PAC Offensive Player of the Week

CHRIS EDWARDS Washington & Jefferson College

Junior quarterback - 6-3, 215 Uniontown, Ohio/Green H.S.

Edwards completed 16-of-21 passes for career-high totals of 319 yards and five touchdowns, leading the Presidents to a 35-30 win over league rival Waynesburg which clinched the 2004 PAC title for Washington & Jefferson.

Also nominated was sophomore WR **T.J. Parker** (Austintown, Ohio/Austintown Fitch H.S.) of Bethany, junior WR **Brandon Chambers** (Farrell, Pa./Farrell H.S.) of Thiel, senior QB **Jeff Dumm** (Charleroi, Pa./Charleroi H.S.) of Waynesburg, and senior RB **Scott Froelich** (Cuyahoga Falls, Ohio/Cuyahoga Falls H.S.) of Westminster.

PAC Defensive Player of the Week

SHAUN JACKSON Thiel College

Junior strong safety - 6-1, 180 Chardon, Ohio/Harvey H.S.

Jackson posted a pair of interceptions and 4.5 tackles for the Tomcats, who posted their fourth consecutive win by defeating NAIA Ohio Dominican 32-6 Saturday. He led a defense which allowed just 238 total yards and has not allowed a touchdown in the last eight quarters.

Also nominated was senior LB **Mike Skrinjar** (Wellsville, Ohio/Southern Local H.S.) of Bethany, junior LB **Ben Szelong** (Gibsonia, Pa./Hampton H.S.) of Grove City, junior CB **Mike Wilmus** of W&J, freshman DE **Mike Czerwein** (Pittsburgh, Pa./North Hills H.S.) of Waynesburg; and senior DB **Clint DeLuca** (Beaver Falls, Pa./Blackhawk H.S.) of Westminster.

PAC FOOTBALL NOTES

Bethany Bison

Chicago RB Frank Brown ran for 157 yards and three touchdowns to lead the Maroons to a 31-7 victory over Bethany in Chicago ... The Maroons held the Bison to just 50 yards rushing in the victory ... Brown started the scoring with a threevard touchdown run with 9:04 left in the first quarter ... The score remained 7-0 until the Bison answered with a Nazih Banna to T.J. Parker 29-yard touchdown strike with 9:17 remaining in the first half, cappingt a six-play, 50-yard drive ... Banna completed 15-of-32 passes for 172 yards ... Parker had his best receiving day of the season, grabbing five passes for 115 vards and a touchdown ... Joe Slezak led the defense with eight tackles, including 1.5 for a loss and half a sack.

Wash. & Jeff. Presidents

No. 5 Washington & Jefferson reclaimed the PAC Championship after holding off Waynesburg, 35-30, Saturday in front of a capacity crowd at Cameron Stadium ... Junior QB Chris Edwards, the nation's No. 1 ranked quarterback, led the Presidents by completing 16-of-21 passes for a career-high 319 yards and five TDs ... Three of the scoring passes went to junior WR Aaron Krepps, who finished with 58 yards on five catches ... Senior WR Jacob Shields also had a big day with five receptions for 117 yards and two TDs ... The defense was led by Mike Wilmus with 15 tackles (13 solo) and two interceptions, including one in his own end zone ... The Yellow Jackets held a 507-385 yardage advantage, but committed five turnovers.

Grove City Wolverines

Grove City fell to 3-6 Saturday as six turnovers doomed the Wolverines ... Grove City finished with eight first downs and 110 total yards ... Defensively, the Wolverines limited Alfred to just 3.3 yards per play and forced nine punts ... Mike Choby racked up nine tackles while fellow LBs Mike Prioletti and Ben Szelong each had eight stops ... Brandon McGlothlin caught three passes. while TE Dan Jeltes caught a careerhigh two passes ... Greg Moore went 9-for-14 for 59 yards in relief of Bradford Clark ... Steve Weary blocked a field goal, the second straight week he has blocked a kick ... Chris Schwamberger returned the kick to the Alfred 18, but GCC missed a field goal on the drive.

Waynesburg Yellow Jackets

A second-half comeback was not enough for Waynesburg to continue its hopes for a share of the conference championship ... The Yellow Jackets suffered a 35-30 loss to nationallyranked W&J after trailing by 18 points at halftime ... Senior QB Jeff Dumm threw for a season-high 356 yards on 33-of-41 attemptsand three touchdowns (32, 18, 20) against the Presidents ... The 356 yards ranks seventh in school history for passing yards in a game, while the 33 completions breaks the previous school record ... Dumm connected with junior WR Dominick Hunter 13 times for 118 yards and two scores (32, 18) ... The 13 receptions are a career high for Hunter, who now ranks fourth at Waynesburg with 116 career receptions.

