PAC FOOTBALL 2009 - Week 9 Conference Notes

"GAME OF THE YEAR" SET: The 2009 "Game I of the Year" in the PAC is set for this Saturday, October 31, as unbeaten and nationallyranked conference co-leaders Thomas More and Washington & Jefferson square off at Cameron Stadium in Washington ... A win by the Saints would clinch TMC's second straight PAC title, while a President victory would leave W&J needing just one win in its final two games to clinch its 23rd PAC crown ... Last year, the Saints clinched their first-ever PAC grid title with a 35-29 home win over W&J.

TMC senior RB Cordario Collier rushed for 189 yards and two TDs in the 28-014 Saint win at Thiel ... W&J junior QB Steven Shumaker rushed for 80 yards and a TD and also passed for 65 yards in a 49-7 W&J victory at Westminster.








Bethany Bison (2-5, 1-4 PAC)

against Saint Vincent for the second time this season ... Playing Saint Vincent for the second time in this regular season, the Golden Tornadoes were again forced to rally to beat the winless Bearcats ... The Golden Tornadoes used three rushing touchdowns from Matt Dean from two, four and 48 yards out to spark the comeback ... Geneva also forced four Saint Vincent turnovers with two leading to touchdowns ... Rich Kolesar picked off his PAC leading fifth interception of the season and David Girardi was an efficient 20-of-25 for 169 yards through the air ... Geneva trailed 20-17 early in the fourth quarter before putting up the final 21 points of the game with three fourth quarter touchdowns.

Grove City Wolverines (2-5, 1-2 PAC)

Grove City returns to action this week after a bye week ... The

Wolverines host Waynesburg in their only 1:30 home kickoff in conference play ... The Wolverines have only had two of seven games start at 1:30 this year ... It will be the first time that Grove City has played on Halloween since 1998 ... Four Grove City players have been nominated for CoSIDA Academic All-District consideration: Vince Angelo, Andrew DiDonato, Tim Irwin and Mark Rossol.

Saint Vincent Bearcats (0-8)

The Bearcats were on the wrong end of a 38-20 deci-

sion in a back-and-forth affair at Geneva Saturday ... SVC led by scores of 13-7 and 20-17 in the second half, but saw the GT's scored 21 unanswered points over the final 13 minutes of regulation to earn the win ... Jake Smith completed 14 passes for 154 yards and two touchdowns - both to freshman TE Allen Neiderer – while also gaining a team-high 85 yards on the ground ... LB David Ribero led the SVC defense, making a game-high 11 tackles (including a sack) while also recovering a fumble ... Armando Fortunato made 10 stops, including 3.0 for losses and one sack, while Tom Quirin scored his second defensive touchdown of the season, picking a blocked punt out of the air and scampering 10 yards into the end zone in the third quarter.

Thiel **Tomcats** (2-5, 1-3 PAC)

No. 15 Thomas More's

Cordario Collier ran 18 yards for a touchdown with 2:27 remaining in regulation to set the 28-14 final score against a determined Thiel College team at Alumni Stadium on Saturday afternoon ... As usual, Thiel QB Willie Bova put on a show, completing 20-of-36 tosses for 227 yards ... Bova's 12th completion of the game was his 400th in a Tomcat uniform and a new Thiel career record ... Four of those completions were to freshman Tyler Dejong, who compiled a game-high 110 receiving yards ... Sophomore Ross Gargano capped the seven-play, 77-yard drive, with a two-yard dive for his fifth touchdown of the season ... Thiel was paced defensively by Sam Swartzfager, who made 10 tackles (seven solo) ... Junior William Haase racked up 2.5 tackles for a loss.

Thomas More Saints (7-0, 5-0 PAC)

The No. 15th-ranked

Saints defeated PAC foe Grove City, 28-14, on Saturday at Alumini Stadium in Greenville ... Senior RB Cordario Collier had 298 yards of total offense as he had 20 rushes for 189 yards and two touchdowns and also caught eight passes for 109 yards and one touchdown ... The Saints defense was led by freshman LB Nick Gramke, who had nine tackles ... Junior DL Justin Smith added three sacks and freshman DB Zach Autenreib had an interception ... Thomas More outgained Thiel 519 yards to 248 ... The Saints had 337 yards rushing and 182 yards passing, while holding the Tomcats to 21 yards rushing and 227 yards passing.

Washington & Jefferson **Presidents** (7-0, 3-0 PAC)



W&J, which is ranked seventh by the AFCA and 11th by D3Football.com, collected its

seventh-traight victory of the season Saturday, defeating Westminster 49-7 ... With the victory, the Presidents became the 18th team in school history to start out a season 7-0 ... W&J jumped on top of the Titans early, scoring 21 unanswered points in the first quarter ... W&J scored three defensive touchdowns ... The Presidents will meet their toughest test of 2009 Saturday when Thomas More, ranked 15th (AFCA) and 20th (D3football.com), travels to Washington for a 1:30 pm contest ... With a win against TMC, W&J would be in the driver's seat to claim its 23rd PAC title, needing to win just one of its final two games to clinch the title ... However, a TMC victory would crown the Saints as PAC champions.

