PAC Offensive Player of the Week

DARRELL SATTERFIELD Thiel College

Senior quarterback - 5-11, 184 Orwell, Ohio/Grand Valley H.S.

Satterfield completed 29-of-52 passes for 306 yards and six touchdowns for the Tomcats in a 50-48 triple-overtime win at Carnegie Mellon. His 29 receptions set a new Thiel single-game record, while his 52 attempts tied the school game high.

Also nominated was senior RB Eric Daniels (Clinton, Md./Gwynn Park H.S.) of Waynesburg, and sophomore WR Brett Ziegler (Somerset, Pa./Somerset H.S.) of Westminster.

PAC Defensive Player of the Week

NICK EMLEY Waynesburg College

Senior linebacker - 6-0, 200 Randolph, N.Y./Randolph H.S.

Emley posted a team-high seven tackles for the Yellow Jackets as Waynesburg posted a 40-13 PAC win over Westminster. He paced a Jacket defensive unit which held the Titans to just 49 yards rushing on 30 carries, including 22 on a fake punt.

Also nominated was junior MLB Jeff Wagner (Karns City, Pa./Karns City H.S.) of Thiel, senior LB Mark Carlisle (Canal Winchester, Ohio/Bloom Carroll H.S.) of Thomas More, and junior DB Joey Tissler (Ventura, Calif./ St. Bonaventure H.S.) of Westminster.

Bethany Bison

Bethany closed the 2005 season with a 30-15 loss to visiting Carnegie Mellon on Nov. 5 ... The Bison fell behind 23-0 early in the third quarter and rallied to within 23-15 midway through the fourth quarter ... WR **T.J. Parker**

caught six passes for 91 yards and his ninth TD of the season, a 26yard scoring reception in the fourth quarter that broke the BC singleseason record ... Fellow WR **Milton Joyner** hauled in five balls for 82 yards and a 42-yard score ... Delivering the scoring throws was freshman **Matt Blumer**, who was 14-of-30 for 223 yards and the two TDs in his first collegiate start ... Bethany outgained CMU 398-305 for the game ... Defensively, LB **Tim Goetz** made 20 tackles in his final game, giving him 120 for the season, while **Cliff Anderson** also reached exactly 100 for the season with 12 stops.



Thiel Tomcats

The Tomcats battled back from a two-touchdown deficit early in the fourth quarter to post a 50-48 triple-overtime win over Carnegie Mellon Saturday in Pittsburgh ... Thiel concluded its regular season with a perfect 10-0 record and their first PAC championship since 1972 ... Saturday's

overtime win was their third road OT victory this season ... Senior WR **Brandon Chambers** had a career day, catching 15 passes for 177 yards and four touchdowns, setting game standards in both receptions and touchdowns ... Junior MLB **Jeff Wagner** and junior OLB **Chris Hlinka** each had 10 total tackles for the Tomcats ... Sophomore DE **Chris Lorber** added eight stops, one tackle for loss and a forced fumble.



Washington & Jefferson Presidents

Senior QB **Chris Edwards** went over 3,000 passing yards for the season after totaling 373 yards and four TDs in the Presidents' 32-14 win at Thomas More on Nov. 5 ... The victory marked the ninth time since 1992 that W&J has totaled at least nine wins in a season ... Senior WR **Aaron Krepps** caught five passes to bring his career

total to 173 which moved him into second place all-time ... W&J racked up 503 total yards and junior RB **Ryan Mendel** was the leading rusher with 79 yards and one TD on 19 attempts ... Senior RB **R.J. Zitzelsberger** added 106 combined yards and a sevenyard TD reception ... Junior LB **Eric Taslov** had a career-high 12 tackles ... Senior DL **Dan Brodland** recorded two sacks.



Westminster Titans

The Titans closed the 2005 season with a 40-13 PAC loss at Waynesburg ... Sophomore WR **Brett Ziegler** caught two touchdown passes from sophomore QB **Brett Myers** in the loss ... Myers, making his first collegiate career start, led the Titan offense by completing 18-of-34 passes for a career-high 198 yards and two touchdowns, with Ziegler catching five passes for 70 yards and the two scores ... The team's

top receiver was junior WR **Jake Buzard**, who posted a careerhigh eight catches for 75 yards in the loss ... Senior RB **Sean Buggey** paced the Titan rushers with 68 yards on 25 carries ... The Titan defense was paced by junior DB **Joey Tissler** with a team-best seven solo tackles ... Junior ILB **Jason Fridley** added six stops, an interception, and a quarterback sack in the loss.



