Grove City by completing 22-of-30 passes for school-record totals of 336 yards and four touchdowns (15, 1, 54, 30) in just his third career start. He now leads the PAC in completion percentage (63.5%) and TD passes (13 - tied for first).

PAC FOOTBALL 2010 - Week 9 Conference Notes

THREE TO GO: With three weeks to go in the I PAC football regular season, two-time defending champion Thomas More remains in the driver's seat ... The unbeaten Saints snapped bethany's three-game win streak with a 48-14 road victory ... Westminster won the first night home game in the program's 119year history, blanking Thiel 35-0 ... W&J needed an interception in the end zone with seconds to play to clinch a 22-16 win at Geneva ... Saint Vincent rolled past Grove City 42-17, while Waynesburg topped Frostburg State 41-7.

Muschette rushed for 212 yards vs. W&J to move into third place on the GT career rushing charts ... Saint Vincent's win over Grove City was the first victory for the Bearcats over the Wolverines in 50 years (last SVC win14-9 in 1960) ... Waynesburg sophomore DB Bryan Gary had two interceptions against Frostburg State, returning one for a 50-yard TD ... W&J sophomore RB Tim McNerney posted his third consecutive 100-vard rushing effort with 107 yards and two TDs in the win at Geneva.

NEWS & NOTES: Geneva senior RB Gerard | AROUND THE LEAGUE: Westminster's 35-0 win over Thiel was the Titans' first shutout victory since the 2003 season ... Thomas More sophomore QB Rob Kues threw for 180 yards and three TDs while also rushing for 60 yards and a score at Bethany ... The Bison were led in the loss by sophomore WR C.J. Thomas with seven receptions for 99 yards ... Craig Bicehouse kicked a season-long 40-yard field goal for Grove City at Saint Vincent ... Tim Taylor forced a fumble and had 3.5 tackles for losses for Thiel at Westminster.

The Saints closed out the win by scoring 21 unanswered points ... Bethany was limited to 39 yards rushing, while Grimard completed 21-of-38 through the air for 237 yards ... His top target was WR **C.J. Thomas**, who had seven receptions for 99 yards ... Defensively, LB **Kyle Arrington** had 11 tackles and a sack and SS **Adrian White** also made 11 stops, with 1.5 going for loss, and recovered a fumble ... CB **Jamaan Webb** was in on 10 stops and also blocked a field goal and an extra point.

Saint Vincent Bearcats (2-5, 2-2 PAC)



The Bearcats clicked on all cylinders to earn its second

PAC victory of the year, a 42-17 triumph over Grove City ... The Bearcats out-gained the Wolverines 435-241, led by QBAaron Smetanka, who established new school records for single-game passing yards (336) and touchdown passes (four), while becoming the first player in the team's modern history to amass 1,000 passing yards in a season ... A pair of wide receivers also entered the school record books, as Tom Quirin caught a team-record eight passes for 106 yards, and Sheldon Loughner six catches for a school-record three TDs ... Mike Kale ran for 77 yards and a score, while defensively, Anthony Johnson posted nine tackles ... Terry Kernan made four tackles and returned an interception 24 yards for a TD.

Geneva Saturday night at Reeves Field ... Senior DB **Craig Sedunov** sealed the victory with an interception in the end zone in the waning seconds ... Sedunov finished the day with 11 tackles, tying a season-high ... Sophomore RB **Tim McNerney** had his third-straight, 100yard performance finishing the day with 24 rushes for 107 yards and two touchdowns ... McNerney also led all Presidents receivers with three catches for 21 yards ... Senior QB **Gino Rometo** threw for 112 yards and a touchdown, a 16-yarder to sophomore **Ben Hoffer** early in the fourth quarter ... W&J hosts Grove City on Senior Day Saturday at Cameron Stadium at 2:00 p.m. Geneva Golden Tornadoes (3-5)

The defense was led by senior DB Marcus Lancaster, who had four tackles and had two interceptions that he returned a combined 72 yards for two TDs ... Freshman DB Jake Fishburn added eight tackles and sophomore LB Elijah Anglim had eight tackles, including two sacks and a forced fumble.

A few more points were scored in the most recent match-up with Geneva coming out on top of Thiel 37-13 in 2009 ... Game Notes: For the seventh time in eight weeks, the Bearcats will face an opponent with a .500 record or better, as they go against 5-2 Waynesburg, which enters the contest on a three-game win streak ... The Yellow Jackets are SVC's most frequent foe on the gridiron, as this week's game will be the 29th all-time meeting, with Waynesburg holding a 14-10-4 advantage. The 'Jackets have won each of the past six meetings, including all three meetings since the Bearcats reinstated their program in 2007, with the Bearcats' last win in the series a 19-7 triumph in week four of the 1960 campaign... The Bearcats will look to continue a pair of streaks this week, as the team has completed at least one touchdown pass in 17 straight games, while senior **Sheldon Loughner** has made one reception in 23 straight contests... Game Notes: Westminster travels to Kentucky for play Thomas More for the third time in the last four years ... Thomas More leads the all-time series 7-1 with the only Titan win coming at Thomas More, 23-13, in 2004 ... Westminster set a new school record in last year's 34-16 loss at home to the then-24th-ranked Saints ... The Titans completed a school-record 39 passes on 54 attempts for 307 yards, including senior QB **Kevin Franz** completing a career-high 37-for-49 with 297 yards and two touchdowns and two interceptions ... Ten different Titans caught passes vs. Thomas More last year, but none of which are starters this year and only two receptions in that game were by players that will be in uniform this week ... Westminster, coming off a 35-0 shutout over Thiel for its first shutout since 2003, has the top two tacklers in the PAC in senior LBs **Tom Geraghty** (11.1) and **Cory Meeker** (9.7) ... Thomas More has won all five meetings since joining the PAC in 2005 ... Thomas More was ranked No. 9 in last week's AFCA Top-25 and is ranked No. 10 in this week's D3football.com Top-25.
