KATIE LEWANDOWSKI Waynesburg College

5-4 senior guard Pittsburgh, Pa. North Catholic H.S.

Lewandowski surpassed the career 1,000-point scoring plateau as the Yellow Jackets posted a 2-0 week with

wins over incoming PAC member Chatham (41-32) and conference rival Thiel (61-58). For the week, she averaged 16.5 points and 3.5 rebounds per game. Lewandowski recorded 15 points, six rebounds and two steals in the Chatham win. Against Thiel, she tallied a team-high 18 points (including her 1,000th point) and nailed the threepointer which put Waynesburg up for good with 6:18 left.

Also nominated was senior F Courtney Irwin of Bethany, junior C Rachel McCoy of Grove City, sophomore F Amber Bodrick of Thiel, senior F Brooke Warner of Thomas More, junior C Sarah Hunt of Washington & Jefferson, and junior F Terese Marszalek of Westminster.

recording 14 points and 14 rebounds, but GCC could not overcome 29 percent shooting ... The Wolverines owned a 48-43 edge on the glass ... Wednesday night, McCoy recorded 20 points and 10 rebounds in a 53-48 triumph at La Roche ... **Brittany Anderson** added 10 points and a career-high 18 boards ... Grove City owned a 59-29 rebounding edge over the Redhawks ... The Wolverines were just 8-of-24 at the foul line ... McCoy currently has 845 career points, good for 11th in Grove City history.



Thomas More Saints

Thomas More overcame a 18-point second half deficit to post its first PAC win of the season, beating

Westminster, 58-57 ... Sophomore **Gabby Johnson** gave the Saints the lead with six seconds left and **Kristen Humphrey** preserved the win with a steal late ... The senior duo of **Brooke Warner** and **Megan Wood** led Thomas More, combining for 27 points and 12 rebounds ... Johnson added eight points, and team-highs in assists (four) and steals (three).



Washington & Jefferson Presidents

W&J split a pair of games last week ... Wednesday, a 19-2 run by Pitt-Greensburg early in the second half proved to be the difference ... W&J fought back to tie the game, but a scorless fourminute stretch by W&J helped the Bobcats earn the win ... W&J was led by junior C **Sarah Hunt**'s

nine points, seven rebounds and four blocks ... Sophomore F Emily Hays added nine points, while freshman F Maggie Gibson collected 15 rebounds ... W&J led by double digits for over 35 minutes during its win over Saint Vincent ... The Presidents shot 63 percent and outscored the Lady Bearcats 64-8 margin ... W&J also received 50 points from its reserves, led by junior F Maria Hillenbrand's 13 points ... Hunt added 12 points, six rebounds and five blocks, while Hays and junior F Jen Rogers had 13 and 10 points, respectively.

Westminster's three top scorers were from its bench as senior Gs **Desiree Sterling** and **Nicole Fee** each scored 11 points, while freshman C **Rachel Martinko** bucketed 10 points ... Junior F **Terese Marszalek** led the Titans with seven rebounds to go with eight points ... Marszalek scored a career-high 24 points on 10-of-12 shooting

as Westminster defeated Carnegie Mellon, 66-57, Tuesday ... Ackerman and Sterling bucketed 13 and 11 points, respectively.

Waynesburg opened the New Year with a pair of victories, including a PAC win over Thiel Saturday ... Behind 15 points from senior G **Katie Lewandowski** and a careerhigh 14 points from reserve G **Sarah**

BC is 1-2 all-time against TMC after the Saints swept last year's meetings by scores of 71-57 and 71-59 ... **Lisa Mitchell** had 16 and **Courtney Irwin** scored 15 in the teams' first meeting in Kentucky ... The Bison square off with W&J for the 68th time in school history Saturday ... The Presidents extended their lead in the series to 37-30 with two wins last year, an 83-65 victory in Bethany and a 79-72 win in Washington ... Mitchell had 18 points, six assists and five rebounds in the second loss.

Series lead ... W&J has an 18-game winning streak versus the Yellow Jackets ... The last win for Waynesburg over the Presidents was on February 8, 1997, as the Jackets won at W&J, 58-57 ... W&J owns a 33-29 edge in the Bethany series ... Since 1996-97, W&J holds an 8-13 record versus the Bison ... The Presidents have claimed three of ther last four home contests against BC ... W&J head coach **Jina DeRubbo** has won three of four games with Bethany after turning the Bison into a national contender from 1997-2004.

... Ackerman also had 17 points at Waynesburg in a 62-59 setback earlier in the season.