Waynesburg Yellow Jackets (4-3, 1-2 PAC)



Waynesburg broke out of a two-game winning streak in a big way on Saturday by downing Bethany 52-13 ... The Yellow Jackets jumped out to a 45-0 lead in the third guarter and never looked back in front of the crowd at John F. Wiley Stadium ... Junior QB Brad Dawson put up superb numbers, despite working just a little more than two quarters ... He completed 10-of-14 passes for 184 yards and four touchdowns to no interceptions ... His offensive line also gave a superb performance by not allowing a sack and opening running lanes for a Jacket rushing attack that totaled a season-high 303 yards rushing ... Junior WR Ray Hightower II led all players with 103 yards and three touchdowns on just five catches.

Westminster **Titans** (3-5, 2-3 PAC)



Westminster lost to No.

7 W&J, 49-7, Saturday at Burry Stadium ... W&J scored three defensive touchdowns in the game, including a 36-yard interception return in the first quarter for a 21-0 lead, a 56yard interception return to make it 35-0, and a 16-yard third-quarter fumble return to give the Presidents a 42-0 advantage ... Westminster did not score until late in the third quarter when senior RB Nick McKolosky capped off a seven-play, 62-yard TD drive with a 3-yard plunge for his team-high sixth rushing score of the season ... McKolosky finished with 75 yards on 18 carries ... Westminster starting sophomore QB Shawn Lehocky was 10-of-31 passing for 123 yards and five sacks ... Senior reserve QB Kevin Franz finished 3-of-6 passing for 35 yards, two interceptions and a sack.

Series Record: Geneva leads 27-9-1

Game Notes: Geneva and Bethany will hook up at Reeves Field Saturday in the home finale for the Golden Tornadoes ... Geneva defeated Bethany 38-23 a year ago and has won four straight against the Bison dating back to 1973, when the Bison won 15-14 ... Last year, the GTs scored 25 second-quarter points to erase an early Bethany lead ... Matt Barge (143) and Gerard Muschette (139) led a Geneva ground game that rolled up 339 yards ... Eric Walker rushed for 103 yards and 1 TD, while Chad Smith threw for 306 and a pair of scores in the loss for Bethany ... With three games left in his Bison career, Matt Cruse, who already owns the school's career records for receiving yards (2,412) and TDs (24), has 164 receptions, leaving him 12 away from breaking the all-time Bethany record held by T.J. Parker (175) ... The all-time series started with a 3-0 Geneva victory in 1909 ... Geneva clinched another winning season with its victory over Saint Vincent ... It marks the 12th winning season for the Golden Tornadoes under head coach Geno DeMarco.

Series Record: Thiel leads 7-4

Game Notes: The Bearcats will make their first trip to Thiel since the return of football to Saint Vincent in 2006, as the two teams have met in Latrobe in each of the past two seasons ... Thiel has won both of those meetings by a combined 98-36 ... The Tomcats will attempt to snap its current two-game skid ... Thiel is 7-4 all-time against Saint Vincent in a series that dates back to the 1930 season ... In last season's matchup, Kevin Corona set SVC's modern-day record for passing yards (302), attempts (42), and completions (28), while the Bearcats rolled up 402 yards of total offense in a 36-22 losing effort ... Saint Vincent hasn't defeated Thiel since a 15-7 win over the Tomcats in the 1958 season opener.

Series Record: Washington & Jefferson leads 3-1

Game Notes: The 2009 PAC "Game of the Year" is set, as the unbeaten Saints travel to face the unbeaten Presidents on Halloween at Cameron Stadium ... Thomas More enters the game with a 7-0 overall record and a 5-0 PAC record and ranked No. 15 last week in the AFCA Top-25 and No. 20 in this week's <u>D3football.com</u> Top-25, while W&J enters the game with a 7-0 overall record and 3-0 record in the PAC and is ranked No. 7 in last week's AFCA Top-25 No. 11 in this week's <u>D3football.com</u> Top-25 ... With a win the Saints would clinch their second straight PAC Championship and be one of the first schools to qualify for the NCAA Division III Playoffs ... W&J leads the all-time series which takes back to 2005, 3-1, as it won the first three meetings TMC ended W&J's two-year run as conference champions with a 35-29 victory last year in Kentucky ... The Presidents held the edge in first downs (28-16) and time of possession (33:34-26:26), but the Saints' defense recorded eight sacks, including 3.5 by **Tyler Owens** ... Thomas More led 35-14 late in the third quarter before holding off W&J's comeback ... **Craig Besong** had 12 receptions for 117 yards and four TDs to lead W&J ... TMC rushed for 273 yards, while limiting the Presidents to 27 carries for 29 yards.

Waynesburg won at Grove City in 2007, 27-23, in the first night college game at Thorn Field ... Last year, Grove City rallied for a 23-19 win at Waynesburg ...
