

Grove City closed its home schedule Saturday with a 38-

31 win over longtime rival Westminster ... Andrew DiDonato fired a 21-yard TD pass to Luke O'Hara in the back of the end zone with 13 seconds left to give Grove City the win ... O'Hara tied a single-game GCC record with three touchdown catches in one game ... DiDonato tied the school record for 16 touchdown passes in one season ... TB Blaine Miller set a Grove City record for receiving vards by a back with 167 ... He also ran for 59 yards and two touchdowns ... The 167 receiving yards are the fourth-most in program history ... His 226 scrimmage yards are the most for a Grove City player since R.J. Bowers ran for 226 against Alfred in 2000 ... Grove City is 10-1 in its last 11 Senior Day games ... DiDonato had 402 yards of total offense.

WR Brendan Taylor hauled in a Thiel record 17 passes for 216 yards... Taylor also became the third Tomcat to earn 1,000 receiving yards in a season... Senior LB Sam Swartzfager had his best game of the season, recording 12 tackles (nine solo) including two sacks and a tackle-for-loss for a combined 25-loss... In Thiel's top play of the day, Bova and Taylor teamed up for a 70-yard TD pass ... RB Ross Gargano scored his team-

Defensively, the Saints were led by senior LB Brad Steinmetz, who had a gamehigh 14 tackles, including 11 solo and two and a half for a loss ... Junior DB Aaron Monk added eight tackles and a fumble recovery and senior LB Brandon Kohrs had seven tackles and one fumble recovery.

W&J's defense surrendered just 58 yards on the ground and forced six turnovers (4 interceptions, 2 fumbles) in the victory ... Senior WR Craig Besong, who leads the team and the PAC with eight TD receptions, hauled in seven catches for 112 yards and two scores ... Junior DB Craig Sedunov leads the team in tackles (56) and interceptions (4) and collected two interceptions and six stops against the Bison ... Washington & Jefferson hosts Waynesburg Saturday and needs a victory to keep its NCAA at-large playoff hopes alive.

Westminster senior RB Nick McKolosky led the Titans with 107 rushing yards on 24 totes and two touchdowns ... The Titans outrushed the Wolverines 185-105, but Grove City held a 498-282 total yard advantage thanks to 393 passing yards to Westminster's 97 ... Series Record: Bethany leads 2-0

Game Notes: The 3rd Annual Green Game makes its first-ever appearance in Latrobe this Saturday when Bethany travels to Saint Vincent for a 1 p.m. kickoff ... The Bearcats will host Bethany for the first time in team history, as the two teams have met in West Virginia in each of the past two years ... Bethany has defeated the Bearcats handily in both previous meetings, winning 44-14 last season - which was highlighted by Taylor McNeil catching 10 passes for a BC-record 279 yards and 2 TDs - and 66-7 in 2007 ... In last year's meeting, SVC running back Jairus Marlow established the team's modern record, with 130 rushing yards, averaging 10.0 yards per carry ... The Bearcats gained 188 yards on the ground on the day, still the highest single-game total in the team's three-year modern history ... Eric Walker rushed for 117 yards and another score ... Bethany has averaged 625 yards of offense in their two wins over the Bearcats, while holding SVC to an average of 221 total yards ... With three receptions last week, Bethany WR Matt Cruse now has 172 for his career and is 4 away from breaking T.J. Parker's career record of 175.

Series Record: Grove City leads 56-34-5

Game Notes: County rivals Grove City and Thiel square off for the prestigious Mercer County Cup for the 26th time on Saturday ... It is the 26th meeting for the Cup ... Grove City owns a 16-9 Cup series lead, including a thrilling 20-14 win at rain-soaked Thorn Field last year ... The Wolverines also pulled out a 14-13 win at Thiel two years ago ... Thiel, however, has won five of the last eight contests by a combined 179-85 margin ... Grove City-Thiel is the longest continuous series among the games played during PAC Rivalry Week ... Thiel is Grove City's most-frequently played foe as this will be the 96th meeting between the teams ... The teams first met in 1892, with Grove City earning a 58-0 win over Thiel ... Thiel taskmaster Kurt Reiser is the seventh man to coach Thiel in a Cup game; GCC coach Chris Smith, who introduced the Cup in 1984, is in his 26th Cup game.

Series Record: Westminster leads 61-42-8

Game Notes: Geneva and Westminster will face off in the 112th edition of "The Game" on Saturday in New Wilmington ... The Titans hold a 61-42-8 edge in the series but the Golden Tornadoes have won each of the last two meetings since joining the PAC in 2007 ... The two teams were archrivals back when they were both NAIA teams, but Westminster left for the NCAA in 1998 and Geneva followed two years ago ... Last year, Geneva held off Westminster 29-26 in a game that featured five total field goals, including three by Geneva's Nick DiPietro ... The last time Geneva visited Westminster was in 2007 when the GTs won 37-14, despite Westminster QB Kevin Franz, the school's all-time leading passer, throwing for a career-high 319 yards on 26-of-39 passing and two TDs... Prior to 2007, the last meeting was a 12-7 Titan win at Geneva in 2001 ... Westminster hasn't defeated Geneva at home since a 21-0 win in 1993 ... The series began in 1891with a 42-0 Geneva victory.
