She had a 21-point, 10-rebound double-double in a win over Thiel Wednesday night, followed up by a 20-point and nine-rebound performance in a victory at Geneva. She leads the PAC in scoring at 17.0 points per game.

Also nominated was sophomore G **Anne Wilson** of Bethany, junior G/F **Kayla Hilko** of Chatham, sophomore G **Katie Tierney**, freshman G **Alyssa Oursler** of Wash. & Jeff., junior F **Elisha Jones** of Waynesburg and freshman F **Andi Ridge** of Westminster.

PAC WOMEN'S BASKETBALL 2009-10 - Week 13 Conference Notes

TOP 4 SEEDS SET: With one week before the PAC tournament, the top four seeds are set with Thomas More holding down the top spot. W&J, Grove City and Westminster follow respectively to fill the No. 2, 3 and 4 seeds. The last week of the regular season will decide where Waynesburg, Bethany, Thiel and Chatham will place for the tournament. Following the game Saturday vs. Chatham, the Presidents marked their eighth-consecutive 20-win season.

IN THE RECORD BOOKS: Barb Petty's performance for Chatham during the Geneva game (18 pts., 15 from 3-point range) made her the fifth player in school history to surpass 700 career points (707). By playing this coming Wednesday against Waynesburg, W&J F **Maggie Gibson** will become the school's all-time leader in games played. Senior **Renee Rawding** moved into ninth place on Geneva's all-time scoring list in ironically passing her current head coach **Renee Drake** for that spot.

AROUND THE LEAGUE: For the season, TMC's **Chelsea Tolliver** leads the team in scoring with 14.0 ppg., while C **Nicole Dickman** averages 12.4 ppg. Dickman also leads the team in rebounding with 7.0 rebounds per game. Chatham's **Kayla Hilko** now holds the school's record for free throws made in a career with 210; the previous record was set at 209. Westminster freshman G **Jenn Cantella** posted a 10.5 scoring average including a career-high 17 against W&J.

PAC WOMEN'S BASKETBALL NOTES

Bethany Bison (7-15, 4-8 PAC)



Due to last week's winter storms, the Bison played just one game, as their match-up with Saint Vincent was pushed back to Feb. 15 ... Bethany's lone action came at first place Thomas More Saturday and the Bison led by as many as 9 in the first half until a 15-0 Saints run turned the tide and TMC went on to a 56-45 victory ... Although BC held a 43-34 rebounding advantage, they shot just 33 percent (17-51) from the field and the arc (6-18) ... **Anne Wilson** led all scorers in the game with 11 markers and **Taylor Kress** pitched in 10 points, while **Katelynn Hackathorn** led Bethany's efforts on the glass with 10 rebounds

Chatham Cougars (8-15, 2-11 PAC)



Chatham entered this week of conference play trying to snap a four-game losing streak...Against Geneva, the Cougars were handed their fifth loss of the season by 3 points or less...Junior **Barb Petty** led Chatham in scoring, finishing with 18 points; 15 from behind the three point arc...**Kayla Hilko** followed with 17 points on 6-14 field goal shooting and 5-8 shooting from the charity stripe...Also, senior **Amanda Vranka** became the first player in school history to reach 100 career games played...Next, the Cougars traveled to #20 W&J and fell 54-44...Hilko fired in a game-high 16 points and became just the 2nd player in Chatham history to tally 800 points (803)...Petty also finished in double figures for the Cougars with 10 points.

Geneva Golden Tornadoes (8-15)



Another case of good and bad for the Geneva women's basketball team. On Wednesday night, the GTs finally got the monkey of their backs with the first road victory of the season with a 63-60 decision at Chatham...**Alyse Scrasella** posted 16 points while **Christine Carugati** scored 14 off the bench...The celebration was short-lived as Geneva dropped a 62-48 decision to Grove City on Saturday night... Despite the loss, **Scarsella** scored 20 points and grabbed nine rebounds to lead Geneva...Senior **Renee Rawding** moved into ninth place on Geneva's all-time scoring list in ironically passing her current head coach **Renee Drake** for that spot.

