Senior WR 5-10, 170 Old Saybrook, Conn. Old Saybrook H.S.



McNeil broke the Bethany single-game record with

279 receiving yards on 10 receptions with two touchdowns (60, 88) in the Bison's 44-14 win over PAC rival Saint Vincent. He broke the previous BC single-game mark of 225 yards set by Dan Reilly in 1989 and became just the seventh BC receiver to surpass 100 career receptions (106) in the victory.

Also nominated was senior WR Stephen Mercer of Grove City, junior RB Cordario Collier of Thomas More, senior WR Luke Espe of W&J, sophomroe WR Ray Hightower II of Waynesburg, and junior WR Jon Gubish of Westminster.

Bexley H.S. Gitlitz posted 10 tackles, including 3.5 for losses of

## Saint Vincent Bearcats (1-9)

The Bearcats wrapped up the season on a losing note, fall-

ing 44-14 vs. Bethany Saturday ... Freshman HB Jairus Marlow set a modern day school record with 130 yards on 13 carries, while also adding a 38-yard reception ... The Bearcats ended the day with a 188-119 advantage in rushing yards, but Bethany out-passed SVC 392-136 ... S Josh Diamond led the Bearcat defense with 10 tackles, including one for loss, for his fifth straight 10+ tackle game, while Armando Fortunato added six stops, including two TFLs ... DLs Mike Nadeau and Calvin Demillion each recorded a sack ... After the first 100-yard performance of his career, Marlow finishes the year as his team's leading rusher, gaining 458 yards on just 59 carries, good for 7.8 yards per try, as well as a teamhigh five touchdowns.

#### Washington & Jefferson Presidents (9-1, 5-1 PAC)

The Presidents closed the season with a 42-9 victory over Waynesburg in the PAC Back-

yard Brawl ... Senior QB Bobby Swallow passed for 250 yards and four TDs, including the 100th of his career ... He is the 16th player in NCAA Division III history to pass for 100 touchdowns ... Swallow also moved within 63 yards of passing Chris Edwards for second on the W&J career passing yardage list ... Senior WR Luke Espe and junior WR Craig Besong each caught a pair of scoring tosses, while senior RB Curt Jones gained 120 yards and scored two touchdowns ... With one TD in the NCAA playoffs, Jones will tie for the thirdhighest single-season touchdown total (20) in school history ... Senior LB David Gitlitz moved into sole possession of third place (287) on the W&J career tackle list.

#### Geneva Golden Tornadoes (5-5)

Geneva's incredible turnaround season ended GOLDEN TORNADOES with its fourth consecu-

tive victory on Saturday ... The Golden Tornadoes defeated Westminster 29-26 in the 111<sup>th</sup> edition of "The Game" ... After starting the season at 1-5, Geneva and head coach **Geno DeMarco** were able to right the ship in finish in style ... On Saturday, Geneva used another solid ground attack to get past the Titans. Geneva rushed for 231 yards, including a 128 yard effort from **Matt Barge** ... **Gerard Muschette** put the game away with an 88 yard touchdown run early in the fourth quarter. Geneva's defense was led by **Derek McElhaney**'s 12 tackles. Geneva forced a pair of turnovers, including **Marcus Costanza**'s first collegiate interception.

#### Thiel Tomcats (2-8, 1-5 PAC)

Grove City downed Thiel, 20-16, to win the Mercer County

Cup for the second consecutive year at dreary Robert E. Thorn Field Saturday... The Tomcats finished the season with a 2-8 record (1-5 PAC)... QB Willie Bova overcame a driving rain to complete 21-of-31 pass attempts for 235 yards and a TD ... WR Brendan Taylor caught a TD pass for the third consecutive game ... He caught five TD passes in Thiel last three games ... Taylor finished with seven catches for 135 yards ... Bobby Shew had a monster day on defense, racking up a gameleading 17 tackles including a five-yard sack ... Junior William Haase registered two sacks for a combined 11 yards to highlight a ninetackle day ... His 20 tackles for a loss this season is a Thiel record ... The game was the last for coach Jack Leipheimer.

