LUKE BENTON Waynesburg College

Senior forward Somerset, Pa./Somerset

Benton recorded four goals and one assist for nine points last week, as the Yellow Jackets went 2-0-1. He managed both Waynesburg goals in a 2-2 PAC tie with Thomas More, then scored once in wins over Mount Aloysius (6-2) and Pitt-Bradford (2-1).

Other nominees included junior F Sean Esterbauer of Bethany, junior F Bob McNees of Grove City, sophomore F Nikola Vasilev of Thiel, senior MF Eric Busener of Thomas More, sophomore MF Marc Clayton of Washington & Jefferson, and junior F Chris Dymond of Westminster.

The Bison opened the season with a pair of one-goal victories, including an overtime win in their PAC opener ... The week started with a 1-0 victory over Pitt-Greensburg, as MF Marc Auger scored off a double-assist from Sean

Esterbauer and Ashkan Alavy in the 77th minute ... GK Kosta Floros stopped five shots to record his first shutout ... In Saturday's PAC opener against Thomas More, BC rallied from a 2-0 halftime deficit to pull out a 3-2 win ... Goals by Ramon Franklyn and Andrew McPherson knotted the score 2-2 ... After assisting on Franklyn' s goal earlier, Esterbauer scored the game-winner off an assist from Alavy ... Esterbauer finished the week with a goal and two assists, while Alavy notched two assists during the two contests.

The Thiel College men's soccer team posted a victory in their season opener for the first time since 2002, defeating Mount Aloysius College 2-0 Saturday afternoon in Cresson ... Sophomore Nikola Vasilev notched the Tomcats' first goal of the season in the 65th minute of action

after scoring on a penalty kick ... Freshman Michael Ryan's header off of a direct kick by freshman Elliot Wreh-Wilson in the 73rd minute put Thiel up by the eventual final score of 2-0 ... Sophomore GK Ryan Lewis posted four saves in his first shutout of the season ... The shutout was Lewis' third of his career.

Grove City opened the 2005 season by splitting a pair of home matches last weekend ... The Wolverines earned a 2-1 win over Mount St. Joseph Saturday afternoon as junior Bob McNees scored on a penalty kick ... Grove

City took a 1-0 lead when the Lions scored an "own goal." ... Sophomore GK Michael Manahan earned the win in goal, the first of his career ... his first career goal from 25 yards out in the 17th minute ... Freshman Ryan McDonald assisted on the goal for his first career point ... to prevail against Pitt-Bradford on Monday, 2-1 ... Against PAC newcomer Thomas More, Waynesburg trailed 2-0 before Luke Benton scored an unassisted goal nine minutes before halftime. Benton tied the game with 24 minutes left in the game off an assist from Peters ... Freshman GK Matt Lamp made eight saves to earn the win in his first collegiate start ... Tied 1-1 with UP-B, sophomore MF Rick Wirth scored his first collegiate goal for the game-winner.
