PAC Volleyball Player of the Week

KIMBERLY WILSON Waynesburg College

5-11 senior outside hitter McMurray, Pa./Peters Township H.S.

Wilson led the Yellow Jackets to sole possession of first place in the PAC with conference victories over Thiel (3-0) and Thomas More (3-1). She posted a season-high 17 kills and added 10 digs for her eighth "double double" of the season against the Saints, while adding nine kills, four digs and two blocks in the sweep of the Tomcats.

Also nominated was sophomore OH Lauren Spegal of Bethany, freshman MH Natalie Liberati of Grove City, senior OH Lakia Gordon of Washington & Jefferson, and senior MH Katie McDermott of Westminster.

Bethany Bison

Bethany split a pair of PAC matches last week, which included a win at Thiel for the Bison's first conference win of the year ... BC dropped their fourth in a row to begin the week with a 3-0 loss against W&J ... Lauren Spegal recorded seven

kills and **Linzy Turner** had six kills and three aces in the setback ... The Bison then snapped their five-game losing streak in the conference with a 3-0 triumph over the Tomcats ... Spegal led the way with 13 kills and 10 blocks, including seven solos ... Turner contributed 12 kills and eight digs, while **Brittany Vavrek** gave out 27 assists ... **Angelina Allen** added six kills and 18 digs, while **Amanda Bashioum** posted seven kills and six blocks, including five solos.



Thiel Tomcats

The Tomcats dropped a pair of conference matches, falling in straight sets at Waynesburg Tuesday and in straight sets at home to Bethany Thursday ... Sophomore OH Molly Klink finished with 12 kills while freshman LIB Keri Zeleznick and sophomore OH Stephanie Monus added

17 and 12 digs, respectively ... Junior S **Erin Plaso** finished with 22 assists ... Against Bethany, sophomore OH **Olivia Rogers** finished with 11 kills and seven digs ... Klink totaled seven kills and a teaamhigh 22 digs, while Monus added seven kills, 17 digs and five blocks ... Plaso had 23 assists, while Zeleznick finished with 21 digs.



Grove City Wolverines

Grove City went 3-1 last week, including a come-from-behind victory over Westminster Tuesday ... Grove City rallied from a 2-0 deficit to claim its first win over the Lady Titans in 10 seasons ... **Natalie Liberati** led GCC with

19 kills, while junior **Carlie Roberts** added 13 kills and nine blocks ... Setter **Kim Walsh** had 52 assists ... It was Grove City's first fivegame victory this year ... Sophomore **Jennifer Plyler** had eight kills in Grove City's 3-0 loss at W&J Thursday ... The Wolverines earned two non-conference wins Saturday at Lake Erie ... Grove City swept the hosts before taking a 3-0 win from La Roche ... Liberati and Roberts both had nine kills against Lake Erie while Plyler added eight kills and 10 digs ... Roberts posted 13 kills vs. La Roche.



Thomas More Saints

The Saints lost both of their PAC games this week, bringing their record to 3-3 in the conference ... Senior

Jody Clyde led the team in kills in three of the five matches, including a 19-kill performance against Averett ... She was also the lone Saint named to the All-Tournament team ... Senior Laura Wiegele has now recorded at least 10 digs in 95 straight games ... Sophomore Valeri Kuhn distributed 215 assists this week for an average of 11.9 assists per game ... Thomas More will look to snap a three-match losing streak in PAC play this weekend.



Washington & Jefferson Presidents

W&J's win streak reached nine matches last week as the Presidents rolled off 3-0 victories over Bethany, Grove City and Chatham ... Senior LIB Anne Reynolds will become just the 30th player in W&J history to record 2,000 digs in a career with one this upcoming week ... Senior OH Lakia Gordon and junior MH Taryn Terchanik com-

bined for 15 kills and three service aces in the win at Bethany ... Gordon then slammed home 17 kills, while adding eight digs and two service aces in the home victory over Grove City Thursday ... Senior MH Rebecca Fletcher added 10 kills, seven blocks and two aces ... Sophomore OH Katie Barned totaled a game-high nine kills Saturday as W&J cruised past Chatham ... Sophomore Gabby Zagari also had seven kills and nine digs.



Waynesburg Yellow Jackets

The Yellow Jackets extended their longest win streak of the season to five games this week with victories over PAC rivals Thiel and Thomas More ... Against the Saints, **Kimberly Wilson** posted a team-high 17 kills and **Laurie Linder** added 14 as Waynesburg won in four games Thursday ... **Kaci Hlad** and **Lorelle Marker** added 12 and 10

kills, respectively ... Lauren Freeman had a team-high 28 digs, while Brittany Morrow had three blocks ... Against the Tomcats, Linder led the offense with 10 kills, while Hlad and Wilson added nine kills each ... Sophomore Ashley Kreinbrook paced the defense with a team-high 13 digs, while Freeman and Jessica Zangla contributed 11 and 10 digs, respectively.





Westminster went 2-3 last week ... The Lady Titans dropped a five-game heartbreaker at Grove City Tuesday, then went 2-2 over the weekend at the Thomas More Invitational including a four-game PAC win over the host Saints ... Against GCC, senior OH **Erin Hinks** led the team with 19 kills and three service aces in the loss, followed by junior MH **Katie McDermott** with 18 kills ... In the PAC win over Thomas More, Hinks and McDermott tallied 14 kills apiece ... Sophomore MH **Jessica Cooper** added 10 kills and a pair of solo blocks

... Junior **Rachael Cooper** set up 43 assists, while sophomore LIB **Hannah Parker** added 20 digs ... Hinks again led the Lady Titan attack in a sweep of Averett with 16 kills, followed by McDermott with 10 kills, 15 digs and a team-best five total blocks.