#### Waynesburg Yellow Jackets (5-5, 2-4 PAC)

The Waynesburg football

season came to a rough end Saturday with a 42-9 loss to Washington & Jefferson ... The loss gives the Yellow Jackets a final overall record of 5-5 and a 2-4 mark in the PAC ... One of the highlights of the game was the performance of some of the team's younger players ... Sophomore WR Ray Hightower led all player in both catches (9) and receiving yards (82), while freshman LB Scott Bogdan, who made his first collegiate start, led the team in total tackles (8) and solo tackles (7) ... Junior DB/KR Scott Cree also returned his third kickoff for a touchdown on an 88-yard jaunt to the end zone early in the contest ... He finishes the season with five total special team touchdowns and a sixth on one of his five interceptions.

#### Grove City Wolverines (6-4, 3-3 PAC)

Grove City retained possession of the Mercer County Cup Sat-

urday by pulling out a 20-14 home victory over Thiel at Robert E. Thorn Field ... QB Andrew DiDonato set a new single-season passing record with 1,923 yards after his career-high 278-yard effort Saturday ... He also went over the 5,000-yard mark for his career ... Senior end Stephen Mercer caught 14 passes for 171 yards and a touchdown ... He also threw a touchdown pass to DiDonato ... Mercer's 67 catches this year are the third-most in one season at Grove City ... The Wolverines owned a 16-minute edge in time of possession and converted 10-of-16 third downs ... Craig Bicehouse booted two field goals for the Wolverines ... Adam Eichler finished with a PACleading 104 tackles this year ... Zach Fulmer led the conference with five interceptions.

#### Thomas More Saints (8-2, 6-0 PAC)

Thomas More held across-the River rival,

Mount St. Joseph to 80 offensive yards as it shutout the Lions, 19-0, in Bridge Bowl XIII at The Bank of Kentucky Field ... It was the Saints' first shutout since Oct. 25, 2003 when they shutout Kentucky Wesleyan, 37-0, on Homecoming 2003 ... The Saints were led by junior QB Trevor Stellman, who was 19-of-31 passing for 220 yards and one TD and also ran the ball 12 times for 22 yards and a score ... Junior RB Cordario Collier crossed the century mark on the ground as he had 165 yards on 20 carries and also had five catches for 44 yards ... Nick Dew finished the day with nine catches for 114 yards and one TD... Defensively, sophomore LB Matt Clark led the Saints with 14 tackles (seven solo, seven assisted) and three pass break-ups.

#### Westminster Titans (5-5, 3-3 PAC)

Westminster football

absorbed a season-ending, 29-26 loss at Geneva Saturday ... Westminster finished the season with a 5-5 record, giving the program its 52nd non-losing season in the last 58 years ... Junior WR Jon Gubish scored his first career touchdown on his 83rd reception of his career ... Gubish finished the day with 10 catches for 91 yards and set the school record for receptions in a season with 64, surpassing Tim McNeil's mark of 61 catches in 14 games in 1994 ... Junior QB Kevin Franz also set a single-season record after completing 22-of-40 passes for 203 yards and two TDs ... Franz's 230 completions throughout the year eclipsed James Graham's previous record of 218 in 1999 ... Freshman WR Justin Morgano was the recipient of one of Franz's two touchdowns Senior DT Matt Jaworski made two sacks.

Game Notes: W&J and Christopher Newport will meet for the fourth time in the NCAA Playoffs, including the third first-round matchup ... The two schools have met on the even years every season since 2002 ... W&J has won all three previous meetings, two of which occurred at Cameron Stadium ... Washington & Jefferson holds a 19-19 record throughout history in the NCAA Division III playoffs ... The Presidents are one of five teams (W&J, Mount Union, Mary Hardin-Baylor, Hobart, Curry) to participate in each of the past five NCAA Division III Tournaments ... The Presidents are 10-9 at home in the NCAA playoffs all-time, including a 6-5 record in first-round home games at Cameron Stadium ... The Captains are led by junior tailback **Tunde Ogun**, the nation's leading rusher heading into last Saturday's action.
