## PAC WOMEN'S BASKETBALL 2009-10 - Week 14 Conference Notes

**PAC PLAYOFFS:** The PAC Tournament is set for 2010, with Thomas More pulling out the No. 1 seed for another year. Chatham was bumped up to the No. 6 seed, with a win over Thiel and a W&J win over Bethany. Saint Vincent head coach Kristen Zawacki earned her 500th career win Saturday following a 64-56 decision over Thomas More; the Bearcats also earned its 13th 20+ win season in the program's 26-year history. SVC now waits until March 1 for a possible ECAC berth.

**NEWS AND NOTES:** Wash. & Jeff.'s **Stephanie Smith** drained her 200<sup>th</sup> career three-pointer at Bethany...The Presidents' seniors **Kennan Killeen**, **Smith** and **Maggie Gibson** enters the PAC Tournament one victory shy of the 90<sup>th</sup> during their careers which would set a school record.As a team, Chatham set a new record for assists in a season (298) and also clinched double digit victories (10) in a season for the third consecutive season – the only three times in school history.

**AROUND THE LEAGUE:** Westminster's senior G **Amy Dolsak** averaged 18.5 points, 3.0 assists and 4.5 rebounds per game, including a game high-tying 23 points vs. Geneva...Sister and teammate **Emily Dolsak** averaged 15.0 points and 9.0 reboundslast week, including new career highs with 19 points, 10 rebounds and five steals in GCC win...In the win over Thiel, TMC junior **Nicole Dickman** recorded her 7th double-double of the season as she scored a career-high 28 points and 11 rebounds.

## PAC WOMEN'S BASKETBALL NOTES

**Bethany Bison** (7-18, 4-10 PAC)

Bethany dropped all 3 games last week and fell to the #7 seed for this week's PAC Tournament ... The Bison were tied at halftime with Saint Vincent, but the Bearcats

controlled the 2<sup>nd</sup> half for a 68-57 win despite double-doubles from Taylor Kress (16 pts., 11 rebs.) and Katelynn Hackathorn (15 pts., 11 rebs)...Anne Wilson led 4 scorers in double digits with 14, but Chatham used a 13-2 run in the 2<sup>nd</sup> half to take control and go on to a 71-62 triumph over the Bison Wednesday ... Audra Droginske matched her career-high with 13 points and passed out 6 assists in the loss...For the 2<sup>nd</sup> time this year, the Bison led W&J at halftime, but Bethany shot just 19 percent (5-26) in the 2<sup>nd</sup> half and W&J rallied for a 52-42 victory.

#### Geneva Golden Tornadoes (8-17)



The Golden Tornadoes ended their frustrating season with an overall record of 8-17 after dropping a pair of games in the final week of the season. GOLDEN TORNADOES Geneva lost to Westminster and Waynesburg to

close out the year with three consecutive losses ... Renee Rawding celebrated senior night and her final home game with 23 points against Westminster but it wasn't enough as the Titans swept the season series...On Saturday, Rachel Barry led Geneva with 13 points in a game that got away from Geneva early in the first half ... Finishing the year at 6-6 on its home floor, Geneva came up short on the road with just one victory in 12 road contests.

#### Saint Vincent Bearcats (20-5)



The Bearcats wrapped up a 3-0 week in historic fashion, defeating Thomas More 64-56 on Saturday afternoon for the program's - and head coach Kristen Zawacki's - 500th all-time win...It also clinched the 13th

20+ win season in the program's 26-year history...The Bearcats led for nearly the entire game over the 14th-ranked Saints, as Brittany Sedlock scored 15 points and Devin McGrath 14...Melissa Mansur tallied 10 points and five steals in SVC's first-ever win over Thomas More....On Monday, SVC broke open a 31-31 halftime tie at Bethany by outscoring the Bison 37-25 over the final 20 minutes, en-route to the 68-57 win...The story was similar in Wednesday's 73-56 win over Grove City.

## Thomas More Saints (22-3, 13-1 PAC)



The 13th-ranked Saints split a pair of road game during the final week of the regular season as they defeated Thiel, 81-68, but fell 64-56 to Saint

Vincent ... In the win over Thiel, junior C Nicole Dickman recorded her 7th double-double of the season as she scored a career-high 28 points and pulled down 11 rebounds ... Against Saint Vincent, the Saints were led in scoring by freshman G Chelsea Tolliver and senior G Sarah Yeiser , who each scored 13 points ... For the season, Tolliver leads the team in scoring with 13.8 points per game., while Dickman averages 12.8 ppg., and leads the team in rebounding with 7.2 rebounds per game ... Tierney leads the team in steals with 52 and assists with 60.

### Waynesburg Yellow Jackets (9-16, 5-9 PAC)



After losing at nationally-ranked Washington & Jefferson, the Waynesburg women rebounded in a big way by blowing out Geneva in their regular sea-

son finale...Led by senior G Johnna Deco, the Yellow Jackets avenged a loss from earlier this season by downing the Golden Tornadoes 76-52...Deco, who was one of two Jackets that were honored as part of senior night, recorded a double-double on 15 points and 11 rebounds. Both totals were game highs...Junior F Elisha Jones added 14 points on the night, while freshman reserves Emilee Wagner and Paige Pearce chipped in 12 points each.

