# Offensive Player of the Week

### ANDREW DIDONATO **Grove City**

Senior QB 6-1, 200 Bridgeville, Pa. South Fayette H.S.

DiDonato earned his second PAC weekly award this

season, after accounting for 372 yards of total offense and four touchdowns in the Wolverines' 31-24 double-overtime win at Thiel in the 26th Mercer County Cup. He completed 32-of-43 passes for 279 yards and two scores, while also rushing 13 times for 93 yards and two TDs while leading GCC back from a 17-0 deficit.

Also nominated was junior QB Dan Pegg of Bethany, senior RB Cordario Collier of Thomas More, junior WR Jordan Roycroft of W&J, junior QB Brad Dawson of Waynesburg, and sophomore QB Shawn Lehocky of Westminster.

Arrington recorded 12 tackles and an intercep-

# PAC FOOTBALL 2009 - Week 12 Conference Notes

TWO FOR NCAAs: The 2009 PAC football I regular season is in the books, and for the third time in the past five seasons the conference has had two teams qualify for the NCAA D-III playoffs ... PAC champion Thomas More (10-0) will hosts SCAC champion DePauw (7-2) at Bank of Kentucky Field, while Washington & Jefferson (9-1), which earned one of six Pool C at-large bids, plays at 10-0 defending national champion Mount Union ... Geneva also made the postseason and will play in the NCCAA Victory Bowl at Greenville (III.).

AFCA poll and 11th in D3Football.com, while W&J is ranked 13th by the AFCA and 20th by D3Football.com ... Thiel senior QB Willie Bova posted 338 yardsof total offense (267 passing, 71 rushing) in the Tomcats' double-OT loss to Grove City ... Thomas More senior QB Trevor Stellman rushed for 112 yards and two TDs in the Saints' 42-17 Bridge Bowl win at Mount St. Joseph ... QB Dan Pegg posted the ninth-highest single game passing total in Bethany history with 341 yards and 3 TDs at Saint Vincent.

With a win against Waynesburg, W&J's 23 seniors posted the 40th win of their collegiate careers ... Junior QB Brad Dawson broke Jeff Dumm's Waynesburg record for passing yards in a season with 2,718 yards on the year ... Westminster senior WR Chad Rosatelli finished his collegiate career fourth on the Titan career receptions list with 134 catches.



## Bethany Bison (3-7, 1-5 PAC)

The Bison ended the 2009 season on a high note by rushing out to a

22-0 halftime lead and going on to post a 34-13 triumph at Saint Vincent in the 3rd Annual "Green Game" ... QB Dan Pegg threw for 341 yards and TDs to Jorge Laboy (16), Matt Cruse (37) and Ed Holmes (50) while also rushing 5 yards for the final score of the day ... Eric Walker accounted for the other TD with a 2yard scoring run, his 11th of the season to break the Bethany single-season rushing TD mark and also tie the single-season total TD record (15) ... Cruse had 113 yards on five catches, which gave him the Bison career reception record (177) ... LB Kyle Arrington had 12 tackles and an INT, while Michael Salters picked off two passes for the Bison, who held SVC to 247 yards.

### Saint Vincent **Bearcats** (0-10)



The Bearcats were unable to end the season on a high note,

falling 34-13 to Bethany in Saturday's season finale ... As has been the case throughout the season, turnovers plagued Saint Vincent, as they gave the ball up five times, including four interceptions ... Senior TE Jake Gabelt ended his career in fine fashion, hauling in a teamhigh five receptions, including the eighth TD of his career, giving him the team's modern day lead ... Senior FB Marc Gonzales scored the first TD of his career on a three-vard plunge in the third quarter ... With three catches Saturday, junior WR Sheldon Loughner ended the season with 29 grabs for 437 yards, both modern-day season records ... Defensively, SS Alex Rowan led SVC with nine stops ... Freshman LB David Ribero finished with eight tackles, including 0.5 TFL.

### Washington & Jefferson Presidents (9-1, 5-1 PAC)



For the sixth-straight season, the Washington & Jefferson College football team will

appear in the 2009 NCAA Division III playoffs and the Presidents will travel to Alliance, Ohio, to meet defending national champion Mount Union College ... W&J finished the year with nine victories for the 15th time since 1992 after defeating Waynesburg on Saturday 35-12 ... Junior QB Gino Rometo had his best day in a W&J uniform with 310 yards and three touchdowns, two to classmate Jordan Roycroft ... W&J honored 23 seniors prior to the game who won their 40<sup>th</sup> game as Presidents ... Senior WR Craig Besong caught 11 passes to increase his career total to 177 ... He moved into fifth place on the alltime receptions list.

