DB David Abel made 14 tackles and LB Tom Kisner had 12 in the win.

The Bearcat Iosing streak reached six with a 42-19 home loss to Geneva Saturday ... The Golden Tornadoes jumped out to a 28-0 second guarter lead, before SVC scored 19 unanswered points to pull to within 28-19 with nine minutes left in the fourth quarter .. Geneva then put down the comeback, scoring a pair of late TDs ... Jairus Marlow led the SVC offense with 62 vards on 12 carries and two touchdowns, scoring on a six-yard run in the third quarter and on a 60-vard reception from QB Kevin Corona early in the fourth ... Joe Yezovich scored his first career TD on a four-yard pass from QB Jordan Cleary late in the third ... Defensively, Josh Diamond and Anthony Johnson each made 10 tackles, with Johnson posting 2.5 for a loss ... Alex Rowan finished with seven stops,

#### Thiel **Tomcats** (1-6, 1-3 PAC)

Thomas More trounced the Tomcats, 45-14, at The Bank of Kentucky Field last week ... The Saints scored on its opening possession with 6:43 remaining in the opening quarter ... Thiel responded just over two minutes later with Abe Addison dashing 57 yards for the touchdown, which, after a successful John Madeline PAT, tied the game at 7-7 ... The Saints reeled off the game's next 38 points ... Thiel, on the other hand, saw nine of its last 11 drives end with either a punt or a fumble ... Freshman Brice Mertiff scored the game's final TD on a threeyard run... Thiel was led on the ground by Addison, who ran for 83 yards on just four carries... Quarterback Willie Bova chipped in 42 yards rushing, in addition to 146 yards through the air ... Clint Walker paced Thiel on defense with 10 tackles.

## Thomas More Saints (6-1, 5-0 PAC)



Thomas More extended its win streak to six

games last week as it defeated Thiel, 45-14 ... The six-game win streak is the longest since 2001, when the Saints won their first 11 games and advanced to the second round of the NCAA Division III playoffs ... Freshman RB back Kendall Owens rushed the ball eight times for 95 yards and two touchdowns and added 41 vards receiving and 22 return vards for 158 all-purpose yards ... Junior QB Trevor Stellman was 9-of-11 passing for 129 yards and two TDs and added eight rushes for 49 yards ... Junior RB Cordario Collier had 92 yards rushing with two TDs on 12 carries ... Defensively, the Saints were led by sophomore linebacker Tyler Owens, who had five tackles (3 solo, 2 assisted), including three sacks for a loss of 21 yards.

Senior QB Bobby Swallow passed for 290 yards and two scores, while senior WR David Ravida caught eight passes for 106 yards and one score ... W&J racked up 555 total yards and averaged 7.1 yards per play ... Senior LB David Gitlitz led the defense with eight tackles ... He is currently tied for fifth place on the school's all-time tackle list ... W&J has won 50 of its last 52 PAC contests.

#### Waynesburg Yellow Jackets (4-3, 1-2 PAC)



The Yellow Jackets are coming off of a 31-24 loss at Bethany Saturday that snapped a six-game win streak for Waynesburg over the Bison ... Waynesburg gave up the game-winning score with just 1:29 left in the contest ... The Jackets had two more chances to tie the game or snatch the win, but both tries ended in turnovers ... Though it came in a loss, freshman RB Justin Falcon had a breakout day, carrying the ball with 143 yards rushing and a touchdown on 38 carries ... Sophomore WR Ray Hightower II recorded his third 100-yard receiving day of the year with five catches for 111 yards and a touchdown ... On defense, senior DL D.J. DeWitt led the team with eight tackles, three of them being solo stops, four tackles for loss and three sacks.

#### Westminster **Titans** (4-4, 2-3 PAC)

ball team lost to No. 8-ranked Washington & Jefferson, 34-7, Saturday for its first night game since 2001 ... The Titans' record is now 4-4 overall and 2-3 in the PAC ... Junior QB Kevin Franz became Westminster's all-time leading passer as he threw for 237 yards on 23-of-44 passing with one touchdown and one interception ... Franz now has 5,846 career passing yards ... Junior WR Chad Rosatelli hauled in Franz's only touchdown pass in the third quarter to cut W&J's deficit to 27-7 ... Rosatelli caught six catches for 85 yards ... Junior WR Jon Gubish also caught a team-high eight passes for 75 yards ... Senior LB Jordan Blinn and freshman S Tony Andreassi each posted their first career interceptions for the Titans ... Sophomore LB Jake Brown led Westminster with 11 tackles.

