Offensive Player of the Week

BRAD DAWSON Waynesburg Sophomore QB

6-1, 200 Pittsburgh, Pa. Thomas Jefferson H.S.

Dawson completed 26of-44 passes for 453

yards and two touchdowns while rushing for another score Saturday, leading the Yellow Jackets to a 50-35 PAC victory at Thiel. His 453 passing yards marked the second-highest single game total in school history, trailing only John Huntey (467 yards in 1968).

Also nominated was junior QB Andrew DiDonato of Grove City, senior RB Derek Taylor of Washington & Jefferson, and freshman WR Justin Morgano of Westminster.



JORDAN BLINN Westminster

Senior II B 5-10, 200 Industry, Pa. Western Beaver H.S.



Blinn recorded a careerhigh 20 tackles (11 solo),

including two for losses and one quarterback sack, to lead the Titans to a 24-21 PAC win over Grove City. He made a 4th-and-2 tackle with 2:56 to play to gain possession on downs and set up the winning drive, then stopped a quarterback sneak at the Westminster 1-yard line on the game's final play to seal the victory.

Also nominated was senior MLB Adam Eichler of Grove City, junior LB Brad Steinmetz of Thomas More, senior LB David Gitlitz of Washington & Jefferson, and junior OLB Ryan Krull of Waynesburg.

PAC FOOTBALL 2008 - Week 11 Conference Notes

PAC RIVALRY WEEK: The final weekend of the 2008 football regular season is here, as "PAC Football Rivalry Week" takes center stage ... All five contests in week 11 are rivalry games, which will remain scheduled in the final weekend of the regular season in future years ... Waynesburg hosts W&J in the "PAC Backyard Brawl", Grove City hosts Thiel in the "Mercer County Cup", Geneva hosts Westminster in "The Game", Bethany hosts Saint Vincent in "The Green Game" and Thomas More hosts Mt. St. Joseph in the "Bridge Bowl".

WHO'S HOT: Geneva rushed for 235 yards as a team in its 17-13 upset of PAC champion Thomas More, including a team-best 98-yard effort by Gerard Muschette ... W&J senior RB Derek Taylor posted 147 all-purpose yards (59 rush, 70 rec., 18 return) and two TDs in a 54-7 win over Bethany

... Grove City junior QB Andrew DiDonato compiled a school-record 363 yards of total offense (236 passing, 127 rushing) in a 24-21 PAC loss at Westminster ... Junior OLB Ryan Krull led Wavnesburg with 11 tackles, including five solos tops in the Yellow Jackets' 50-35 win at Thiel.

AROUND THE LEAGUE: Westminster freshman WR Justin Morgano caught a game-winning eight-yard TD pass with 46 seconds to play in the Titans' 24-21 PAC win over Grove City ... Thiel WR Brendan Taylor hauled in nine passes for 112 yards and a pair of scores in the Tomcats' 50-35 loss to Waynesburg ... Thomas More junior LB Brad Steinmetz had 12 total tackles, including three for losses and a sack, in the Saints' 17-13 loss at Geneva ... Bethany junior FS Nelson Mitzen recorded 15 tackles for the Bison in the 54-7 loss at W&J.



Bethany Bison (2-7, 1-5 PAC)

A 41-point outburst by W&J in the first half was too much for the Bison

in a 54-7 loss Saturday to the 19th-ranked Presidents ... Bethany's score came on a twoyard run by WR **Randy Rankin** late in the second quarter ... BC was limited to 151 total yards, with QB **Chad Smith** throwing for 122 yards ... His top targets were TE **Jorge Laboy** (6 rec., 34 yds.) and WR **Taylor McNeil** (3 rec., 40 yds.) ... FS **Nelson Mitzen** had 15 tackles, his third game of double digits stops, and SS **David Abel** made 13 hits, his third consecutive contest with 10+ tackles ... LB **Ron Ermlick** was in on 11 stops as well ... The Bison close out the season Saturday when they host Saint Vincent at Bison Stadium.

