

Bethany and W&J each extended their respective win streaks to three games, as the Bison rolled past Thiel 41-7 and the Presidents topped nonleague foe Frostburg State 21-6 ... Waynesburg used a blocked extra point in the final minute to seal a 24-23 winover Westminster. while Grove City outslugged Geneva 13-7.

Muschette scored his 40th career TD against Grove City and is now just one shy of tying the school career TD record of 41, set by Melvin Cobbs ... W&J junior DE Frank Gigler posted seven tackles, including three TFLs and two sacks, vs. Frostburg State ... Bethany freshman WR Chris Collins posted a fumble recovery TD and also blocked a punt for another TD recovery at Thiel ... Thomas More freshman RB Domonique Havden rushed for 115 vards and a touchdown on 22 carries against Saint Vincent.


Saint Vincent Bearcats (1-5, 1-2 PAC)

Pell made his first start and completed 15-of-25 passes for 218 yards ... Zach Summy caught a season-high five passes ... Miller and Luke O'Hara had four catches each ... S Shawn Mercer made his first start and tallied nine stops ... Fourteen Wolverines have made their first collegiate start this year ... The Wolverines are now 2-2 at night at Thorn Field over the past four seasons.

Freshman QB Andrew Smith led the Tomcats in rushing with 47 yards on 14 carries while sophomore TB Justin Wazelle finished with 42 yards on eight carries.

Thomas More was ranked No. 9 in last week's AFCA Top-25 and is No. 10 in this week's D3football.com's Top-25 ... The Saints had two players reach the 100 yards rushing plateau as junior RB Kendall Owens had 117 vards on 15 carries and freshman RB Domonique Hayden had 115 yards and one TD on 22 carries ... Hayden also had one catch for a two-yard touchdown ... Sophomore QB Rob Kues was 12-of-24 passing for 137 yards and one TD and added 73 yards rushing on 15 carries ... Freshman RB Adam Rauch led the Saints in receiving with five catches for 60 yards ... Defensively, the Saints were led by sophomore DB Antonio Booker with eight tackles.

Washington & Jefferson Presidents (4-2, 3-1 PAC)



Washington & Jefferson recorded a third straight victory 21-6 over Frostburg State last

week ... Sophomore RB Tim McNerney had his second career-best game in a row, rushing 40 times for 173 yards and two touchdowns ... McNerney's 40 carries were the most by a W&J running back since Joey Nichols had 37 attempts versus Thiel in 2001 ... Junior DE Frank Gigler had seven tackles (three for loss) and two sacks ... Gigler led a defense that held Frostburg State to just 96 total yards ... W&J finished with commanding advantages in first downs (26-7), total yards (448-96) and time of possession (38:02-17:35) ... Washington & Jefferson hits the road for the first time in a month next Saturday as it travels to Reeves Field for a 7 p.m. game at Geneva.

Waynesburg Yellow Jackets (4-2, 3-1 PAC)



Bryan Gary's blocked extra point allowed Waynesburg to hold on for a 24-23 Homecoming win over Westminster this past Saturday ... The Jacket special teams proceeded to seal up the victory on the ensuing kickoff when Kyle Kyper snatched away an onside kick attempt by the Titans ... QB Brad Dawson passed for 178 yards and a touchdown on 17-of-29 passing, and also led the team in rushing with 37 yards on four carries ... Kyper led all Waynesburg receivers with 57 yards on five catches ... CB Sean Hunt intercepted his conference-leading sixth interception of the year, while junior DL Josh Malenke made two tackles for loss, one of which was a sack.

Westminster Titans (1-5, 0-4 PAC)



Westminster lost at Waynesburg Saturday, 24-23, after the Titans nearly came back from a late 24-14 deficit ... Junior K Trevor Young kicked a 35-yard field goal with 3:03 left and junior QB Shawn Lehocky threw a 14-yard TD pass to sophomore WR Geno Pasquinelli with 38 seconds to go, but Young's potential game-tying extra point was blocked by Waynesburg's Bryan Gary ... Westminster edged Waynesburg in total yards, 330-320, but a lopsided difference came on third down as the Titans were 1-of-12 on thirddown conversions compared to Wavnesburg at 6-of-14 ... Lehocky completed 14-of-25 passes for 165 yards with two TDs ... He also rushed 19 times for 69 yards ... Pasquinelli caught a career-high eight passes for 92 yards and a career-high two TDs as the Titans' leading receiver.