Geneva Golden **Tornadoes** (7-3)



In one of the most heart wrenching losses in se- GOLDEN TORNADOES ries history, the GTs

dropped a 31-28 decision to Westminster in the final regular season game of the year ... A penalty-marred final drive culminated with a Westminster touchdown with only 11 seconds remaining on the clock as the Titans rallied for the game-winning score ... It was the first time since Geneva joined the PAC three years ago that Westminster has managed to beat the Golden Tornadoes ... Geneva got six catches and 99 yards receiving from Sam Thurston and another 100+ yard rushing performance from Gerard Muschette ... Muschette became just the seventh running back in school history to surpass the 1,000-yard mark for a single season ... Geneva will now turn its attention to the 2009 NCCAA Victory Bowl.

# Thiel **Tomcats** (3-7, 1-5 PAC)



Saturdav's Mercer County

Cup face off proved to be a tale of two halves for the Tomcats as they suffered a 31-24 loss at the hands of the Grove City Wolverines... Thiel finished its 2009 season with a 3-7 overall record and a 1-5 PAC record ... Senior QB Willie Bova racked up 338 total yards (267 passing, 71 rushing) and one TD ... Defensively, the Tomcats shot out the gates causing three turnovers in the Wolverines' first three drives of the first quarter ... Junior LB Bobby Shew led the defensive charge, picking off two Grove City passes only seven minutes into the contest ... Senior RB Dan Hess scored two first half touchdowns... DL Tom Cermak led the team in tackles with seven (four solo)... Senior WR Brendan Taylor ended the day with 10 receptions for 72 yards and a touchdown.

Waynesburg Yellow Jackets (5-5, 2-4 PAC)

The 2009 Waynesburg

football season came to an end Saturday as the Yellow Jackets fell at Washington & Jefferson by the final of 35-12 ... However, there were some positives to take out of the los ... Junior QB Brad Dawson broke Jeff Dumm's record for most passing yards in a season, which he set in 2004, by throwing for 237 yards against the Presidents, giving him 2,718 yards on the year ... Dawson also moved into fourth place on the school's all-time career passing list with 4,457 total yards through the air ... Junior LB Troy Cree finished his season with a third-straight double-digit tackling performance ... He made a game-high 14 total stops including eight solo hits ... Despite missing time with an injury this year, Cree led the team in total tackles (92), tackles for loss (9.0), solo tackles (66) and sacks (3.5).

Grove City Wolverines (5-5, 4-2 PAC)



Grove City wrapped up the reqular season Saturday with a

come-from-behind 31-24 double-overtime win at Thiel in the 26th Mercer County Cup game ... The Wolverines trailed 17-0 in the fourth quarter before charging back ... In the first OT, GCC tied the game 24-24 on Andrew **DiDonato**'s 11-yard TD run ... The Wolverines then took the lead for good on DiDonato's 25yard scoring pass to Luke O'Hara ... S Mark Rossol broke up a fourth-down pass on Thiel's possession to clinch the win ... O'Hara caught a career-high 12 passes for 140 yards ... DiDonato finished with 372 yards of total offense ... Aaron Palmieri racked up 13 tackles defensively while Jason Ferguson added a dozen stops ... Marc Shamley had two of Grove City's four sacks while Vance Keirsey set up a TD with a 54-yard interception return.

# Thomas More Saints (10-0, 6-0 PAC)



The 10<sup>th</sup>-ranked Saints defeated 17th-ranked

and across-the River rival, the College of Mount St. Joseph. 42-17. Saturday in Bridge Bowl XIV at Schueler Field in Cincinnati, Ohio ... The win improved the Saints' record in the Bridge Bowl to 11-3 and gave the Saints their fourth undefeated regular-season in school history

... Thomas More outgained the Lions, 325-199, while holding MSJ to negative seven vards of rushing ... Offensively, the Saints were led by senior QB Trevor Stellman, who was 10of-20 passing for 125 yards and three TDs and also had eight rushes for 34 yards ... Senior RB Cordario Collier had 18 carries for 112 yards and two touchdowns ... Defensively, the Saints were led by senior linebacker Brad Steinmetz, who had 13 tackles, including two tackles for a loss and one sack.

Westminster Titans (4-6, 2-4 PAC)



Westminster ended its

2009 season with a dramatic 31-28 win over its archrival Geneva on Saturday ... The game included eight lead changes, ending with sophomore QB Shawn Lehocky scoring on a 1-yard TD run with 11 seconds left for the game-winner ... The Titans are now 9-2 in their last 11 home finales and their win over Geneva was their first over a team that would finish the season with seven or more wins since 2003 ... Lehocky led the Titans with 101 passing yards, completing 7-of-13 passes including one touchdown, while also rushing for 59 yards on 13 attempts and a score ... Senior RB Nick McKolosky led the Titans with 88 yards on 21 carries and one touchdown, the 30th of his career which ranks sixth all-time at Westminster, while his 2,891 career rushing vards are fifth in school history.
