PAC Men's Soccer Player of the Week

NIKOLA VASILEV Thiel College

Sophomore forward Varna, Bulgaria/First Language School

Vasilev posted the second hat trick of his collegiate career after scoring all three goals in a 3-2 PAC win over Thomas More Thursday, as he became Thiel's all-time leader in goals (24) and points (54) after just two seasons. The Tomcats were 1-0-1 in PAC action last week.

Other nominees included sophomore GK **Kosta Floros** of Bethany, junior B **Brendan McCommas** of Grove City, junior MF **Mike Seminerio** of Washington & Jefferson, and junior D **Todd Atwood** of Westminster.

Bethany Bison

The Bison dropped their third in a row at the start of the week but rebounded to blank Westminster to gain some momentum heading to the PAC Tournament ... Although the Bison lost to W&J, they outshot the Presidents 11-10

and had three shots in a 15-minute span bang off the cross bar in the second half ... Unable to convert, Bethany then watched W&J seal the win with a PK in the 89th minute ... BC snapped the losing streak with a 1-0 triumph over Westminster Saturday ... The lone score came in the 74th minute when Aston Duporte finished an assist from Ramon Franklyn ... GK Kosta Floros made five saves in the match to record his eighth shutout of the season ... The Bison play at Grove City in a PAC semifinal Wednesday.



Thiel Tomcats

Thiel closed out their 2005 season on a positive note, posting a 1-0-1 mark last week...the squad battled Grove City to a 0-0 double-overtime draw on Monday before taking down Thomas More 3-2 on Thursday ... Sophomore GK Ryan Lewis totaled 11 saves in his fourth ca-

reer shutout against TMC ... Sophomore F Nikola Vasilev tallied his second career hat trick in the Tomcats' victory over Thomas More ... He finished the season with 22 points (9 G, 4 A) ... After two seasons Vasilev is the program's all-time leader in goals (24) and points (54) ... Lewis recorded seven saves in the TMC win.



Grove City Wolverines

Grove City is the No. 2 seed in this week's PAC Championship Tournament after going 1-1-1 in conference play last week ... The Wolverines opened the week with a 0-0 draw at Thiel ... Grove City outshot Thiel, 17-4, but

could not break the deadlock ... Michael Manahan had three saves in goal ... Wednesday at Waynesburg, the Wolverines posted their sixth consecutive shutout in PAC play in a 1-0 win ... Bob McNees scored the game-winning goal at 21:26 ... Brendan McCommas had the assist while Manahan made three saves ... The shutout string ended at Washington and Jefferson Saturday as the Presidents earned a 2-0 win ... The Presidents outshot Grove City, 12-3 ... Manahan recorded four saves.



Thomas More Saints

Thomas More had their season come to end with a win over Bluffton ... Freshman Kyle Morris and David Megel

each scored two goals this week as the Saints finished their inaugural PAC season at 3-7-1 ... Senior Eric Busener finished his career with two goals and six assists on the season, and was second on the team in points ... Morris led the team with 15 points, scoring a team-high seven goals with one assist. Two other seniors - Kris Weber and Nick Boorom - completed their collegiate eligibility.



Washington & Jefferson Presidents

The Presidents set a new school record for wins in season (14) after posting 2-0 victories over Bethany and Grove City this week ... W&J, which was listed as receiving votes in the latest Mid-Atlantic Region Poll, also shattered the school record for PAC victories with 11 ... Junior MF Mike Seminerio had a hand in three of the four Presi-

dent goals this week with two goals, including both game winners, and one assist ... Freshman GK Tyler Hodgins upped his season shutout total to nine after totaling four saves in the two wins ... W&J has recorded eight shutouts in its last 10 outings and Hodgins has allowed only two goals in his last 916:49 ... Freshman MF Ryan McDonald also scored on a penalty kick vs. BC, while junior F Brian Witkovitz netted a goal against GCC in the first half.



Waynesburg Yellow Jackets

Waynesburg lost its final regular season contest of the season on Tuesday when it dropped a 1-0 contest to Grove City ... The Wolverines scored the lone goal of the game in the 21st minute despite attempting 23 shots ... Freshman GK Brad Davis registered 10 saves in 90 minutes of action ... In his first four collegiate starts, Davis has

posted 10-plus saves in three times ... Senior F Luke Benton, the lone senior on this season's team, led the Yellow Jackets with a team-best six shots in his final collegiate contest ... Benton has recorded career-highs with five assists and 15 points this season, while also adding five goals ... Six of Waynesburg's 12 losses this season were by just one goal, including four during conference play.





Westminster closed the regular season with a pair of PAC road losses, falling at Thomas More (4-2) on Tuesday and Bethany (1-0) on Saturday ... Despite the losses, Westminster managed to hang on to the fourth and final seed for this week's PAC Championship tournament ... The fourth-seeded Titans play at top-seeded Washington & Jefferson in one semifinal on Wednesday at 7 p.m. ... Westminster is the last PAC team to capture the conference title before the two-time defending PAC champion Presidents, as the Titans de-

feated W&J in overtime in New Wilmington to capture the conference crown in 2002.
