Thiel College Picked to Repeat as PAC Football Champions in 2006

PITTSBURGH, Pa. - The Thiel College football team has been selected to repeat as champions in the Presidents' Athletic Conference (PAC), according to the preseason poll released at the 2006 PAC Football Media Day at PNC Park in Pittsburgh today. Voters in the polls included conference head coaches, sports information directors, and members of the media present at the conference media day.

The defending PAC champion Tomcats of head coach **Jack Leipheimer** earned 21 of 35 first-place votes to lead the preseason poll with 228 points, edging Washington & Jefferson with 211, followed by Thomas More (165), Waynesburg (134), Westminster (108), Grove City

(95) and Bethany (40).

Thiel posted a perfect 10-0 regular season record in 2005 and posted an NCAA Division III playoff win over Johns Hopkins before falling to Bridgewater in the NCAA second round. The Tomcats were joined by W&J in the 2005 NCAA Division III playoffs, making the PAC one of a handful of conferences to earn a pair of national playoff berths.

"We are humbled and honored. This is a testament to our players that have gone through the program and the hard work and dedication of our current players and staff," said Leipheimer, now entering his sixth season as head coach at Thiel.