Grove City Wolverines

Grove City closed the 2005 season with a heartbreaking 14-13 loss at Westminster on Nov. 5 ... Scott Fichter caught a 47-yard touchdown pass from Bradford Clark while Ross Trimmer returned a fumble 42 yards for

a third-quarter touchdown ... **Bill Waugh** had nine tackles and a sack while **Aaron Margo** had a team-high 10 tackles ... **Shane Coughlin** recorded his second interception of the year while **Dave Issler** also picked off a pass ... As a team, Grove City blocked eight kicks this season, a new school record ... Fichter has a team-high 37 catches, the most for a GCC player since **Dave DiDonato** caught 52 in 2003 ... **Aaron Margo** became the first Grove City DB to lead the team in tackles since **Rich Shields** had 84 stops in 1995.



Thomas More Saints

Thomas More lost for the second straight season to the Mount St. Joseph Lions, falling 31-7 ... QB **Nate**

Berkley returned to the field after missing three games – finishing 10-of-22 for 77 yards ... The Saints lone touchdown came when **Seth Ellis** connected with Dan Hartman on an eight-yard pass ... It was the final game for 17 seniors.



Waynesburg Yellow Jackets

The Yellow Jacket offense amassed a seasonhigh 539 yards of total offense en route to a 40-13 victory over conference rival Westminster ... The Waynesburg defense limited the Titan ground game to just 49 yards on 30 attempts ... In their last collegiate game, senior WRs **Ivan Hawkins** and **Dominick Hunter** combined for 224 yards

on 13 receptions, as both players surpassed the 100-yard mark ... Hunter finished his career with a school-record 179 receptions, while Hawkins posted 175 catches to rank second ... The Jackets featured two 100-yard backs in juniors **Ryan Abels** and **Eric Daniels**. Abels finished the game with 140 yards on 23 carries and a touchdown ... Daniels rushed for a season-high 154 yards and three TDs (15, 60, 50) on just 11 carries (14.0 avg).

Johns Hopkins (8-2) at Thiel (10-0)

Saturday, Nov. 19 - noon

Series Record: First meeting

Game Notes: Thiel will face Johns Hopkins University at Alumni Stadium on Nov. 19 in the opening round of the 2005 Division III playoffs ... The game will feature two newcomers to the national playoff and will be the first meeting between the two schools ... The Blue Jays finished their regular season 8-2 and champions of the Centennial Conference, while the Tomcats concluded the regular season 10-0 and earned their first PAC title since 1972.

Washington & Jefferson (9-1) at Bridgewater (9-1)

Game Notes: For the third time in the past six seasons, Washington & Jefferson and Bridgewater will meet in the first round of the NCAA Division III football playoffs ... W&J has earned its 17th bid to the NCAA Division III playoffs in the past 21 seasons ... The Presidents and Eagles, however, will meet for the first time at Bridgewater's Jopson Field ... The Presidents, who are placed in the Trinity (Texas) bracket (South), were awarded a Pool B bid to the national playoffs ... Bridgewater earned the Old Dominion Athletic Conference's (ODAC) automatic berth after posting a perfect 6-0 league mark ... The Eagles have won 35 consecutive conference games ... The W&J-Bridgewater winner will take on the winner of the Thiel-Johns Hopkins matchup at the site of the highest remaining seed on Saturday, November 26th ... The Washington & Jefferson-Bridgewater game will be a rematch of last season's wild 55-48 double-overtime classic won by W&J at Cameron Stadium ... W&J sent the game to overtime after scoring on a 1-yard run by **Aaron Krepps** with no time remaining in regulation. The two schools combined for 1,016 total yards, including 722 passing ... In the first round of the 2000 NCAA playoffs, the Eagles recorded a 59-42 come-from-behind win at Cameron Stadium. The Presidents jumped out to a 28-3 lead in the first 17 minutes before BC roared back and outscored W&J, 36-7, in the second half.