## Chatham Cougars (10-15, 4-11 PAC)



Chatham closed its regular season play this week with two home PAC victories...The Cougars defeated

Bethany on Wednesday, 71-62...The Cougars outshot their opponents going 45.3% from the field and 83.3% from the foul line...Chatham also forced 16 turnovers and came up with 11 steals on their way to victory...Four Cougars finished in double figures in scoring: Brittany Brown (19), Kayla Hilko (18), Barb Petty (13) and Courtney Smith (10)...On Senior Recognition Day, Chatham earned 71-43 PAC victory over Thiel...As a team, the Cougars set a new record for assists in a season (298) and also clinched double digit victories (10) in a season for the third consecutive season - the only three times in school history.

### Grove City Wolverines (12-13, 8-6 PAC)



Grove City concluded the regular season last week with a pair of setbacks...Wednesday night on Senior Night, GCC dropped a 73-56 decision to Saint Vincent ... Chris-

tine Slater posted 18 points and 14 rebounds for the Wolverines, who owned a 44-37 edge on the glass ... Megan Gebrosky added 15 points...Saturday at Westminster, the Wolverines shot just 31 percent from the field (21 of 66) in a 64-56 setback...Gebrosky poured in 18 points while Leah Gibson added 17 points...The Wolverines forced 22 turnovers...Grove City finished the conference schedule 8-6 and will be the No. 3 seed in the PAC tournament.

### Thiel Tomcats (6-18, 2-12 PAC)



The Thiel College women's basketball team fell at the hands of the Thomas More Saints, 81-68, on Wednesday...Ashley Davis finished the day with 21

points and seven rebounds, while Kelly Muffley added 21 points of her own, to go along with two steals ... Kelly Barzak contributed 12 points, five rebounds and three blocked shots...Thiel dropped its season finale, 71-43, to the Chatham Cougars on Saturday... Freshman five, Barzak led the way for the women of Thiel, narrowly missing a doubledouble with 15 points and nine rebounds, while swatting two shots.

#### Washington & Jefferson Presidents (22-3, 12-2 PAC)

The Presidents, ranked 21st in the nation and third in the Great Lakes Region, ended the regular-season with four-straight wins ... Seniors Kennan Killeen and Stephanie Smith posted 16 points in the Waynesburg victory, while classmate Maggie Gibson compiled 13



points and 15 rebounds at Bethany to help the Presidents erase a threepoint halftime deficit...Gibson has 37 career double-doubles, including 10 this season...The Presidents' senior trio enters the PAC Tournament one victory shy of the 90th during their careers which would set a school record...Killeen is one point away from passing Emily Hays '09 for eighth place on the W&J career scoring list.

#### Westminster Titans (11-14, 8-6 PAC)



Westminster finishes its regular season on a season-long, three-game win streak that included a 72-69 win at Geneva on Wednesday and a 64-

56 win at home over Grove City on Saturday...Senior G Amy Dolsak averaged 18.5 points, 3.0 assists and 4.5 rebounds per game, including a game high-tying 23 points vs. Geneva...Sophomore F Emily Dolsak averaged 15.0 points and 9.0 rebounds during the week, including new career highs with 19 points and five steals to go with a game-high 10 rebounds in the PAC win over Grove City for her second double-double of the season...Junior G Kaitlin McCarthy averaged 12.5 points including season-high 14 points vs. Grove City.

## PAC WOMEN'S BASKETBALL PREVIEWS

**Bethany Bison** at #2 Wash. & Jeff. (2/23)

The Bison enter the PAC Tournament as the #7 seed and will be on the road in the guarterfinals for the first time since 2003 when they lost at

Westminster in the opening round. Bethany will travel to #2 W&J Tuesday night just 3 days after the teams finished the regular season against each other. Although BC led both games this year against the Presidents at halftime, W&J rallied for 10-point wins both times. This is the 5th time the teams have played each other in the tournament, with Bethany holding a 3-1 advantage in those games. W&J won the most recent meeting, using a huge 2<sup>nd</sup> half run to claim a 78-62 decision in last year's semifinals.

NCAA Division-III. The team's regular-season winning percentage of .800 is the second best in program history, as the 1997-98 squad finished 26-5. Head coach Kristen Zawacki, the only coach in the program's history, needed just 775 games to reach the 500-win plateau, as her's - and the team's- overall record is now 500-275, good for

Grove City Wolverines vs. #6 Chatham (2/23)



Grove City will host sixth-seeded Chatham Tuesday night in the conference quarterfinals. The Wolverines swept Chatham this year, limiting the Cougars to just 42 points

per game in the two meetings. Grove City won the first meeting 54-44 January 5 by closing the game on a 12-2 run. Christine Slater scored 17 of her game-high 19 points in the second half. The Wolverines completed the sweep February 3 with a 57-40 home win. Megan Gebrosky scored a career-high 19 points. Grove City held Chatham scoreless for the first 9:20 of the second half. Grove City is 5-10 in the conference tournament since its re-inception in 2000. The Wolverines have not won a tournament game at home since 2004.

#### Washington & Jefferson Presidents vs. #7 Bethany (2/23)

W&J and Bethany, two of the longtime powers in the PAC, meet for the fifth time in the conference tournament on Tuesday evening ... The Bison have won three of the previous four meetings in conference tournament play, but W&J head coach Jina DeRubbo has been on



the winning side in all four games ... Kennan Killeen scored 21 points in last year's 78-62 PAC Tournament Semifinal win over Bethany ... The Presidents have won 10 of the last 11 meetings with the Bison, including a pair of 10-point wins this season ... W&J is searching for its first PAC Championship since 2006.

#### Westminster Titans vs. #5 Waynesburg (2/23)



The Titans are 22-5 all-time vs. Waynesburg. Westminster and Waynesburg split in both meetings this year, with Waynesburg winning 58-55
