FOR RELEASE: August 5, 2009 Thomas More College Picked to Repeat as 2009 PAC Football Champion

LATROBE, Pa. - Thomas More College was picked to capture the 2009 football championship in the Presidents' Athletic Conference (PAC), according to the preseason poll released at the 2009 PAC Football Media Day at Saint Vincent College in Latrobe today. Voters in the polls included conference head coaches, sports information directors (SIDs), and members of the media present at the conference media day.

The defending PAC champion Saints of third-year head coach **Jim Hilvert** return 18 starters and 35 lettermen from last year's team which finished 8-3 overall, including a perfect 6-0 mark against conference competition. Thomas More earned 17 of 28 total first-place votes and 200 points in the conference poll to edge second place Washington & Jefferson (191) by just nine points, followed by Grove City (115), Waynesburg (86), Westminster (82), Bethany (67) and Thiel (43).

"It's a great honor to be picked first, but we still have to go out and prove ourselves," said Hilvert. "The PAC is very strong this year, so we'll have to beready to play every game."

NCAA Division III provisional members Geneva and Saint Vincent were predicted to post 4-4 and 1-7 records, respectively, in 2009 against PAC teams, according to poll voters. Geneva and Saint Vincent are not eligible for the PAC football title until the schools are granted active membership in Division III by the NCAA at the conclusion of their provisional membership period, tentatively scheduled for 2010 for Saint Vincent and 2011 for Geneva.
