Bethany Bison

Bethany's season came to an end last week with four losses ... After dropping a 3-0 decision at D-II Pitt-Johnstown, the Bison fell 3-0 at Saint Vincent, at Waynesburg and versus Carnegie Mellon ... In the UP-J loss, junior

Lauren Spegal tallied 20 kills and 13 digs, while senior Linzy Turner notched 10 kills and 30 digs ... Senior Amanda Bashioum led BC with 11 kills in the Saint Vincent setback ... Spegal totaled double digit kills against Waynesburg (10) and Carnegie Mellon (13) to give her 896 for her career and move past Robin Sayre (888) for fifth place on the BC all-time list ... Her 319 kills this season is also the eight-most in Bethany single-season history ... Other Bison recording high single-season totals were S Kim McKay with 714 assists (eighth) and senior Angelina Allen with 647 digs (eighth).



Thiel Tomcats

The Tomcats closed their 2006 season with four losses last week to end with an overall record of 8-20 ... Freshman OH **LaToya Locke** posted 45 kills over the week with 15 digs coming over two matches ... Senior **Erin Plaso** handed out 67 assists over the week with 24 digs ... Against

Washington & Jefferson, **Kristen Martin** had 35 assists while **Leah Snyder** came up with 12 digs.



Washington & Jefferson Presidents

The Presidents ended the regular season with 10 victories in their final 11 matches ... Senior S Jamie Gullen fueled a come-from-behind win over Waynesburg Thursday with 55 assists, 13 digs, nine kills and five blocks ... Senior OH Amanda Williamson posted 12 kills and classmate Stacie Ley racked up 33 digs ... Junior OH

Gabby Zagari finished with a team-high 14 kills, while senior MH **Taryn Terchanik** and junior MH **Beth Mihalik** added 13 and eight kills, respectively ... Mihalik posted a team-high 12 kills and three blocks in the win at Thiel on Tuesday ... Zagari added 10 kills and nine digs, while Ley reversed her totals with nine kills and 10 digs ... Gullen supplied 39 assists, six digs, four kills and three aces.



Westminster Titans

Westminster won its final three PAC matches of the season last week to lock up the top seed in this weekend's PAC championships ... The Titans topped Grove City (3-1) and Thiel (3-0) on the road Tuesday and Thursday, before defeating Thomas More (3-1) at home Saturday ... The Titans finished the week 3-1 after losing to future PAC team Saint Vincent (1-3) Saturday ... Senior MH Katie McDermott averaged 3.07 kills and 0.80 blocks per game to lead the Titan hitters last week ... McDermott and sophomore Rachel

Terzak led Westminster with 16 kills apiece in Tuesday's pivotal win at Grove City ... **Danielle Hogue** had 15 kills to lead the charges at Thiel, while **Diana Conzett** batted 16 kills for the team high vs. Thomas More ... Westminster is eyeing its first PAC title since 2002.



Grove City Wolverines

Grove City sewed up the No. 3 seed in this week's PAC Championship Tournament with a 3-2 win over Thomas More on Senior Night ... It is Grove City's first-ever win over TMC ... Natalie Liberati posted 16 kills while Heather

Fraiz added 15 kills ... Kim Walsh set 54 assists against TMC ... The victory gave Grove City its first 20-win season since 2001 ... That year represents Grove City's last PAC title and last postseason berth (ECAC title) ... Tuesday night, Westminster completed a season sweep of Grove City, 3-1, at the GCC Arena ... Westminster pulled out a 31-29 win in the decisive third game en route to the win ... Carlie Roberts recorded 12 kills and four blocks for Grove City ... Liberati had 11 kills and five blocks against Westminster.



Thomas More Saints

Thomas More ended the regular season with three losses this weekend, all to PAC foes ... The Saints enter the

2006 PAC tournament as a four seed and will face host Westminster Friday ... Thomas More has qualified for the tournament in each of its two seasons in the PAC ... Freshman **Leslie Hoelscher** recorded 14 total blocks this week bringing her total to a TMC single-season record of 160 ... The old record of 155 was set by **Beth Rechtin** in 1991 ... Hoelscher also holds the single-season solo block record of 48 ... She is five block assists away from that single-season mark ... Hoelscher had a team-high 52 kills this week and a hitting percentage of .280 ... Junior **Jenny Schutte** eclipsed the 1,000-dig plateau and now has 1,055 for her career.



Waynesburg Yellow Jackets

The Yellow Jackets opened the week with two losses before posting 3-0 victories over Bethany and Thiel on Saturday to close out the season ... In a 3-0 loss to Saint Vincent Monday, sophomore **Laurie Lindner** posted

14 kills and 18 digs, while **Ashley Kreinbrook** led the team with 21 digs ... In a five-game loss to Washington & Jefferson, Lindner registered another kill/dig double-double with 17 kills and 21 digs ... Kreinbrook added 19 digs and 10 kills ... In the tri-match victory over the Bison, Lindner had 15 kills and 22 digs ... **Mary Beth Crouch** and **Kaci Hlad** each netted 10 digs in the win ... The Yellow Jackets closed the season with a 3-0 win over Thiel with Lindner posting 10 kills and **Caitie Morgan** netting 14 digs.



Saint Vincent Bearcats

The Lady Bearcats went a perfect 5-0 last week to close the regular season ... SVC extended its win streak to 19 matches, dating back to September 16 ... Westminster's 30-28 victory in game 3 of the match ended SVC's individual game win streak at 50.