Thiel Tomcats

Junior WR Brandon Chambers set a pair of season records Saturday as the Tomcats topped visiting Ohio Dominican 32-6 at Alumni Stadium ... Chambers now holds single season marks in both receptions (60) and touchdowns (12) and is currently in second place in receiving yardage with 883 ... Offensively, Thiel (7-2) rolled up season-highs in first downs (24), total yardage (458) and total plays (84), averaging 5.5 yards per snap ... The freshman tailback tandem of Brett Helman and Steve Minton combined for 191 rushing yards on 48 carries (Helman 21-77; Minton 27-114) ... Senior QB Darrell Satterfield completed 21-of-32 passes for 260 yards and two touchdowns.

Westminster Titans

The Titans evened their record at 4-4 after a 25-13 non-conference win at Frostburg State ... Senior RB Scott Froelich rushed 30 times for 181 yards and accounted for all four touchdowns (two rushing, one receiving, one passing) ... His 61-yard TD burst with 4:45 to play helped seal the win ... Senior QB Joe Getsy completed 5-of-8 passes for 56 yards and a score, while also rushing for 23 yards and catching a 25-yard TD pass from Froelich ... The WC defense forced FSU into 13-of-35 passing with a pair of interceptions by senior Clint DeLuca and sophomore Joey Tissler ... Senior LB Tom Kaminsky led the squad with 10 tackles, followed by DeLuca with nine stops and a pair of pass breakups.

Series Record: Westminster leads 45-31-8

Game Notes: Local PAC rivals Westminster and Grove City renew their Route 208 rivalry, as the Titans look for their seventh consecutive win in the series ... The last win for the Wolverines over the Titans on the gridiron was a 12-7 decision in 1979 ... Last year in New Wilmington, Westminster rolled to a 49-6 lead after three quarters en route to a 49-20 victory ... Westminster RB Scott Froelich rushed 26 times for 204 yards and four touchdowns against GCC, including a career-long 80-yard TD run on the Titans' first offensive play from scrimmage ... Grove City QB Sam Mowrey threw for 167 yards and ran for 87 more in last year's game ... Mike Choby had 16 tackles for Grove City while Mike Prioletti added 15 stops ... The last meeting between the two teams at Thorn Field in Grove City was in 2002, with Westminster winning 19-7 behind 37 carries for 178 yards by Froelich ... In that game at GCC, the Titan defense held the Wolverines to just 12 plays and 23 total yards in the second half ... Saturday is the 200th career game as Grove City head coach for Chris Smith ... Grove City is 0-3 against Westminster since the Titans became a full Division III member.

Series Record: Carnegie Mellon leads 29-7

Game Notes: CMU has won the last two meetings against Bethany in 2003 and 2002 by scores of 38-24 and 31-9 ... The last win for Bethany in the series came in 2000 (27-16) ... The Tartans have won nine of the last 10 meetings dating back to 1986 ... CMU is 4-4 after falling at home to Case Western Reserve, 24-14, on Saturday ... Bethany and CMU have faced three common opponents: Chicago, Grove City and Franklin and Marshall ... CMU has gone 2-1 against those teams, defeating Chicago (17-7) and F&M (31-14) and falling to GCC (16-14) ... Bethany has gone 0-3 against those teams, falling to F&M (35-7), Grove City (63-6) and Chicago (31-7).

The Bears enter on a four-game winning streak after their 21-16 victory over Carnegie Mellon this past Saturday ... Washington University Head Coach **Larry Kindbom** recently won his 100th game for the Bears ... W&J looks to wrap up an undefeated regular season with a victory and home game in the NCAA playoffs.

Series Record: Buffalo State leads 2-0

Game Notes: Thiel will look to pick up its school-record eighth win of the season Saturday when it travels to Buffalo to take on the Bengals of Buffalo State College ... In just two meetings between the schools Buffalo State has claimed victories in each, outscoring the Tomcats 87-2 ... Buffalo State (3-5) has won two straight and are coming off of a 26-0 victory at Plymouth State on Oct. 30 ... Freshman TB Steve Minton has accumulated 869 rushing yards so far this season and needs 39 to become the school's single season rushing leader ... The Tomcats dropped NAIA newcomer Ohio Dominican to 0-8 last week (32-6) ... Thiel has gone eight quarters without allowing a touchdown.

Series Record: Waynesburg leads 24-11-1

Game Notes: For the third straight season Waynesburg will face Frostburg State in the final non-conference game of the season ... It will be the 37th meeting between the two schools with the series dating back to 1961 ... The Jackets have won six of the last ten games, including last season's 28-7 victory at Frostburg ... RBs Ryan Abels and Eric Daniels each scored two rushing TDs and finished with 117 and 57 rushing yards, respectively .. The game also marked the first start for DB Andy Tenney who totaled 10 tackles and a forced fumble en route to PAC Defensive Player of the Week honors ... Waynesburg has won its last 11 meetings at Wiley Stadium dating back to 9/02.
