Freshman - individual medley/breaststroke Mount Lebanon, Pa./Mount Lebanon

In a wins over PAC rival Grove City last week, Orstein posted new school records and "A" cut times in the 100 breaststroke (1:04.96) and 200 IM (2:06.62), while helping a winning W&J relay team set a "B" cut time. She became the first President in 10 years to reach an "A" cut time, while her 200 IM time shattered a 10-year old school record by nearly eight seconds and her 100 breaststroke time broke the old mark by 3.5 seconds.

Also nominated was senior **Christine Bare** of Grove City and sophomore **Sara Bonchosky** of Westminster.

The Bethany men and women both dropped PAC contests to Washington & Jefferson last week ... The Bison men fell by a 135-75 score, while the Bison women were defeated 132-51 by W&J ... Bethany swimming & diving will travel to Frostburg State on Wednesday before hosting NAIA member St. Vincent on Saturday.

Washington & Jefferson Presidents

Freshman Kaitlyn Orstein started her W&J career by qualifying for the NCAA Division III Championships in three events Saturday versus Grove City ... Orstein, a transfer from the University of Tennessee and the daughter of W&J Head Coach Mike Orstein, swam the third leg of W&J's victory in the 200 medley relay to open the meet, which qualified for the NCAA "B" Cut (1:51.81) ... Orstein also became the first W&J swimmer to qualify for the NCAA "A" Cut since Cindy Alexander accomplished the feat in 1994 ... Orstein swam the NCAA qualifying time in both the 100 breaststroke (1:04.96) and 200 IM (2:06.62) ... Her time in the 200 IM shattered a 10-year-old school record by nearly eight seconds, while her 100 breastroke time broke the school mark by 3.5 seconds ... Sophomore Brandi Shoupe captured the 100 butterfly (1:02.80), while senior Kristina Springborn earned first place in the 100 backstroke (1:04.29) ... Sophomore Brian Train was a triple winner for the W&J men as he claimed the 100 butterfly (55.30) and the 200 IM (2:06.31), while leading the 200 medley relay.

Westminster swept Rollins College in Winter Park, Fla., on Jan. 8, then dropped dual meets at Carnegie Mellon Saturday ... Sophomore Ryan Trunk led the way for the Titan men at Rollins with a pair of individual wins, as he captured both the 100 (49.28) and 200 freestyle (1:49.13) ... Two Westminster women were triple-winners against the Tars: sophomore Sara Bonchosky won the 200 (2:00.87) and 500 freestyle (5:31.90) while anchoring the winning 200 freestyle relay, while classmate Megan McLaughlin touched first in both the 50 (25.88) and 100 freestyle (55.81) while anchoring the victorious 200 medley relay ... Three Westminster women were double winners against the Tartans: Bonchosky won both the 200 (1:59.88) and 500 freestyle (5:22.06); freshman Becky Giles touched first in both the 200 breaststroke (2:33.28) and the 400 individual medley (4:40.60), while classmate Steph Peters captured both the 50 (25.78) and 100 freestyle (56.22).
