2012 Presidents' Athletic Conference Football – Week One News & Notes

Despite falling in a 56-53 shootout Saturday afternoon at Frostburg State, Geneva junior quarterback **Zack Hayward** put together one of the best single-game efforts in Presidents' Athletic Conference history ... Hayward finished with conference single-game highs in passing yardage (535), total yardage (574) and passing touchdowns (7) ... His 39 completions rank second all-time ... Bethany junior quarterback **Matt Grimard** threw two touchdown passes against Centre to give him 30 for his career, third-most all-time at Bethany ... Grimard is 104 yards away from becoming just the fourth quarterback in Bison history to reach 4,000 career passing yards ... Thiel senior defensive end **Tim Taylor** is just nine sacks shy of breaking the school's all-time mark ... Saint Vincent senior wide receiver **Ricky Douglas** enters Saturday's game against Wooster needing just four catches and 214 yards to take over the modern-day records in each respective category ... the current Bearcat records are held by

former wide receiver **Sheldon Loughner** ... Westminster senior wide receiver **Geno Pasquinelli** finished with six receptions for 81 yards and a touchdown in the Titans' 28-0 shutout of Hiram Saturday night, passing **Lamont Boykins '83** for seventh on the school's all-time receptions list with 116 career receptions ... Saturday's season-opening shutout was the first for Westminster since 1992, when they blanked Allegheny 20-0.

Bethany looked poised to go in tied at halftime with Centre, but the Colonels scored with 2 seconds to go and pulled away in the 2nd half for a 42-21 victory ... The Bison took the lead first with an impressive opening drive capped off by a 13-yard touchdown run by RB **Phil Acrie** ... After Centre put 2 TDs on the board, BC tied the game on a 6-yard scoring pass from **Matt Grimard** to WR **Eric Blinn** with 40 seconds left ... Centre scored the next 3 touchdowns before the Bison hit the end zone again on a 19-yard TD toss from Grimard to **Marcus D'Aguiar-Alexander** ... The Colonels answered right back with the final TD of the game and they finished the game with a 452-248 advantage in total yards ... Senior safety **Simeon Young** posted a career-high 12 tackles to pace the Bison defense ... Grimard threw for 138 yards and 2 scores, with 4 passes going to WR **Ed Holmes** ... Those receptions have Holmes at 100 for his career, making him just the eighth player in Bethany history to reach that milestone ... D'Aguiar-Alexander, whose last 2 seasons have been shortened by injury, caught 2 passes for 24 yards and also had a 34-yard kickoff return.

Geneva College Golden Tornadoes

The Geneva football record book for 2012 hasn't even left the printer yet but changes are already coming for 2013 ... In a football game that resembled more of a track meet, Geneva and Frostburg combined for 106 points in the highest scoring game in school history ... Junior quarterback **Zack Hayward** is most likely somewhere on campus icing his arm after the most impressive passing game in 121 years of Geneva football ... Hayward completed 39-49 passes for an unthinkable 535 yards and seven touchdown ... Four different receivers caught at least six passes with **Corey O'Patchen** (141 yards) and **Josh Guiser** (132 yards) leading the way through the air ... Guiser scored on a seven yard reception with just 1:14 remaining in the fourth quarter ... The Bobcats answered with the game winning touchdown with just ten seconds remaining in regulation for an early season heartbreak ... In a game that saw the defense allow 56 points, it was senior **Brett Hutira** that more than stood out for Geneva ... Hutira posted 20 tackles, the sixth highest single game total in school history ... Geneva will look for its first victory on Saturday when it travels to nationally-ranked Hobart College.

Grove City College Wolverines

Grove City opened the 2012 season Saturday with a 23-20 setback at Carnegie Mellon ... The game featured six lead changes along with a 1 hour, 50 minute weather delay in the fourth quarter ... Grove City, the conference's least-penalized team in 2011, did not commit a penalty in the game ... Wide receiver **Anthony Ritchie** caught seven passes for 82 yards and two touchdowns ... Five Grove City receivers caught multiple passes ... Defensively, the Wolverines forced four fumbles and recovered two ... **Chris Gibbs** led the Wolverines with 12 tackles while **Marc Shamley** had a sack ... Grove City owned a nine-minute edge in time of possession and a 22-15 edge in first downs ... The Wolverines have dropped four straight to CMU by a total of 17 points.

Saint Vincent College Bearcats

The Bearcats were outgained on the ground 180-87 in a 23-7 season-opening defeat against Bridgewater (Va.) ... For the game, the Eagles held a substantial 36:24-23:36 advantage in time of possession ... The teams were scoreless at the half before Bridgewater found the end zone twice in the third quarter through the air. SVC cut the deficit to 14-7 with a one-yard pass from sophomore **Andy Borgen** to classmate **David Emmanuel** with 12:50 left in the fourth quarter, but a safety and Bridgewater touchdown run on the ensuing possession put the game out of reach ... In the loss, senior WR **Ricky Douglas** caught five passes for 88 yards to move past the 1,000-yard mark for his career.

