







Bethany Bison (4-5, 3-3PAC)

gized to face its long time arch rival Westminster on Saturday at Reeves Field ... The Golden Tornadoes are trying to avoid only their fourth losing season under head coach **Geno DeMarco** ... A victory would secure a 5-5 record and would help avoid a winless season on its home turf ... Senior running back **Gerard Muschette** enters the final game of his career needing 109 yards to become the school's all-time leading rusher ... Muschette broke the single game rushing record last week with 302 yards in Geneva's victory over Thiel College ... He also shattered the career touchdown record with 44 for his career on College Hill.

Grove City Wolverines (4-5, 2-4 PAC)

Grove City forced four turnovers and recorded three sacks

in a 21-7 victory over Bethany ... Linebacker Jason Ferguson intercepted two passes in the fourth quarter for the Wolverines while Chris Korn also picked off a pass ... Mark Rossol forced a Fumble at the 1 that Tim Irwin recovered in the end zone for a touchback in the fourth quarter ... Rossol had a game-high 12 tackles ... Jarred Frawley recorded 1.5 sacks and Marc Shamley had a sack ... Quarterback Brian Pell completed 15 of 21 passes for 193 yards and two touchdown ... Luke O'Hara hauled in six passes for 73 yards and a touchdown ... Will McCoy also had a touchdown catch ... Blaine Miller ran for 75 yards and a touchdown ... The Wolverines held possession for 32:38, including 18:07 in the second half.

Saint Vincent Bearcats (3-6, 3-3 PAC)

Saint Vincent picked up its first win over Westminster in 61 years with a 21-14 triumph ... Westminster jumped out to a 14-0 first guarter lead, before the Bearcats came back for the win, using a strong run game and an opportunistic defense ... Mike Kale ran for a game-high and schoolrecord 157 yards, while he also completed a 29-yard touchdown pass to Sheldon Loughner, who caught a pair of scores on the afternoon ... The Bearcats forced four turnovers, with Quillian Reid and Josh Diamond each posting interceptions, and Reid and Rob James each recovering fumbles ... Armando Fortunato made 14 tackles on the day, including 12 solo, while Jeff Graham made four stops, including 2.5 TFLs and one sack.

Thiel Tomcats (0-9, 0-6 PAC)

On their last home game at Alumni Stadium, Saturday, the Thiel Tomcats fell to visiting Washington & Jefferson College, 47-14 ... After being down 34-0 in the third quarter, freshman quarterback Jared Soell connected with fellow freshman Nate Houpt to put the Tomcats on the scoreboard with a touchdown ... Freshman Berend Grube's extra point was a success to make the score 34-7 ... Then in the fourth guarter, freshman quarterback Jared Soell found Derrell McCaleb for another Tomcat touchdown ... Soell finished the game with 67 rushing yards and 248 in the air, while freshman Kyle Turkali caught five passes for 90 yards ... The Tomcat defense was led by junior Ryan Dawes with 11 stops and senior Bobby Shew with eight of his own.

Thomas More Saints (9-0, 7-0 PAC)

The Saints clinched their third straight outright

PAC Championship ... QB Rob Kues led the offense as he was 21-of-32 passing for 275 yards and two touchdowns and had 17 rushes for 70 yards ... RB Domonique Hayden had 23 carries for 31 yards, WR Mercier Doucette finished the day with four catches for 93 yards and two touchdowns and RB Kendall Owens had five catches for 65 vards ... They held Waynesburg to 248 yards, including only 33 yards rushing ... DB Antonio Booker led the defense with 10 tackles ... DL Tyler Owens had eight tackles, including two and a half for a loss and one sack. DB Marcus Lancaster had seven tackles, including two for a loss, one sack and an interception and LB Nick Gramke finished the day with six tackles ... Punter Aaron Walter had six punts for 211 yards.

Washington & Jefferson Presidents (7-2, 5-1 PAC)



Washington & Jefferson won its sixth consecutive game with a 47-14 victory at Thiel

Saturday ... Senior wide receiver Jordan Roycroft caught eight passes for 143 yards and two touchdowns in the first half ... Sophomore RB Tim McNerney rushed 20 times for a game-high 75 yards and two scores ... Senior QB Gino Rometo completed 15-of-20 for 206 yards and two touchdowns through the air and also rushed for a score ... Senior free safety Craig Sedunov notched eight tackles and is now two shy of becoming the fourth player in school history with 300 for his career ... Junior defensive lineman Frank Gigler had six tackles and two sacks.

Waynesburg Yellow Jackets (6-3, 4-2 PAC)



The Yellow Jackets gave ninth-ranked Thomas More all it could handle in Saturday's 14-10 loss that clinched a third-straight PAC title for the Saints ... Freshman **Dominic Moore**'s one-yard touchdown run, his ninth of the season, put the Jackets ahead 10-7 with just under seven minutes to go in the contest ... Sophomore defensive back **Bryan Gary** led a valiant defensive effort from Waynesburg with a game-high 13 tackles, including 10 solo stops, 3.0 tackles for loss and a forced fumble.

Westminster Titans (2-7, 1-6 PAC)



Despite having a 14-0 first-guarter lead and a 405-272 advantage in yards, Westminster lost to Saint Vincent, 21-14 ... QB Shawn Lehocky completed 18 of 38 passes for a career-high 256 yards with two touchdowns and two interceptions ... RB John Proano rushed 19 times for 110 yards for only his second 100-yard rushing game of his career ... WR Nick Sorice caught two first-quarter touchdown passes from 30 and 10 yards ... WR Geno Pasquinelli led the Titans with six catches for 84 yards ... The Titans turned the ball over four times in the game and the Bearcats' final two touchdowns were set up by Westminster turnovers ... LB Tom Geraghty led the Titans with 10 stops, followed by sophomore DE Aaron Nauer with nine tackles including one sack, a forced fumble, and four tackles for a loss of 10 yards.

It has been a one-sided series to this point, as the Bison have won the first 3 meetings ... **Eric Walker** moved into 3rd place at Bethany in career rushing attempts (515) and rushing yards (2,390) in last week's game at Grove City ...