Saint Vincent Bearcats (1-8)



Coming off of a 36-22 loss to Thiel, the Bearcats had the

week off, and will wrap up the season this weekend at Bethany ... Saint Vincent will look to snap a seven-game losing streak, and avenge last season's 66-7 loss at Bethany in week three. Geneva Golden Tornadoes (4-5)



What a difference a month makes for the **GOLDEN TORNADOES** Geneva football team ...

After dropping five of its first six games, the Golden Tornadoes have won three straight including their first home victory of the season against newly crowned PAC champion Thomas More ... The Golden Tornadoes defeated the Saints 17-13 to move to 4-5 and set up the opportunity to finish the season with a .500 record ... Geneva used a pair of Matt Dean touchdowns of one and 17 yards to pull away from Thomas More ... Geneva scored the first ten points and then held on when senior DB Derek McElhaney preserved the victory with his second interception of the season ... Geneva rushed for 235 yards including a team best 98 yards from Gerard Muschette ... The defense caused two turnovers in the victory.

Thiel jumped out to a 7-0 firstquarter lead, but the Yellow

Jackets of Waynesburg outscored the Tomcats 50-28 down the stretch, to run away with the contest, 50-35, at Alumni Stadium ... The Tomcats were led offensively by WR Brendan Taylor who recorded his second-consecutive two-touchdown game by hauling in nine passes for 112 yards ... QB Willie Bova finished 26of-44 for 319 yards and three touchdowns, but his day was tarnished by three interceptions ... Senior DT Matt Turek turned in his finest effort to date this season with seven solo tackles, including an 11-yard sack ... Junior DT William Haase recorded six solo tackles, including two tackles for a loss ... His final tackle of the day - an eight yard sack in the fourth quarter – made him Thiel all-time leader for TFL in a season with 18.5.

Washington & Jefferson Presidents (8-1, 4-1 PAC)



Washington & Jefferson heads into the final week of the season needing to secure a vic-

tory to keep its hopes alive for an at-large bid into the NCAA Division III postseason tournament ... With the 54-7 victory over Bethany Saturday, the Presidents extended their win streak to 26 games against the Bison ... On the season, senior QB Bobby Swallow has completed 218-of-329 pass attempts, including 29 touchdowns and only four interceptions to lead the offense, while senior LB David Gitlitz has paced the defense with 61 total tackles, including nine tackles for loss and four sacks ... The Presidents currently lead the PAC in numerous categories, including scoring offense (45.9 pts/game), pass offense (323.0 yds/game), kickoff returns (23.9 yds/ return), and rushing defense (73.2 yds/game).

Waynesburg Yellow Jackets (5-4, 2-3 PAC)

The Yellow Jackets em-

phatically snapped a two-game losing skid with an offensive explosion in a 50-35 win over Thiel ... Sophomore QB Brad Dawson had by far his best day since joining the Waynesburg program, throwing for 453 yards and two touchdowns against the Tomcats ... Howevever, the Pittsburgh native wasn't the only major offensive weapon for Waynesburg as freshman RB Justin Falcon rushed for four touchdowns ... The Jacket defense also made an impact, forcing six turnovers, including three interceptions by three different defenders ... Junior OLB Ryan Krull led the team in tackles with 11, including five solo stops ... Freshman K Bryan Arbes broke the school record for field goals in a season when he booted his 12th of the year from 28 yards out against the Tomcats.

Grove City Wolverines (5-4, 2-3 PAC)



Grove City amassed 454 yards of offense and 31 first downs

but could not come up with its first win at Westminster since 1961 Saturday ... GCC scored on just three of seven red-zone opportunities ... **Stephen Mercer** hauled in eight passes for 82 yards while **Zach Summy** added six catches for 57 yards ... **Blaine Miller** ran for his first two collegiate touchdowns ... Defensively, LB **Adam Eichler** recorded 10 tackles, a forced fumble and an interception ...

