Chiodo scored both goals as W&J opened the PAC league schedule with a 2-0 shutout at Bethany on Wednesday. His 28 career goals are just six away from becoming the all-time leading scorer in school history.

#### Bethany Bison

Bethany fell to 0-5 on the year with three losses last week ... It is the first time the Bison have ever started a year 0-5 ... The Green & White have failed to score in the 2003 season and have been outscored 14-0 in five games ... Dave Weibe and Lavel Williams were both named to the Greensboro All-Tournament team ... Both also earned All-Tournament honors at Ohio Wesleyan to start the season ... The Bison will try to get their first win of the season and continue their unbeaten streak against Thiel this week ... Bethany is 8-0 all-time against the Tomcats.

#### Wash. & Jeff. Presidents

W&J opened its PAC schedule by handing Bethany a 2-0 loss in Bethany, W.Va., on Wednesday afternoon ... Sophomore forward Mike Chiodo scored both Washington & Jefferson goals as the Presidents stretched their unbeaten streak versus the Bison to four games (3-0-1) ... Senior Brad Guinn and junior Mike Garet combined to make eight saves for W&J ... Allegheny stormed into Cameron Stadium and shut out Washington & Jefferson, 3-0, on Saturday ... The Gators scored two goals off Guinn in the first half and converted a penalty kick in the second half to ensure the win ... Guinn notched just one save in the loss ... AC outshot the Presidents by a 13-5 margin.

### Grove City Wolverines

Grove City split a pair of matches in the Wolverines' final tune-up for conference play last week ... Four different players scored in the win at Pitt-Bradford as Dustin King and Dan Bryan each picked up two assists in the win ... Goalkeeper Joel Gladfelter secured his first collegiate win with a pair of saves in 85 minutes ... Grove City held a 2-0 lead less than 20 minutes into the match ... Frosh Bob McNees scored his second collegiate goal in Saturday's setback at Pitt-Greensburg ... He currently leads the team with two goals as seven different players have scored goals this year ... The Wolverines open the home schedule and PAC play Wednesday against Waynesburg.

#### Waynesburg Yellow Jackets

Waynesburg dropped its first game of the year against NAIA-opponent Malone, 3-1, on the road ... Ross Philips netted the Jackets' lone goal on an assist from Luke Benton, giving Waynesburg a 1-0 lead in the 26<sup>th</sup> minute ... Senior goalkeeper Justin Fee recorded 10 saves despite surrendering three goals ... Malone would go on to outshoot the Jackets, 14-12, scoring two goals in the first half and an insurance goal in the second.

#### Thiel Tomcats

The Tomcats dropped three games last week ... They fell to Pitt-Greensburg 0-5 on Wednesday before dropping a pair of contests at the Dickinson College Invitational over the weekend... Thiel trailed just 1-0 after the first 45 minutes against Pitt-Greensburg, but a four goal second half propelled the Bobcats to the win ... Senior GK David Visnicky finished with nine saves in the loss ... The Tomcats went into the half tied with SUNY-Oswego 2-2, but a pair of Oswego second half goals were enough for the win ... Freshman Steve Haylett tallied the Tomcats' first score and junior Evan Knox used a Haylett assist to put the Tomcats up 2-1 ... Visnicky made five saves in the loss.

#### Westminster Titans

The Titan kickers dropped a pair of nonconference contests last week, falling at Mount Union 3-1 on Wednesday before suffering a 3-2 setback to Thomas More in their home opener on Saturday ... Senior Todd Fisher scored the Ione Westminster goal in the loss to the Purple Raiders, while classmate Kevin Humberston made three saves in goal in the loss ... Against TMC, the Saints broke a 1-1 halftime tie with two penalty kick goals in a 90-second span early in the second half ... Freshman Blake Ordell scored off an assist by junior Sebastian Driver-Salazar, while senior Matt Roser tallied a goal off an assist by junior Chris Castillo ... Humberston made four saves against Thomas More.
