McNees posted a hat trick, scoring all three

goals in a 3-0 Wolverine win over Pitt-Bradford Saturday. The three goals allowed him to become the all-time goal leader in Grove City history with 49 career goals, surpassing the old mark of 48 set by Ross Emerson (1952-56) which had stood for 50 years.

Also nominated was sophomore F Andrew McPherson of Bethany, sophomore MF Jesse George of Thiel, senior MF Mike Seminerio of Washington & Jefferson, and senior MF Dave Thorn of Waynesburg.

Bethany split a pair of games over the weekend against teams who earned berths in the ECAC Tournament a year ago ... In the opener of the Dickinson Tournament, BC scored three unanswered goals to erase a 1-0 deficit and claim a

3-1 victory over McDaniel ... Sean Esterbauer tied the game just before half on a PK and Ashkan Alavy and Andrew McPherson scored in the second half to give the Bison the win ... Marc Auger assisted on Alavy's game-winning goal, while GK Kosta Floros stopped two shots in the triumph ... In Sunday's finale, Dickinson put four on the board in the first half and went on to a 5-1 win ... Sophomore **Greg Lani**, who had three assists last year, scored his first career goal in the second half for Bethany's lone tally.



Thiel Tomcats

The Tomcat men's soccer team went 1-1 to open the first week of play of season, falling 1-0 at Hilbert Friday before earning a 4-1 win over Mt. Aloysius Sunday at Alumni Stadium ... Senior GK **Mark Coney** recorded six saves in the loss ... Four different Tomcats found the back of the

net in the win, as Thiel finished the contest with a 22-7 advantage in shots and a 14-2 edge in corner kicks ... After the Mounties tied the game 1-1 in the 39th minute, junior MF **Justin Croney** made it 2-1 scoring off an assist by sophomore F **Dorran Coley** 45 seconds later ... Sophomore F **Elliot Wreh-Wilson** scored unassisted in the 72nd minute before sophomore MF **Jesse George** closed the scoring with a goal assisted by junior MF **Frank Ily** in the 73rd minute.

Grove City Wolverines

Grove City went 1-1 during the opening weekend of competition ... The Wolverines earned their first win of the season Saturday with an historic 3-0 win over Pitt-Bradford at College Field ... Senior F **Bob McNees** recorded a hat

trick to became the program's all-time leading goal scorer with 49 career goals ... McNees passed **Ross Emerson**, who scored 48 goals in 27 matches from 1952-56 ... All three of McNees' goals came on penalty kicks in the second half ... GK **Michael Manahan** stopped five shots for the shutout ... First-year GCC mentor **Mike Dreves** earned his first victory as a collegiate head coach ... Grove City improved to 22-0 all-time against Pitt-Bradford ... Grove City now has 50 shutouts since the start of the 2000 season ... Friday, the Wolverines opened the season with a 4-0 loss to Medaille.

before holding on to a 3-2 win over Neumann in the consolation game ... Senior **Dave Thorn** and sophomore GK **Brad Davis** earned all-tournament honors over the weekend ... Thorn scored the first goal in the win over the Knights and assisted on **David Peters**' eventual game-winning goal ... Davis posted a combined 20 saves over the two games, tying his career high of 11 in the win ... Junior **Todd Schollaert** and Peters, a senior, added goals in the Yellow Jackets first win of the season.
