's 14-game home win streak at Wiley Stadium ... Having to battle back from a 21-point second quarter deficit, senior QB **Darrell Satterfield** had a career day in lead-

ing the Tomcats, finishing 24-of-44 passing with a season-high three TDs to go along with his single-game best 336 yards ... Senior WR **Brandon Chambers** had season highs in receptions (11), receiving yards (179) and TDs (2) while senior WR **Tom McEntire** added seven catches for 97 yards and a TD ... Junior MLB **Jeff Wagner** paced the defense with 11.5 tackles ... Junior FS **Darious Thompson** added seven tackles, an interception, and a forced fumble.



#### Washington & Jefferson Presidents

Senior QB **Chris Edwards** completed a schoolrecord 36 passes for 335 yards and two scores as W&J overcame a sluggish first half with 30 unanswered points to post a 37-14 victory at Grove City ... Edwards missed only eight pass attempts and completed 20 straight passes in the second and third quarters, just one shy of his NCAA Divi-

sion III record ... Senior WR **R.J. Soeder** also tied a W&J single-game record with 12 receptions for 111 yards, while senior WR/KR **Aaron Krepps** hauled in 11 passes for 84 yards ... Krepps also returned the game's first punt 55 yards for a score ... Senior RB **R.J. Zitzelsberger** scored a pair of touchdowns and junior RB **Ryan Mendel** gained a game-high 65 yards on 16 attempts ... Senior CB **Mike Wilmus** racked up eight tackles and picked off two GCC passes.



#### Westminster Titans

Westminster evened its record at 3-3 while posting its first PAC win of the season with a 34-13 win at Bethany ... Senior RB **Sean Buggey** rushed 27 times for a career-high 216 yards and two TDs (2, careerlong 54), while also throwing an 18-yard TD pass to junior QB **J.R. Barley** ... Barley was 11-of-15 passing for 126 yards, including a 17-yard TD pass to **Brett Ziegler** ... Senior K **Chris Castillo** set a new

school record with a 47-yard field goal in the second quarter, eclisping the old mark of 43 yards set by **Josh Simpson** in 2002 and tied by Castillo earlier this season ... Defensively, senior DB **Reggie Williams** posted a pair of interceptions ... Junior LB **Jason Fridley** posted a team-high nine tackles ... Freshman DE **Andrew Robison** had two sacks and a team-high 3.5 tackles for losses.



#### **Grove City Wolverines**

Grove City led W&J for much of the second quarter Saturday but the Presidents rallied in the second half for a 37-14 win ... The Wolverines took a 14-7 lead in the second quarter as junior SS Clay Piper returned an inter-

ception 96 yards for a touchdown ... It was Piper's first career interception ... Senior QB **Bradford Clark** tied the game at 7-7 in the first quarter with a two-yard TD run ... Sophomore WB **Ian Tobin** led Grove City with 53 yards rushing on eight attempts while junior SE **Scott Fichter** caught five passes ... Fichter also completed a 12-yard pass to junior TE **Dan Jeltes** ... Freshman QB **Stephen Mercer** completed 6 of 11 passes for 61 yards ... **Garret Choby** led Grove City with 11 total tackles.



#### Thomas More Saints

The Thomas More Saints had their four-game winning streak come to an end as the Frostburg State Bobcats

scored 23 unanswered second-half points to post a 23-6 win ... In the three games prior, the Saints had only allowed 17 points total ... It was the second loss of the season, all away from Presidents' Athletic Conference action ... Coming into the game with only two interceptions, TMC quarterbacks threw four against the Bobcats ... For the second straight game, the Saints had to turn to their backup quarterback as freshman **Trevor Stellman** rushed for 51 yards and threw for 62.

#### Waynesburg Yellow Jackets

Despite staking an early 21-0 lead, Waynesburg lost its Homecoming contest to Thiel, 35-28, in double overtime Saturday ... Both teams scored touchdowns on their first OT possession ... Thiel converted a touchdown on its second OT possession and then held Waynesburg out of the end zone ... The loss snapped the 14-game

home-winning streak by the Yellow Jackets, while the overtime contest was their first since the 2001 season ... Waynesburg finished with 197 rushing yards on 50 attempts against Thiel, which entered the contest ranked 14th in rushing defense in Division III ... Junior RB **Ryan Abels** posted his sixth-straight 100-yard game, rushing for 123 yards and a touchdown on 25 carries.

