The final victory of the break was a 3-2 win over John Carroll, as Hensley picked up the win and OF **Chelsea Hall** had two hits, including a double, and two RBIs ... SS **Ashley Marinacci** led BC's offense with a .321 average, including four doubles and two RBIs ... 1B **Nikki Gillis** batted .303 and scored 10 runs, while DH **Kara O'Dell** had a homer and six RBIs.



Grove City Wolverines

McKinney posted the second-highest average on the team (.409) with three RBIs and a .500 slugging percentage ... Snyder went 13-for-33 (.394) with a team-high six RBIs, while Smith went 12-for-33 (.364) with five RBIs.