Game Notes: For the sixth time in seven weeks, the Bearcats will face an opponent with a record of .500 or better, taking on 3-3 Grove City... Last season in Grove City, the Wolverines won 41-20, as SVC was unable to recover from a 21-0 deficit heading into the fourth quarter ... GCC hits the road (2-1 this season) for the first time this month after an off week and consecutive home games ... It is Grove City's second game on grass in 2010 ... The Wolverines won at Lebanon Valley September 11 ... Grove City has won each of the first three meetings since Saint Vincent resumed football in 2007 ... The Wolverines earned a 27-12 win in 2008 in their only visit to Chuck Noll Field ... Overall, Grove City holds a 3-2 advantage in the series that dates back to 1932 ... The Bearcats' last win over Grove City came in 1960, a 14-9 triumph in the season finale... Grove City has used three different starting quarterbacks this year ... Two streaks will be on the line on Saturday, as the Bearcats have thrown at least one touchdown pass in 15 straight games, while senior WR Sheldon Loughner has made at least one reception in 22 straight games ... Six GCC receivers have caught at least 10 passes this year ... The Wolverines have outscored their opponents 29-21 in the fourth quarter this season.

Series Record: Thomas More leads 3-2

Game Notes: Bethany will host Thomas More Saturday with a chance to move into a tie for first place in the PAC ... The Saints lead the all-time series between the teams 3-2 and have won the last two meetings by scores of 42-12 in Bethany (2008) and 40-12 at home (2009) ... Thomas More has 2-1 record when the two teams have met in West Virginia ... The Bison have not upset a ranked team since beating #19 Carnegie Mellon 27-16 in the third game of the 2000 season ... Thomas More was ranked No. 9 in last week's AFCA Top-25 and is ranked No. 10 in this week's D3football.com Top-25 ... With 2,311 career rushing yards, Bison RB Eric Walker needs 58 yards to pass Ernie Whitted (2,368) for third place on the school's all-time rushing list ... Walker and Matt Grimard both have nine rushing TDs, this season, two away from tying Walker's single-season Bethany record of 11 set last year ... Bethany can clinch its first .500 season since going 6-3 in 2001 with a victory Saturday.

Game Notes: The first home night game in the 119-year history of Westminster football will take place Saturday when the Titans host Thiel at 7 p.m. ... The lights at Harold Burry Stadium were installed in 2008 but this will be the first time they will be on for a varsity football game ... The Titans are 3-4 in night games since 1997 ... The Titans also have a winning record of 8-7 in their last 15 PAC home games ... At five games, the Titans seek to break up the team's longest losing streak since 1999 by winning their first home and PAC game of the season ... Thiel has won four of the last six, however, including last year's 24-21 win in Greenville ... The games between the Tomcats and Titans have been played fairly close since 2007 with the average victory coming by a mere four points (WES 2-1) ... Westminster won two straight at home against Thiel in 2007 (20-16) and 2008 (16-10), while Thiel's 34-0 win in 2005 was the Tomcats only win in New Wilmington since 1951 (1-11) ... The rivalry is the third-longest for the Tomcats as it dates back to the 1894 season.

Game Notes: The Geneva/Washington & Jefferson series began in 1891 with a 26-9 W&J victory ... In all, the two schools have met 57 times with the Presidents holding a 36-19-2 advantage ... Last year, W&J defeated Geneva 31-10 for its fifth straight win over the Golden Tornadoes ... In fact, Geneva has not defeated the Presidents since a 19-0 victory at Reeves Field in 1983 ... Geneva was held to just 56 yards rushing and 136 total yards in last year's loss as the Presidents scored the game's final 24 points after Geneva held a 10-7 lead into the second quarter ... Since the 1983 contest, W&J has scored at least 24 points in the each of the five games with the GTs, including a 43-14 win two years ago in Beaver Falls ... QB Gino Rometo passed for 201 yards and two TDs and the W&J defense had seven sacks, led by Jacob Bloomhuff's 4.5.