Series Record: Geneva leads 26-7-1

Game Notes: Geneva and Bethany met for the first time since 1983 last year with the Golden Tornadoes coming out on top by the score of 28-13 in Beaver Falls ... In that victory, Matt Dean rushed for 102 yards for the GTs on just nine carries ... Taylor McNeil (21) and Matt Cruse (11) caught scoring passes from Milton Joyner, but Geneva's Luke Duriancik scored on a 6-yard run with 1:37 to play to clinch the victory ... Bethany CB Brandon Zeman made 12 tackles in the loss ... Geneva posted a 439-284 advantage in total yards, including a 339-67 margin in rushing yards ... Bethany will be trying for their first win over Geneva since 1973 Saturday at Bison Stadium ... That season, BC nipped the Golden Tornadoes 15-14, but Geneva has won the last three meetings between the schools ... The Bison have jumped to +5 on the season in turnover margin after forcing 13 takeaways in the past three contests ... Matt Cruse moved into 4th place Saturday on the all-time Bethany reception list (124) and is three away from taking over third place ... With 1,849 career receiving yards, he is also 11 shy of fourth place overall in the category.

The Yellow Jackets and Wolverines meet up for the 46<sup>th</sup> time in a series that stretches back to 1903 ... In 2007, one of the most exciting chapters of the rivalry was written when the Jackets snatched a 27-23 victory away from Grove City with just 13 seconds left in the first-ever night college football contest at GCC's Thorn Field ... The Wolverines are in pursuit of their first win at Waynesburg since 2000 ... Grove City has won its last two games when coming off a week off (2000, 2007) ... The Wolverines lead the conference in turnover margin (plus-7) and takeaways (20) ... Safety **Zach Fulmer** leads the PAC with four interceptions while nose tackle **Jarred Frawley** leads the PAC with three forced fumbles ... "Mike" linebacker **Adam Eichler** leads the PAC with 80 total tackles ... Waynesburg leads the all-time series, 25-15-5, including a 12-6 edge since joining the conference in 1990.

Game Notes: Saint Vincent will close out its home portion of the schedule with a 1:30 p.m. contest against Thiel College. The two teams previously met in the 2007 season finale, with Thiel winning 62-14 ... The Bearcats jumped out to an early 7-0 lead on an 80-yard TD reception by Sheldon Loughner, but the Tomcats then roared, scoring four second quarter touchdowns en-route to the win ... Thiel RB Dan Hess had a monster day, scoring four touchdowns and rushing for 327 yards ... The Tomcats rolled up 709 yards of total offense on 85 plays against the Bearcats ... Bearcat QB Mike Speal, now a linebacker at SVC, completed 11 passes for a career-high 212 yards ... It will be the 12<sup>th</sup> meeting ever between the two teams on the gridiron, with Thiel currently holding a 6-5 edge in the matchup ... SVC last defeated the Tomcats in the 1958 season-opener, winning by a 15-7 count.

Game Notes: The 2008 PAC "Game of the Year" takes place in Kentucky, as sole possession of first place in the PAC will be on the line when Washington & Jefferson faces Thomas More on the gridiron ... The Saints will clinch the league title and the PAC's automatic bid to the NCAA Division III playoffs for TMC, while a victory by the Presidents will put W&J in position to clinch the PAC crown and NCAA playoff automatic bid with a win in one of its final two contests this season ... Two of the three previous games have been in Kentucky with W&J winning 32-14 in 2005 and 42-0 last season ... W&J also earned a 21-12 decision at Cameron Stadium in 2006 ... Curt Jones rushed for 153 yards and two scores last season versus the Saints ... Bobby Swallow has thrown for 399 yards and five TDs (0 INTs) in his two starts versus TMC ... David Gitlitz has amassed 18 tackles (3.0 for a loss) and one interception in the past three years versus TMC ... Thomas More is the top-ranked scoring defense in the PAC as it has only given up 17.7 points per game and has the second ranked scoring offense as it averages 33.6 points per game ... W&J is the top-ranked scoring offense in the PAC as it scores 47.1 points per game and has the second ranked scoring defense as it only gives up 20.3 points per game.
