Gibson recorded an historic week for the 3-0 Presidents, as she av-

eraged 15.3 points, 14.7 rebounds and 2.0 blocked shots per game. In a 61-57 win over 11th-ranked Thomas More on Thursday, she recorded 16 points, a career-high 22 rebounds and six blocked shots while surpassing the career 1,000-point mark. Then, in a 65-51 Saturday PAC win over Westminster, she posted 20 points and eight boards to become the first player in school history to reach both 1,000 points and 1,000 rebounds in a career. For the week, Gibson shot 47 percent (17-of-36) from the field and 80 percent (12-of-15) from the line.

Also nominated was freshman G Kayla Taormina of Bethany, junior G Barb Petty of Chatham, junior F Christine Slater of Grove City, freshman G Chelsea Tolliver of Thomas More, senior G Johnna Deco of Waynesburg, and senior G Amy Dolsak of Westminster.

PAC WOMEN'S BASKETBALL 2009-10 - Week 7 Conference Notes

W&J TOPS TMC: In the first meeting of the year between PAC national powers Thomas More and Washington & Jefferson on Thursday, the Presidents edged the visiting Saints 63-59 ... The W&J win briefly put Grove City into first place in the conference at 4-1, but the Wolverines were upset at Thiel, 66-59 in overtime on Saturday ... Both W&J and Thomas More have one conference loss apiece, with a second meeting between the squads in Kentucky scheduled for February 6th.

NEWS & NOTES: Geneva senior **Renee Rawding** scored a season-high 30 points in a double-OT loss to Chatham ... Senior G **Amy Dolsak** averaged 20.5 ppg and 5.0 rpg for 1-1 Westminster ... **Maria Baroffio** averaged 17.3 ppg and led 2-1 Saint Vincent in scoring in all three contests ... Junior F **Christine Slater** averaged 15.7 ppg for 2-1 Grove City ... Thomas More freshman G **Chelsea Tolliver** averaged 17.5 ppg in a 1-1 week ... Senior G **Johnna Deco** averaged 11.3 ppg for 1-2 Waynesburg. AROUND THE LEAGUE: W&J senior PG Kennan Killeen became the 12th 1,000-point scorer in the program's history Saturday ... At 6-6 overall, Chatham is at .500 this late in the season for only the second time in 21 years ... Freshman Kelly Barzak hit her first three-pointer of the season at the end of regulation Saturday, lifting Thiel to overtime, where the Tomcats upset first place Grove City, 66-59 ... Freshman G Kayla Taormina scored 14 points as Bethany earned its first PAC win Monday, 62-47 over Thiel.

Bethany Bison (4-9, 1-3 PAC)

Bethany picked up its first PAC win of the year by beating Thiel, but then dropped road contests at Grove City and Geneva ... Kayla Taormina tallied

14 and Taylor Kress posted 10 points and 11 rebounds in the 62-47 victory over Thiel, which helped the Green & White avoid their first 0-3 start in the PAC since 1997-98 ... Grove City closed the game with a 26-8 run to secure a 65-48 win over the Bison, who were led by Anne Wilson with 11 markers ... Another 2nd half run hurt BC in their 70-56 loss at Saint Vincent, who used a 14-2 spurt to take control of the game ... Renee Shepherd led all scorers in the game with 18 points, one off her career-high, and Tara Harris chipped in with 11 off the bench.

Geneva Golden Tornadoes (5-8)



It took double overtime for Geneva and Chatham to decide an outcome on Saturday afternoon ... The Cougars prevailed after 50 minutes of basketball GOLDEN TORNADOES by the score of 73-68 ... Geneva senior Renee

Rawding posted a season-high 30 points in the loss, including an 11of-18 effort from the field ... Earlier in the week, the Golden Tornadoes got run over by Saint Vincent to the tune of 81-45 ... Geneva has dropped three straight and has fallen to 5-8 ... GC will head back out on the road where the team has yet to win a game ... The Golden Tornadoes will battle Grove City and Westminster in a pair of PAC contests.

Saint Vincent Bearcats (10-3)

The 10-3 Bearcats are coming off a busy week, going 2-1 against PAC foes over a five-day stretch ... After dropping a 55-53 heartbreaker to W&J Tuesday, Saint Vincent recovered by posting wins over Geneva and

Bethany ... Maria Baroffio led SVC in scoring in all three contests, hitting eight three-pointers and averaging 17.3 points, including a 20point outburst vs. W&J ... Melissa Mansur had 30 points and seven steals in the three games, while Emily Fenton dished 11 assists and had eight thefts on the week ... While the Bearcat offense is averaging a PAC-high 75.5 ppg, the team's defense has forced at least 23 turnovers in all 13 contests.