Grove City Wolverines (12-11, 8-5 PAC)



Grove City finally moved above the .500 mark for the first time this season by earning two wins last week... Saturday night, Grove City blitzed Geneva 62-48...**Christine Slater** fired in 20 points for the Wolverines while **Laura Miller** and **Leah Gibson** both scored 14...Grove City now leads the all-time series with Geneva 23-22 ...Wednesday, the Wolverines downed visiting Thiel 64-51...Slater recorded a 21-point, 10-rebound double-double while Miller added 11 points...Grove City are 8-2 at home this year ... The eight home wins are the most by the Wolverines since the 2004-05 season...The Wolverines have secured the No. 3 seed in the conference tournament and will host a quarterfinal February 23.

Saint Vincent Bearcats (17-5)



The Bearcats improved to 17-5 after picking up a pair of home wins on the week, defeating Geneva 82-60 on Monday and Waynesburg 83-61 on Saturday...**Brittany Sedlock** posted a double-double in each win, scoring 19 points with 17 rebounds against Geneva before turning in a 14-point, 10-rebound performance over the Yellow Jackets...She also added eight steals in the Geneva contest, narrowly missing the triple-double...**Emily Fenton** came off the bench to average 13 points in the two wins, including an 18-point showing in the Geneva contest, while **Maria Baroffio** scored 22 points, going 8-11 from the floor and 3-4 from behind the arc, in the Waynesburg victory.

Thiel Tomcats (6-16, 2-10 PAC)



The Thiel women's basketball team fell at the hands of the Grove City, 64-51, on Wednesday...Sophomore F **Ashley Davis** finished the game with a team-high 13 points, on 6-of-12 (50%) shooting, and gathered eight rebounds, while **Kelly Barzak** continued her defensive assault on the conference, blocking five shots, to go along with 11 points and eight rebounds...The team then lost, 71-51, on Saturday to the Westminster...**Davis** led the way with a 24 point, 13 rebound double-double, while **Kelly Barzak** just missed a double-double, tallying nine points and eight rebounds, to go along with two blocked shots.

Thomas More Saints (21-2, 12-1 PAC)



The 14th-ranked Saints earned at least a share of their 5th straight PAC regular season title and the No. 1 seed in the upcoming conference championship tournament with a pair of PAC home games as they defeated Waynesburg, 74-56, and Bethany, 56-45...The wins also clinched Thomas More its fifth straight 20-win season ... In the win over Waynesburg, G **Chelsea Tolliver** led the team in scoring with 16 points, while F **Dana Bors** pulled down seven rebounds to lead the team on the boards ... Against Bethany, Tolliver and G **Allison Long** led the team in scoring with nine points each, Long had a game-high four steals and G **Katie Tierney** led the team with six rebounds and three assists.

Washington & Jefferson Presidents (20-3, 10-2 PAC)



The 20th-ranked Wash. & Jeff. got back on the winning track last week, collecting a pair of PAC victories against Westminster (64-56) and Chatham (54-44)...At 78 percent, the Presidents are the top free throw shooting team in the PAC and are second in NCAA Division III ... Senior F **Maggie Gibson** will become the school's all-time leader in games played on Wednesday evening against Waynesburg...She has played 111 games and started 109 times...W&J concludes regular-season play this week, hosting Waynesburg on Wednesday evening at 6 p.m. and traveling to Bethany on Saturday afternoon at 2 p.m.

Waynesburg Yellow Jackets (8-15, 5-8 PAC)



Waynesburg squared off against two of the top teams in the PAC and suffered a pair of road setbacks at Thomas More and Saint Vincent ... Junior F **Elisha Jones** led the team with a 12.5 points per game scoring average and pulled down five rebounds per game ... Freshman F **Brittany Spencer** led all Jackets with a 7.5 rebounds per contest average.

Westminster Titans (9-14, 7-6 PAC)



Westminster posted a 1-1 record in two PAC games last week to lock up the No. 4 seed in next week's PAC Tournament...The Titans lost to No. 20th-ranked Wash. & Jeff., 64-56, at home on Thursday after the two teams were tied at halftime...Then the Titans traveled to Thiel on Saturday and won 71-51 without much resistance, as Westminster led by no fewer than 19 points the entire second half...G **Amy Dolsak** led the Titans with 13.5 points per game including 12 vs. Thiel and 15 vs. W&J...F **Andi Ridge** also scored a career high in the Thiel game with 16 points to go with team high totals of seven rebounds and three steals.