Thiel College Tomcats

The Tomcats suffered a heartbreaking 16-13 loss to the Juniata Eagles Saturday in their 2012 season opener at Alumni Stadium ... The Tomcats held a 7-6 halftime lead thanks to **Taylor Fink** 6-yard touchdown run early in the second quarter ... The Thiel defense held the Eagles to a pair of field goals in the first half, one from 28 yards and the other from 26 yards ... The Tomcat offense embarked on an 8-play, 67-yard drive to open the third quarter ... The drive culminated with Fink's second touchdown run of the game, this one on a 1-yard plunge ... The extra point was no good, but the Tomcats held a 13-6 lead ... Juniata tied up the contest, 13-13, late in the third quarter on a one-yard run by quarterback **Ward Udinski** ... The Eagles earned the eventual game-winning points on the toe of **Scott Andrews**, who booted a 27-yard field goal with 4:56 remaining in regulation ... Thiel's offense had two more drives down the stretch but neither resulted in any points.



Thomas More College Saints

The 20th-ranked Saints fell, 13-7, to 11th-ranked St. John Fisher in overtime in their season-opener ... It was Thomas More's eighth overtime game in the program's 23-year history and first since the 2006 season ... Thomas More got its seven points when sophomore quarterback **Luke Magness** connected on a six-yard pass to sophomore running back **Devin Kendrick** with 10:18 to play in the second quarter and junior place kicker **Tim Gormly, Jr.** added the PAT ... The Saints were led offensively by Magness, who was 12-of-23 passing for 85 yards and one touchdown and had 11 rushes for 11 yards and junior running back **Domonique Hayden**, who had 12 carries for 17 yards and two catches for 29 yards ... Senior wide receiver **Tony Bell** had five catches for 25 yards and sophomore running back **Landon Savoy** finished the game with three carries and 17 yards ... Freshman linebacker **Nick Pennekamp** led the Saints' defense with 10 tackles ... Junior defensive back **Alex Taylor** had eight and half tackles and one force fumble, senior linebacker **Elijah Anglim** finished with seven tackles, while sophomore defensive lineman **Erick Butler** had six and a half tackles and one sack.



Washington & Jefferson College Presidents


Washington & Jefferson opened the 2012 season with a 23-6 victory over Methodist ... The win marked the first-ever victory against a team from the state of North Carolina for the Presidents ... Senior running back **Tim McNerney** ran for 91 yards and two touchdowns ... Junior quarterback **Matt Bliss** racked up 232 yards on 21-of-31 passing and tossed one touchdown ... Senior **Hunter Creel** caught his fifth career touchdown pass ... Junior **Alex Baroffio** topped all PAC wide receivers with 11 receptions, the most by a President in a season opener in the 121-year history of the program ... The Presidents outgained the Monarchs 358-277 ... W&J did not turn the ball over for the second-straight game dating back to last year ... The team had not gone two consecutive games without a turnover since Oct. 4 and Oct. 18, 2008 against Geneva and Saint Vincent ... Junior defensive back **B.J. Monacelli** led the defense with five tackles, a forced fumble and an interception ... Senior linebacker **John Hunter** returned a fumble 63 yards to set up the Presidents second touchdown early in the second half ... Senior safety **Nathan Melhorn** paced all W&J tacklers with eight stops, including one for loss ... The game was played in extreme heat (108 heat index) and without a scoreboard or play clocks during the entire second half due to a power outage.



Waynesburg University Yellow Jackets


The Waynesburg University football team ended a two-game losing streak in season openers by beating Muskingum 34-23 ... The Yellow Jackets out-scored the Muskies 20-0 in the fourth quarter to pull off the come-from-behind victory ... Junior **Bertrand Ngampa** led all rushers with 91 yards and a touchdown on 12 carries, one of which was a 40-yard score ... The Waynesburg offense cranked out 223 yards rushing, while the Jacket defense held the Muskies to 113 yards on the ground ... Junior defensive end **Brandon Fedorka** picked up 2.5 tackles for loss as part of a five-tackle day ... Junior **Bryan Gary** posted a team-high seven tackles, six of which were solo stops, and intercepted his first pass of the season ... First-year junior kicker **Alex Henry** connected on all four extra-point tries and knocked in two field goals, including a 39-yarder.



Westminster College Titans

Westminster's 28-0 win over Hiram marked the third-straight season opener victory over the Terriers ... This was the first time that the Titans opened the season with a shutout win since 1992, when they blanked Allegheny 20-0 ... On Saturday, junior running back **Tyler Banks** scored a career-high two touchdowns...Banks, who rushed 19 times for 50 yards, scored on a pair of 2-yard touchdown runs ... Junior **Dak Britt** connected with senior **Geno Pasquinelli** for a 43-yard touchdown pass in the third quarter for Britt's first touchdown pass in a Titans uniform ... Britt finished the game with 154 yards (14-for-25), two touchdowns, and an interception... The Tiffin transfer also had a game-high 52 yards on the ground off eight carries ... Pasquinelli led the Titans with six receptions for 81 yards and a touchdown and passed **Lamont Boykins** '83 for seventh all-time with 116 career receptions ... Westminster's final score against Hiram might have been the most impressive with an 18-play-98 yard drive ... The Titan defense was stout and only gave up 10 yards of rushing and picked off Hiram three times ... Senior **Derrick Orloski** led Westminster with eight and a half tackles, including a team-high two tackles for a loss...Freshman **Steve Ferringer** followed with five tackles ... Senior **Kyle Allen** blocked a Hiram field goal attempt in the second quarter.
