PAC Offensive Player of the Week

PAUL D'IMPERIO Waynesburg College

Senior wide receiver - 6-1, 180 Crofton, Md./Arundel H.S.

D'Imperio became the all-time leader in career receptions (144) at Waynesburg after catching three balls for 59 yards with a long of 28 yards.

Senior defensive tackle - 6-2, 265 Boardman, Ohio/Boardman H.S.

Ventresco posted 12 total tackles (10 solo, two assisted) along with a pair of quarterback sacks for the Titans in their 18-13 PAC loss to Waynesburg.

Also nominated was sophomore DL **Ashley Bowers** (New Oxford, Pa./New Oxford H.S.) of Waynesburg.

PAC FOOTBALL NOTES

Bethany Bison

Carnegie Mellon found the endzone on its first four possessions in a decisive 63-7 victory over Bethany in Pittsburgh on Nov. 6 ... The Bethany points came in the fourth quarter on a Mike Yandrick four-yard touchdown run, his first score of the season ... Yandrick finished the game with a team-high 36 rushing yards on 16 carries ... T.J. Parker led the receivers with 73 vards on five receptions, while Milton Joyner had three catches for 20 yards ... Senior QB Brian Wineberg took the majority of the snaps for the Bison and completed 10-of-18 passes for 107 yards ... On defense, junior LB Tim Goetz led the squad with 12 tackles, while Joe Slezak had three tackles, a forced fumble and an interception from his linebacker spot.

Wash. & Jeff. Presidents

No. 4 W&J was off the final week of the regular season ... The undefeated and nationally-ranked PAC Champions (10-0) will host Bridgewater (8-2) in an NCAA Division III Championship First Round Game this Saturday, Nov. 20 at Cameron Stadium in Washington at noon.

Grove City Wolverines

Grove City closed the 2004 season with a home loss to Westminster on Nov. 6 ... It is the Wolverines' first loss on Senior Day since 1998 ... The Wolverines held Westminster to just 212 total yards and forced nine punts ... Mike Choby became Grove City's all-time tackles leader with 350 ... He made 11 stops against Westminster ... Mike Prioletti had 13 tackles and a sack in his final game at Grove City ... Senior Dave DiDonato caught five passes for 63 yards ... Grove City closed the season with five straight setbacks ... It is Grove City's longest losing streak since losing six straight over the 1995-96 season ... Steve Weary tied a school record with three blocked kicks during the season.

Waynesburg Yellow Jackets

Waynesburg held its ground on a fourthdown play with less than two minutes remaining Saturday and sealed the Yellow Jackets' 18-13 victory over Westminster ... The win gave the Jackets seven victories in a season for the tenth time in program history and the first back-to-back seven-win seasons since the 1966-68 seasons ... The Jacket defense limited Titan RB Scott Froelich, the PAC leader in rushing yards, scoring and all-purpose yards to just 67 rushing yards ... Waynesburg RB Eric Daniels rushed for a game-high 86 vards on a game-high 24 carries and two touchdowns ... QB Jeff Dumm finished the game with 209 passing yards on 14 of 20 attempts.

Thiel Tomcats

With an18-12 loss at Buffalo State on Npv. 6, the Tomcats finished the season with a 7-3 overall record, tying the school's best single-season win total ... The last time Thiel posted seven victories in a season was in 1972 when the squad went 7-2 and won the PAC championship ... Senior QB Darrell Satterfield finished the day 16-of-28 for 225 yards and is now the program's single-season record holder in completions (169) and touchdown passes (16) and is second in passing yards with 1,955 ... Junior WR Brandon Chambers combined for 308 total yards (123 rec., 144 punt ret., 44 kick ret.) and one receiving touchdown ... Junior WR Dane Haskins caught five passes for a career-best 104 yards.

Westminster Titans

Westminster closed the 2004 season with an 18-13 home loss to PAC rival Waynesburg ... The Titans, who trailed 12-0 at the half, rallied for a 13-12 lead early in the fourth quarter before a 1-yard TD dive by Eric Daniels gave the Jackets the final lead ... For Westminster, sophomore QB J.R. Barley completed 12-of-20 passes for 136 yards with one interception and one TD, with senior WR Brian Ekis leading the receiving corps with five catches for 54 yards ... Senior DB Clint DeLuca posted 12 tackles while senior DB Justin Martinchek added an interception in the loss ... At 5-5, the Titans posted their 49th winning season (.500 or better) in the past 53 years.

Series Record: Bridgewater leads 1-0

Game Notes: W&J earned its 16th bid to the NCAA Division III football playoffs in the past 20 seasons and will host Bridgewater (Va.) in the first round ... The Presidents (10-0), who are placed in the Hardin-Simmons bracket (South), were awarded a Pool B bid to the national playoffs after claiming their 18th Presidents' Athletic Conference Championship in the past 21 seasons ... The W&J-Bridgewater winner will take on the winner of the Salisbury (Md.)-Christopher Newport (Va.) matchup at the site of the highest remaining seed on Saturday, November 27th ... Bridgewater is the champion of the Old Dominion Athletic Conference (ODAC) with an 8-2 overall record ... The Eagles have won six consecutive games after starting the season with a 2-2 mark following losses to McDaniel (14-11) and Christopher Newport (21-16) ... Hardin-Simmons is the top seed in the regional bracket, as the Cowboys also finished with a perfect 10-0 record and earned a bye in the first round ... The Washington & Jefferson-Bridgewater contest will be a rematch of the 2000 NCAA playoffs in which the Eagles recorded a 59-42 come-from-behind win at Cameron Stadium in the first round ... The Presidents jumped out to a 28-3 lead in the first 17 minutes before BC roared back and outscored W&J, 36-7, in the second half.

Game Notes: The Bison wrap up the 2004 season Saturday at home against Defiance ... The game was originally scheduled to be played Sept. 18, but was postponed due to flooding in the Bethany area ... The Yellow Jackets enter the game with a record of 1-8, having won its only game of the season on Nov. 6 at Manchester, 19-14 ... Defiance lost its last game at home to Bluffton (30-0) on Nov. 13 ... The Bison have played three other schools in the Heartland Collegiate Athletic Conference ... Bethany is 0-1 all-time against Anderson University, 0-2 against Bluffton College and 2-0 against Franklin College.
