Grove City split a pair of non-conference matches last week, including a 3-0 win over Lake Erie in the home opener Friday night ... Kate DiMarco and Carlie Roberts each had 10 kills in the victory ... Melissa Lawton had a team-high 21 digs and served three aces ... Kelly Tinney had a dozen kills against Mount Union last Tuesday night while Rachel Peterson had 21 digs ... Setter Sarah Davison combined for 62 assists during the two matches ... Grove City is 4-2, the Wolverines' best start since 1999 ... Grove City does not play at home again until Sept. 28.

# Waynesburg Yellow Jackets

The Yellow Jackets earned their first win of the season in the opening match of the Wittenberg Invitational, but then dropped matches to Mt. Union and host Wittenberg ... Waynesburg won in three sets over Wilmington behind 13 kills and 8 digs from junior Brittany Morrow ... Junior Kimberly Wilson recorded a team-high 18 kills and 18 digs in the loss to Mt. Union, while sophomore Teia Suder posted 17 kills and 3 blocks ... Wittenberg entered their tournament as the No. 3 ranked team in Division III by AVCA. Kaci Hlad garnered first-team all-tournament honors at the Wittenberg Invitational, as she averaged 2.7 blocks per match 8.7 kills per game ...
