The Bison fell twice in conference play last week and stand at 1-7 in the PAC ... Westminster swept Bethany in New Wilmington last Wednesday ... Linzy Turner and Lauren Spegal each had nine kills and Brittany Vavrek had 29 as-

sists in the setback ... BC then lost a five-set thriller to visiting Grove City Thursday ... Bethany opened the match by taking the first two games, but GCC rebounded to win the final three, including a 15-12 win in the deciding set ... Spegal had 15 kills and eight blocks, including six solos ... **Angelina Allen** recorded 12 kills and 17 digs and Vavrek gave out 45 assists ... Bethany hits the road for three league matches this week, traveling to Waynesburg, W&J and Thomas More.



Thiel Tomcats

Thiel dropped all five of its matches last week, including three against conference opponents ... The Tomcats suffered a 3-1 loss at W&J on Tuesday before falling at home to Westminster 3-0 on Thursday...at Saturday's Ohio Wesleyan Tri-Match they fell to Earlham 3-0 and to the

host Battling Bishops 3-0 ... Thomas More posted a 3-0 win at Beeghly Gymnasium Sunday afternoon ... On the week sophomore OH **Molly Klink** finished with 32 kills, 48 digs and nine blocks while sophomore OH **Stephanie Monus** added 20 kills, 45 digs and four blocks ... Freshman S **Stephanie Lardo** tallied 78 assists, 40 digs, 15 kills and 14 blocks in the five matches.



Grove City Wolverines

Grove City's hopes of earning one of the four spots in the season-ending PAC Tournament took a hit last week as Grove City dropped a pair of home matches ... Tuesday, Waynesburg swept Grove City by eight total points ...

The 38-36 scored in the second game of that match is the highestscoring game in GCC history ... Freshman **Natalie Liberati** had 20 kills for Grove City while S **Kim Walsh** had 48 assists ... Walsh had 57 assists in Grove City's come-from-behind win at Bethany Thursday ... **Carlie Roberts** had 17 kills while **Emily Rossol** recorded 29 digs ... Liberati had 14 kills against Thomas More Saturday afternoon ... Roberts added 12 kills and eight blocks ... The Wolverines will advance to the PAC Tournament by winning out.



Thomas More Saints

The Saints went 3-0 this week, losing just one set, as they ran their win streak to four matches ... The win Saturday

over Grove City broke a 3-game Presidents' Athletic Conference losing skid for Thomas More ... Senior **Mary Lape** had a huge weekend for TMC as she recorded 48 kills in 105 attempts ... She added 12 blocks (2 solo and 10 assists), averaging 1.2 blocks per game ... Sophomore **Valeri Kuhn** distributed 125 assists, while senior **Laura Wiegele** had 54 digs in the three matches.



Washington & Jefferson Presidents

Senior LIB **Anne Reynolds** became the 30th student-athlete in NCAA Division III history to amass 2,000 digs in a career during a 3-1 victory over Thiel on Tuesday ... Reynolds has now totaled 2,061 career digs through Saturday's matches ... Senior OH **Lakia Gordon** paced the Presidents with 21 kills and four aces against Thiel, while

senior MH **Rebecca Fletcher** chipped in with 11 kills and six blocks ... In the loss to the Yellow Jackets, which snapped the Presidents' nine-match win streak, junior OH **Stacie Ley** had a team-high 21 kills, while Gordon added 13 kills and 14 digs ... Fletcher racked up 16 kills and four digs in the E&H victory, while junior MH **Taryn Terchanik** posted 15 kills and five blocks ... Senior OH **Megan Goodman** finished with 12 kills and three service aces.



Westminster Titans

Westminster won two fo three PAC matches last week, posting 3-0 sweeps of Bethany and Thiel before being swept by Thomas More ... Senior OH **Erin Hinks** and sophomore MH **Danielle Hogue** led a balanced attack with nine kills apiece vs. Bethany, followed by junior MH **Katie McDermott** with eight kills ... Junior **Rachael Cooper** set up 31 assists, while sophomore **Jenna Hinks** served up a team-best five aces and freshman LIB **Kylene Hoch** added four aces and a team-best 17 digs ... Erin Hinks led the way at Thiel with 16 kills,

followed by sophomore OH **Diana Conzett** with 11 kills ... Sophomore MH **Jessica Cooper** led the squad with seven total blocks (one solo, six assisted) ... In the loss to TMC, Erin Hinks had a teamhigh eight kills while Hogue added four blocks.



Waynesburg Yellow Jackets

Waynesburg extended its win streak to eight matches with three wins this week, including PAC victories over Grove City and W&J ... Against the Wolverines, freshman **Laurie Linder** posted a career-high 23 kills and a .611 attack percentage, while senior **Kimberly Wilson** registered 19 kills and nine digs in the sweep ... LIB **Lauren Free**-

man paced the Yellow Jackets with 22 digs Tuesday against GCC ... The Jackets hosted the Presidents and Emory & Henry Saturday ... Waynesburg registered a four-game victory over W&J to take sole possession of first place in the PAC standings ... Wilson finished the match with 15 kills and 15 digs for her ninth double-double of the season, while Freeman posted an impressive 31 digs ...