Marc Shamley picked up his fifth sack of 2008 ... The Wolverines executed 85 offensive plays and went 8-for-14 on third down ... Grove City is 0-3 at Memorial Field since 2005 with the three setbacks coming by a total of 11 points ... Grove City last defeated Westminster in 2006, 21-20, at the Wolverines' Thorn Field.

Thomas More Saints (7-2, 6-0 PAC)



Thomas More fell, 17-13, Geneva ... It was the

Saints' first loss since falling to John Carroll in their opening game of the season ... TMC was led by freshman RB Anthony Knott who rushed the ball 12 times for 65 yards and one TD ... Junior QB Trevor Stellman was 13-of-24 passing for 157 yards and one TD, but threw his first two interceptions of the season ... Junior RB Cordario Collier carried the ball nine times for 33 yards and also had three receptions for 24 yards ... Senior WR Nick Dew finished with three catches for 51 yards ... The Saints' defensive effort was led by junior LB Brad Steimetz, who had 12 tackles (seven solo, five assisted), including a sack for a loss of seven yards ... Through the Saints' first nine games, Knott leads the rushing attack with 89 carries for 727 yards and eight TDs.

Westminster Titans (5-4, 3-3 PAC)



Westminster remained

undefeated at Burry Stadium this season by defeating Grove City, 24-21, Saturday ... The Titans have now won a PAC-best seven straight home games and the team completes the season unbeaten at home for the first time since 1996 when the Titans made the NAIA playoffs ... Freshman WR Justin Morgano hauled in his first career TD pass from 8 yards out from junior QB Kevin Franz for the eventual game-winning score ... Morgano caught three passes for 31 yards ... Junior Jon Gubish led the receivers with four catches for 48 yards ... Franz threw for 155 yards on 15of-28 passing with a touchdown and an interception ... Junior TB Nick McKolosky rushed for 132 yards on 30 carries including two TDs ... Senior FS Jake Wilczynski posted 11 tackles in the win.

This will be the second meeting between the programs after the Bison won the initial match-up 66-7 last year at home ... BC set school-records for total yards (739) and rushing yards (482), while holding the Bearcats to 117 yards ... Marcus Santini rushed for 85 yards and scored two TDs in last year's victory ... Series Record: Washington & Jefferson leads 32-3

Game Notes: The 2008 regular season comes to an end on Saturday as Waynesburg hosts rival Washington and Jefferson ... The game is part of the first installment of PAC Football Rivalry Week ... The Presidents have won four consecutive meetings and have claimed 16 of the last 17 meetings ... Last year, the Jackets and Presidents locked up in a showdown of unbeaten conference leaders and the game lived up to its expectations ... Last year, the two schools met with the conference championship on the line and W&J escaped with a 22-21 victory on **Bobby Swallow**'s 1-yard TD plunge midway through the fourth quarter ... **Jacob Bloomhuff** had six total tackles, including three for a loss, and one sack for the Presidents ... Overall, W&J holds a 32-3 advantage in the all-time series.

Series Record: Westminster leads 61-41-8

Game Notes: The 111th meeting between Geneva and Westminster sets up to be a good one ... Geneva is looking for its fourth straight win and Westminster is looking for a winning season coming into action with a record of 5-4 ... The Titans lead the all-time series 61-41-8, but Geneva came away with a 37-14 victory in New Wilmington last year ... In the loss to Geneva last year, Westminster QB **Kevin Franz** threw for a career-high 319 yards on 26-39 passing ... Geneva has won four of the last five meetings ... Prior to that, the teams' last game was a 12-7 Westminster win at Geneva in 2001 when the Titans had just five first downs, 19 rushing yards and 34 passing yards, but won thanks to a pair of interception returns for touchdowns ... In one of the longest standing rivalries in Western Pennsylvania, Geneva and Westminster first hooked up in 1891 when Geneva won the game 42-0 in Westminster's first-ever game ... After ending the rivalry after the 1997 game, Geneva and Westminster split games in 2000 and 2001 ... This year, Westminster is unbeaten at home, but in four road losses the Titans have been outscored 47.5-17.5.