## Thiel (6-0, 4-0 PAC) at Westminster (3-3, 1-2 PAC)

Series Record: Westminster leads 41-15-7

Game Notes: Thiel and Westminster meet for the 64th time Saturday at Burry Stadium in New Wilmington ... Steve Minton ran for 157 yards and three first-half touchdowns in the Tomcats' 28-0 shutout win over the Titans last season at Alumni Stadium ... Shaun Jackson posted 3.5 tackles, one interception, one sack and one forced fumble for the Tomcats ... With last season's victory, the Tomcats snapped an 18-game losing streak to the Titans ... It was Thiel's first win over Westminster since posting a 20-7 win in 1950 ... The last meeting between the two teams at Burry Stadium was in 2003, which saw the Titans escape with a 14-13 victory after a 47-yard field goal attempt by the Tomcats hit the crossbar and fell short with 18 seconds to play ... Scott Froelich scored a pair of touchdowns for the Titans, while a blocked Thiel extra point by Tom Froelich proved to be the difference ... Darrell Satterfield has thrown for at least one touchdown in 16 straight games for the Tomcats ... Westminster is 0-3 at home and 3-0 on the road this season .... Thiel's 6-0 start to the 2005 season is their best since beginning 6-0 in 1969.

# Thomas More (4-2) at Anderson (4-2)

Series Record: Thomas More leads 4-0

**Game Notes:** Thomas More holds a 4-0 advantage in the series, including last season's overtime thriller in which the Saints overcame a 31-7 deficit to post a 45-38 win ... It was a breakout game for receiver **Chase Weber** as he hauled in three touchdowns from **Nate Berkley** ... For Thomas More, the game is their second consecutive away from PAC play, while the Ravens start a stretch of three straight home games.

Series Record: Waynesburg leads 23-14-5

Game Notes: Grove City closes out the home portion of the 2005 schedule Saturday against Waynesburg, continuing a series that began in 1903 ... GCC's 14 seniors will be recognized prior to the game ... The game features the PAC's top two rushing defenses, as foes are gaining just 2.4 yards per carry against Waynesburg; 2.6 against Grove City ... Grove City is the least penalized team in the PAC at 5.4 infractions per game whereas Waynesburg is the most-flagged team in the conference at 10.3 per game ... Neither team has a "red zone" passing touchdown ... In the last four meetings (all victories) against Grove City, Waynesburg has averaged over 36 points, including last season's 51-14 victory as the Yellow Jackets scored seven touchdowns on their first eight possessions ... WR Dominick Hunter finished that game with three scores, while two other Waynesburg players each caught a TD pass ... Hunter has caught at least one touchdown in each of his three career meetings against Grove City, while classmate Ivan Hawkins has 14 receptions for 182 yards and two scores against the Wolverines in his career ... In the Yellow Jackets' Thorn Field, they posted a 45-10 victory behind four TD passes ... RB Ryan Abels boasts 100-yard games in both meetings against Grove City, including 116 yards on 23 attempts last season.

## Bethany (1-6, 0-5 PAC) at Washington & Jefferson (6-1, 2-1 PAC)

Series Record: Washington & Jefferson leads 61-20

Game Notes: The 82nd meeting all-time between Bethany and Washington & Jefferson will happen under the lights Saturday in Washington, as the Presidents hold Senior Night ... The night contest is the second for W&J this after hosting Allegheny in week three ... The Presidents lead the series 61-20 and have taken 22 consecutive meetings against the Bison ... Bethany's last victory came in 1982 when BC claimed a 28-9 win at W&J ... In last year's matchup, the Presidents scored 35 first quarter points on their way to a 56-0 triumph ... RB R.J. Zitzelsberger scored three touchdowns and Chris Edwards threw three scores as W&J outgained the Bison 481-202 ... Since 1990, 11 of Washington & Jefferson's 15 victories over Bethany have been by 25 or more points ... Bethany has not scored a touchdown against the Presidents since 2002, as they only managed a field goal in a 38-3 loss two seasons ago ... The Bison are averaging just 82.9 yards on the ground for the year but have averaged 115.5 over the past two games ... The 81-game series with Bethany is the longest versus any opponent in Washington & Jefferson College history
