PAC Volleyball Player of the Week

KIMBERLY WILSON Waynesburg College

5-11 senior outside hitter McMurray, Pa./Peters Township H.S.

Wilson led the Yellow Jackets to a 3-0 record with PAC sweeps of Bethany and Thiel and a sweep of D-III Fairmont State last week, as Waynesburg clinched the top seed for the PAC Tournament. She posted her 11th double-double of the season with 14 kills and 21 digs vs. Fairmont, after earlier recording a 12-kill, 12-dig night against Bethany.

Also nominated was sophomore OH Lauren Spegal of Bethany, junior MH Carlie Roberts of Grove City, senior OH Jody Clyde of Thomas More, senior MH Rebecca Fletcher of Washington & Jefferson, and senior OH Erin Hinks of Westminster.

Bethany Bison

Bethany lost three PAC matches on the road last week and enter the final week of the season with an 8-18 record ... After being swept in three at Waynesburg, the Bison fell 3-1 at W&J and then lost in three hard-fought sets at Tho-

mas More ... OH Lauren Spegal led the team in kills in each match, including 12 at W&J and 11 at Thomas More ... She also had three aces against Waynesburg and four in the match at Thomas More ... Junior Linzy Turner also reached double figures in kills against W&J with an even dozen ... Senior setter Brittany Vavrek totaled 112 assists through the week ... Bethany will close out the 2005 season Monday night when it hosts Thiel.



Thiel Tomcats

Thiel fell in each of its three PAC matches last week ... The Tomcats dropped 3-0 decisions to Grove City (Tuesday), Waynesburg (Thursday) and Thomas More (Saturday) ... At Grove City sophomore OH Molly Klink finished with nine kills and 14 digs ... Junior OH Kelly Shuey to-

taled 12 kills and two blocks while junior S **Erin Plaso** added 30 assists ... Against Waynesburg sophomore OH **Olivia Rogers** and Shuey combined for 13 kills, seven digs and three blocks ... At Thomas More the Tomcats were led by Klink and sophomore OH **Stephanie Monus**, along with junior OH **Nicole Furman**, with each finishing with five kills.



Washington & Jefferson Presidents

The Presidents recorded two wins in three PAC matches last week ... W&J topped the 20-win plateau for just the sixth time in the 31-year history of the program, including its first since 1998 ... Senior MH **Rebecca Fletcher** paced W&J in the two victories as she notched 18 kills, including the 1,000th of her career, Thursday vs.

Bethany and then recorded a triple-double with 14 kills, 12 blocks and 10 digs at Thomas More Sunday ... Senior OH **Lakia Gordon** added 13 kills and 12 digs in the win over the Bison, while junior MH **Taryn Terchanik** posted 12 kills ... Junior S **Jamie Gullen** also dished out 57 assists to go with 10 digs, five kills and two blocks ... Senior LIB **Anne Reynolds** set a new career-high with 40 digs in the victory at TMC.



Westminster Titans

Westminster clinched the final berth in this week's PAC Championship tournament with a pair of 3-1 home wins over PAC foes W&J and Grove City ... Against W&J, senior OH **Erin Hinks** led the way for Westminster offensively, as she tied her season-high with 22 kills, followed by junior MH **Katie McDermott** and sophomore MH **Danielle Hogue** with nine kills apiece ... Junior **Rachael Cooper (New Castle/Laurel H.S.)** set up a team-best 38 assists ... Freshman **Kylene Hoch** had four aces, while sophomore LIB **Hannah Parker** had a

team-high 24 digs ... Hinks had 15 kills vs. GCC, followed by McDermott with 13 and Hogue and sophomore MH **Jessica Cooper** with 11 ... Rachael Cooper had 53 assists, while Hoch had seven aces and Parker posted 34 digs (all season-highs).



Grove City Wolverines

Grove City fell to 5-6 in the PAC Friday night with a 3-1 loss at Westminster ... The loss eliminated Grove City from contention for a spot in the PAC Championship Tournament ... Carlie Roberts led Grove City with 21 kills

and seven blocks while setter **Kim Walsh** had 46 assists ... **Natalie Liberati** added 11 kills and five blocks ... **Emily Rossol** posted 18 digs in the setback ... Grove City clinched a non-losing season Tuesday with a home sweep of Thiel ... Roberts had 15 kills while **Brittany Anderson** and **Katie Skinner** both had seven kills ... Walsh posted 38 assists and **Heather Fraiz** served five aces ... Rossol had 12 digs ... Anderson, **Allison Cummings**, **Jennifer Plyler**, Roberts, Rossol and Walsh have played in all 104 games this season.



Thomas More Saints

Thomas More clinched a berth in the postseason tournament with wins this weekend over Thiel and Bethany, be-

fore falling to Washington & Jefferson ... The Saints will play the Presidents in the rubber match on Friday ... Senior **Jody Clyde** produced 41 kills this weekend, including a career-high 21 in Sunday's five-set loss to W&J. She added 42 digs and 2 service aces for the Saints ... Senior **Laura Wiegele** broke the school record for most matches played following the first game of Sunday's match. She finished the regular season with 101 straight matches with 10-plus digs ... Freshman **Katie Schipp** had a career-high 21 kills as Thomas More defeated Thiel.



Waynesburg Yellow Jackets

The Yellow Jackets clinched home-court advantage for the PAC Tournament this week with wins over conference foes Bethany and Thiel, while also registering a victory over D-II Fairmont State ... With the victories, Waynesburg has posted 11 straight victories since Oct. 6 when its record stood at 8-12 ... Senior **Kimberly Wilson** paced the

Yellow Jacket offense with 12 kills, while also adding a dozen digs against Bethany ... Junior Kaci Hlad posted 15 kills and three service aces against Thiel ... **Brittany Morrow** and Wilson each closed out the home regular season schedule by registering doubledoubles in the win over Fairmont State ... In addition to her 40 assists, setter **Amanda Staudt** posted 12 digs to finish as one of five Yellow Jackets to reach double figures in digs.