Thomas More Saints (11-2, 4-1 PAC)



The 11th-ranked Saints were 1-1 last week falling 61-57 to PAC rival Washington & Jefferson, but rebounded to defeat Waynesburg, 82-52 ...

Against W&J, the Saints were led in scoring by freshman G Chelsea Tolliver and junior F Amy Stultz, who each scored 10 points ... In the win over Waynesburg, Tolliver led all scorers with 25 points ... Two Saints are averaging in double-figures in scoring after 13 games as Tolliver averages 14.2 ppg and junior C Nicole Dickman averages 11.3 ... Dickman leads the team on the boards with 7.7 rpg and leads the PAC in blocks with 26 ... The Saints as a team are shooting 44.9 percent from the field and are outrebounding their opponents, 520-501.

Waynesburg Yellow Jackets (5-8, 2-4 PAC)



Injuries and illness took some sting out of the Yellow Jackets during their three-game stretch of PAC con-

tests this past week ... However, Waynesburg was

still able to pick up a 62-54 win over Thiel back on Thursday, Jan. 7 ... Senior Johnna Deco had the best scoring performance of her collegiate career when she dropped a game-high 20 points on the Tomcats ... For the week, Deco averaged a team-high 11.3 points per game and also pulled down 6.3 rebounds per contest ... Speaking of rebounding, freshman Brittany Spencer was a force on the boards, pulling down an impressive 11.0 rebounds per game.

Chatham Cougars (6-6, 1-3 PAC)



The Cougars kicked off PAC play again this week as they hosted the Wolverines of Grove City and ended the

week by traveling to Geneva for a nail-biter win ... In the loss to GCC Chatham held a nine-point lead in the first half but was unable to hang on down the stretch ... Barb Petty and Brittany Brown led the Cougars with 15 and 12 points, respectively ... Against the Golden Tornadoes of Geneva, neither team led by more than six points the entire game, and regulation ended in a 52-52 tie ... Chatham was able to out-score Geneva 15-10 in the second overtime period to secure the first double overtime victory in school history ... Leading the Cougars in the victory was Kayla Hilko with 18 points, followed by Courtney Smith with 16.

Grove City Wolverines (6-7, 3-2 PAC)



The Wolverines went 2-1 in PAC games last week and are now 4-2 in the league ... Grove City notched a pair of come-from-behind wins over Chatham and Bethany, re-

spectively ... Christine Slater pumped in 19 points in a 54-44 win at Chatham Tuesday ... Thursday, the Wolverines used a game-ending 26-8 run to down Bethany, 65-48 ... Slater (16), Laura Miller (11) and Leah Gibson (10) all scored in double figures in the win ... At Thiel Saturday, the Wolverines dropped to 0-3 in overtime this year with a 66-59 setback ... Grove City went 0-for-6 from the floor in overtime ... Krista Beechy paced the Wolverines with 16 points ... Grove City owned a 37-30 edge on the glass.

Thiel Tomcats (4-8, 1-4 PAC)



After keeping pace with Bethany through the first 20 minutes of play, the Thiel women's basketball squad simply ran out of steam in their 62-47 loss Monday ...

The women of Thiel fell at the hands of the Waynesburg Yellow Jackets on Saturday, 62-54 ... A Kelly Barzak trey at the end of regulation propelled Thiel to overtime and an eventual 66-59 victory over the Grove City Wolverines Saturday ... Barzak led all scorers with a game-high 19 points, seven rebounds, five blocks and three steals, while Ashley Davis tallied 14 points and seven boards ... Chelsea Meister contributed 12 points on a 5-of-7 shooting night from the field.

Washington & Jefferson Presidents (11-2. 3-1 PAC)

In a week when numerous records and milestones were surpassed, W&J picked up three key wins ... Senior F Maggie Gibson scored her 1,000th point Thursday against Thomas More, tied her career-high in rebounds (22) against the Saints, blocked a career-high six shots



against TMC and capped the week off by becoming the only player in W&J women's basketball history to amass 1,000 points and 1,000 rebounds ... In addition, senior point guard Kennan Killeen became the 12th player in W&J history to reach the 1,000 point milestone ... Following the three wins, W&J has jumped back into contention for the PAC regularseason title, trailing Thomas More by half a game in the PAC standings.
